# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### INTRODUCED MAY 16, 1974

By Assemblymen HAMILTON, OWENS, GARRUBBO, KEAN, SPIZZIRI and PERSKIE

Referred to Committee on Judiciary, Law, Public Safety and Defense

AN ACT to amend the "New Jersey Conflicts of Interest Law," approved June 2, 1971 (P. L. 1971, c. 182).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 5 of P. L. 1971, c. 182 (C. 52:13D-16) is amended to 2 read as follows:

5. a. No special State officer or employee, nor any partnership, 3 4 firm or corporation in which he has an interest, nor any partner,  $\mathbf{5}$ officer or employee of any such partnership, firm or corporation, shall represent, appear for, or negotiate on behalf of, or agree to 6 7represent, appear for or negotiate on behalf of, any person or party other than the State in connection with any cause, proceeding, 8 application or other matter pending before the particular office, 9 bureau, board, council, commission, authority, agency, fund or 10 system in which such special State officer or employee holds office 11 12 or employment.

b. No State officer or employee or member of the Legislature, 13nor any partnership, firm or corporation in which he has an interest, 14 nor any partner, officer or employee of any such partnership, firm 15or corporation, shall represent, appear for, or negotiate on behalf 16 of, or agree to represent, appear for, or negotiate on behalf of, any 17person or party other than the State in connection with any cause, 18 proceeding, application or other matter pending before any State 19 agency; provided, however, this subsection shall not be deemed to 20prohibit a member of the Legislature from making an inquiry for 21information on behalf of a constituent, if no fee, reward or other 22thing of value is promised to, given to or accepted by the member of 23the Legislature, whether directly or indirectly nor shall anything  $\mathbf{24}$ 

25contained herein be deemed to prohibit any such partnership, firm 26 or corporation from appearing on its own behalf.

Nothing contained in this section shall be deemed to prohibit any legislator, or any State officer or employee or special State  $\mathbf{28}$ 29 officer or employee from representing, appearing for or negotiating 30 on behalf of, or agreeing to represent, appear for, or negotiate on 31behalf of, any person or party other than the State in connection 32with any proceeding pending before any court of record of this State, any proceeding in regard to a claim for compensation 33 arising under chapter 15 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes (Work-3435 men's Compensation), any proceeding in connection with the de-36 termination or review of transfer inheritance or estate taxes, any proceeding before the Division of Tax Appeals, and proceeding in 37 connection with the filing of corporate or other documents in the 38 office of the Secretary of State, any proceeding before the Divi-39 sion of Civil Rights, the New Jersey State Board of Mediation or 40 the New Jersey Public Employment Relations Commission, the 41 Unsatisfied Claim and Judgment Fund Board solely for the pur-42pose of filing a notice of intention pursuant to P. L. 1952, c. 174, 43 s. 5 (C. 39:6-65), or any successor thereof or any proceeding on 44 behalf of a county, municipality or school district, or any authority, 45agency or commission of any thereof except where the State in an 46 adverse party in the proceeding and provided he is not holding 47 48any office or employment in the State agency in which any such 49 proceeding is pending.

2. This act shall take effect immediately. 1

### STATEMENT

This bill would authorize members of the Legislature and State officers and employees to file notices of intention to make a claim against the Unsatisfied Claim and Judgment Fund if automobile damage claims are otherwise uncollectible. Time is of the essence in filing such notices of intention.
