The Assembly Judiciary Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1673.

This bill amends N.J.S.3B:3-28 to include the surrogate's court as having the authority to admit to probate the will of a person who is not resident in New Jersey at the time of his death but who owns real or personal property in this State, if there is no proceeding pending where the person did live at the time of his death. Currently this statute only gives the Superior Court this authority.

The Senate Judiciary Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1673.

Under the provisions of N.J.S.3B:3-38, presently only the Superior Court has the authority to admit to probate the will of a person who is not resident in New Jersey at the time of his death but who owns real or personal property in this State, if there is no proceeding pending where the person lived at the time of his death. This bill would also grant to the surrogate's court the authority to admit a will to probate under those circumstances.

Gov. Christie Whitman today signed legislation that gives the surrogate court the authority to probate wills of certain descendants who are not residents of New Jersey.

The legislation amends current law to allow the surrogate court to probate the will of a person who is not a resident of New Jersey at the time of his or her death but who owned real or personal property in the state at the time of death. Under current law, only the Superior Court has this authority.
