AN ACT to amend and supplement "The Evidence Act, 1960," approved June 20, 1960 (P. L. 1960, c. 52).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

SPONSORS' STATEMENT

This bill would amend and supplement the "Evidence Act of 1960" by extending the newspaperman's privilege, as defined under section 21, of P. L. 1960, c. 52 (C. 2A:84A-21) to the entire news media. A new supplement to the law defines news media.

This bill amends and supplements the "Evidence Act of 1960" (P. L. 1960, c. 52) to extend the newspaperman's privilege to the entire news media. The privilege would not apply to radio or television stations unless they maintain and keep open for inspection, of at least 1 year from the date of broadcast, an exact recording, transcription, kinescopic film or certified written transcript of the actual broadcast or telecast.

The bill also contains a new definition section, which includes definitions of news media.


