

INTRODUCED MARCH 25, 1974

By Assemblymen KLEIN, BATE, GEWERTZ, GORMAN, HERMAN and PELLECCHIA

AN ACT concerning municipal engineers and amending N. J. S. 40A :9-140 and P. L. 1971, c. 407.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. N. J. S. 40A :9-140 is amended to read as follows:

40A:9-140. In every municipality the governing body, by ordi-2 nance, shall provide for the appointment of a municipal engineer 3 4 and fix his compensation *in an annual salary or fixed fee or* at an hourly rate and based upon actual $4_{\rm A}$ basistime and expenses agreed on prior to the rendering of the services. 5 No municipal engineer shall be compensated by receiving a per-6 centage of the contract for which he renders services. Unless other-7 8 wise provided by law his term of office shall be 3 years.

2. Section 2 of P. L. 1971, c. 407 (C. 40:69A-199.2) is amended 1 $\mathbf{2}$ to read as follows:

2. Each ward commissioner shall be entitled to be reimbursed 3 for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of his duties 4 and to such compensation, not to exceed \$500.00, as shall be deter- $\mathbf{5}$ mined by the municipal governing body. Upon certification of the 6 ward commissioners, the municipal governing body shall provide 7 for payment of the expenses of the ward commissioners, their com-8 pensation as determined by the governing body, and the expenses 9 for the services of the surveyor, engineer or such other assistants 10as shall have been incurred by the ward commissioners; however, 11 no engineer hired under this section shall be compensated by receiv-12ing a percentage of the contract for which he renders services. 13

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT concerning municipal engineers and amending N. J. S. 40A:9-140 and P. L. 1971, c. 407.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. N. J. S. 40A :9–140 is amended to read as follows:

2 40A:9-140. In every municipality the governing body, by ordi-3 nance, shall provide for the appointment of a municipal engineer

4 and fix his compensation at an hourly rate and based upon actual

5 time and expenses agreed on prior to the rendering of the services.

6 No municipal engineer shall be compensated by receiving a per-

7 centage of the contract for which he renders services. Unless other-

8 wise provided by law his term of office shall be 3 years.

1 2. Section 2 of P. L. 1971, c. 407 (C. 40:69A-199.2) is amended 2 to read as follows:

2. Each ward commissioner shall be entitled to be reimbursed 3 for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of his duties 4 and to such compensation, not to exceed \$500.00, as shall be deter-5 mined by the municipal governing body. Upon certification of the 6 ward commissioners, the municipal governing body shall provide 7 for payment of the expenses of the ward commissioners, their com-8 pensation as determined by the governing body, and the expenses 9 for the services of the surveyor, engineer or such other assistants 10 as shall have been incurred by the ward commissioners; however. 11no engineer hired under this section shall be compensated by receiv-12

13 ing a percentage of the contract for which he renders services.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to prohibit municipal engineers from being compensated by receiving a percentage of the contract for which they render services.

Amend page 1, section 1, line 4, after "compensation", insert "on an annual salary or fixed fee basis or".
