An Acr to amend "An act providing for the establishment, development, improvement and expansion of community mental health services and providing for payment by the State of financial grants-in-aid for community mental health projects," approved July 15, 1957 (P. L. 1957, c. 146).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1957, c. 146 (C. 30:9A-1) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 1. It is declared to be the public policy of this State to encourage
- 4 the development of preventive, treatment and [aftercare] transi-
- 5 tional services for mental health [problems] clients through
- 6 [additional community mental health programs and] the improve-
- 7 ment and expansion of [existing] community mental health [ser-
- 8 vices programs in designated service areas for the entire State
- 9 which will provide these elements of adequate services:
- 10 (a) In-patient services;
- 11 (b) Out-patient services;
- 12 (c) Partial hospitalization services such as day care, night care,

STATEMENT

This bill amends the New Jersey Community Mental Health Act to comply with recent amendments to Federal legislation and to respond to recommendations contained in the New Jersey Mental Health Master Plan.

The bill makes the following changes:

- 1) The name of the "Community Mental Health Board" is changed to the "Community Mental Health Citizens Advisory Board" to more accurately reflect its purpose and composition.
- 2) The composition of the board is changed to include consumers of mental health services, providers of mental health services and a nominee of the chairpersons of the standing Senate and Assembly Institutions, Health and Welfare Committees. These changes are consistent with current Federal law and with the recommendations of the New Jersey Mental Health Master Plan.
- 3) The elements of mental health services to be encouraged by the State are revised and expanded to comply with current needs.
- 4) Certain technical changes are made in the definition section to reflect names changes in the department and the Board of Institutional Trustees.
- 5) The role of the board as both advocate and advisor to the Department of Human Services for the development of effective mental health services in the community is clarified.

This bill amends New Jersey's community mental health services legislation so as to comply with recent changes in Federal legislation and to respond to certain recommendations in the Mental Health Master Plan.

The bill does the following:

- 1. Changes the name of the "Community Mental Health Board" to the "Community Mental Health Citizens Advisory Board." Additionally, the composition of the board is changed to include consumers and providers of mental health services and a nominee of the chairmen of the Assembly and Senate Institutions, Health and Welfare Committees.
- 2. Certain elements of mental health services have been revised and expanded so as to meet current needs.
 - 3. Certain technical changes have been made in the definitions section.
- 4. The role of the board as advocate and advisor to the Department of Human Services with respect to the development of community mental health services has been clarified.

The committee agrees with the purpose of this legislation and released the bill with certain technical amendments.

The bill amends New Jersey's community mental health services act to comply with recent changes in federal legislation and to respond to certain recommendations in the State Mental Health Master Plan.

The bill changes the name of the "Community Mental Health Board" to the "Community Mental Health Citizens Advisory Board," and provides that the role of the Board is to serve as an advisor to the Department of Human Services for the development of community mental health services. The size of the board is increased from 10 to 15 persons and the composition of the board is changed to include at least eight consumers and at least two providers of mental health services, and a nominee of the chairmen of the Senate and Assembly Institutions, Health and Welfare Committees. Consumers of mental health services may include former users of these services, their parents or relatives, or persons who have demonstrated an interest in the area of mental health services but who are not involved in the delivery of these services.

The committee amended the bill in section 1 to correct the name of the Division of Mental Health and Hospitals. FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed the following bills into law:

SJR-3012, sponsored by Senator William J. Hamilton, Jr. (D-Middlesex),

which designates the week of January 20th - 26th as "State Autistic Week."

A-1110, A-1111, and A-1112, sponsored by Assemblyman Richard F. Visotcky (D-Bergen), which requires any corporation issuing group or individual health insurance contracts to make available benefits for a second surgical opinion for elective surgical procedures which would require an inpatient admission to a hospital.

A-1634, also sponsored by Assemblyman Visotcky, which requires that all milk and all fluid milk products be marked with a legend stating the day after which the product is not to be sold.

A-3268, sponsored by Assemblywoman Mildred Barry Garvin (D-Essex), which makes various amendments to the Community Mental Health Act to comply with recent amendments to federal legislation and to respond to recommendations contained in the New Jersey Mental Health Master Plan.

A-3321, sponsored by Assemblywoman Barbara W. McConnell (D-Hunterdon) which permits the appointment of airport security officers by counties which own and operate airports.

A-3440, also sponsored by Assemblyworan Garvin, which appropriates \$405,800, from the Medical Education Facilities Fund created in 1977 in order to renovate an existing floor at the College of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey's College Hospital in Newark. This renovation will provide a 32-bed psychiatric in-patient unit in the hospital.

The bill also cancels a prior \$2,153,000 appropriation made to build a new wing at the hospital to serve as a psychiatric unit.

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
