2 "Board" means the State Board of Marriage and Family Therapy 3 Examiners.

"Counseling" means offering to assist or assisting, for a fee or other compensation, an individual or group through a counseling relationship to develop an understanding of interpersonal and intra personal problems and to plan and act on a course of action to restore optimal functioning to that individual or group but does not mean rehabilitation counseling.

"Counseling specialty" means a field of specialization in which counseling takes place and which has been designated as a counseling specialty by the committee.

"Licensed associate counselor" means an individual who holds a current, valid license as a licensed associate counselor pursuant to this act and who practices counseling under the direct supervision of a licensed professional counselor or a supervisor acceptable to the committee.

"Licensed professional counselor" means an individual who holds 20 a current, valid license as a licensed professional counselor pursuant 21 22 to this act.

"Licensed rehabilitation counselor" means an individual who holds a current, valid license as a licensed rehabilitation counselor pursuant to this amendatory and supplementary act.

"Rehabilitation counseling" means offering to assist or assisting, for a fee or other compensation, an individual through a rehabilitation counseling relationship to develop an understanding of the personal. social and vocational impact of their disabilities and to plan and implement a rehabilitation program, which may include training to help the person become more independent and employable.1

(New section) During the first 360 days after the effective date of this 1995 amendatory and supplementary act, the board shall issue to any individual upon application a professional counselor license, provided that the applicant meets the requirements of subsections a. and b. of section 7 of P.L.1993, c.340 (C.45:8B-40) and the board shall have the power to consider experience of the applicant prior to application for licensure as a waiver of all or part of the supervised experience requirements of subsection c. of that section 7. If the prior experience of the applicant does not meet all the requirements of that subsection c. then the applicant shall be issued an associate counselor license with acceptable experience credited toward the experience requirements of that subsection c. The board shall waive written examination of these applicants, but may require oral or situational examinations, or both.

4. This act shall take effect immediately.

The Assembly Consumer Affairs and Regulated Professions Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 671.

This bill provides that the State Board of Marriage Counselor Examiners and the Professional Counselor Examiners Committee shall be responsible for establishing the content of academic and training standards for professional counselors and associate counselors. The board and committee must use the standards of appropriate professional counseling associations as a guide in establishing standards for counselor licensing. To become a licensed professional or associate counselor, an applicant would still be required to have a master's degree or doctorate from a regionally accrédited institution of higher education in subject matter which is primarily counseling in content.

Applicants seeking to become a licensed professional counselor must currently pass the National Certified Counselor Examination. This bill allows an applicant to take either that test or the Certified Rehabilitation Counselor Examination to qualify.

The bill also provides for the "grandfathering" of applicants who meet the education and experience requirements to be licensed professional counselors without a written examination, except that the board may require an oral or situational examination, or both. The board may waive all or part of the supervised experience requirements for licensure based on an applicant's experience.
