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#### P.L. 1997, CHAPTER 205, *approved August 14, 1997* Assembly, No. 2361

AN ACT concerning additional death benefit coverage for members of

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2 the Judicial Retirement System and supplementing P.L.1973, c.140 3 (C.43:6A-1 et seq.). 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. Each member of the retirement system on the effective date 9 of P.L. , c. (C. ) (now pending before the Legislature as 10 this bill) and each person who thereafter becomes a member will be 11 eligible to purchase the additional death benefit coverage hereinafter 12 described, provided the member selects such coverage within one year after that effective date or after the effective date of membership, 13 14 whichever date is later. 15 b. A person becoming a member of the retirement system after the effective date of P.L., c. 16 ) (now pending before the (C. 17 Legislature as this bill) who on the date of becoming a member is less than 60 years of age shall automatically be covered for such additional 18 19 death benefit coverage from the first day of membership on which the 20 person is actively at work and performing all regular duties at the 21 customary place of employment. Such automatic coverage shall continue during the member's first year of membership, and during that 22 23 year the member shall make contributions as fixed by the retirement system. Additional death benefit coverage for the member shall 24 continue in effect after the first year of membership on the continuance 25 of payment of the required contributions therefor. 26 27 c. A person becoming a member of the retirement system after the 28 effective date of P.L. , c. (C. ) (now pending before the 29 Legislature as this bill) who on the date of becoming a member is 60 30 or more years of age may, within one year from the date of 31 membership, elect to purchase such additional death benefit coverage, 32 provided that the member furnishes satisfactory evidence of 33 insurability and on the date of such election is actively at work and 34 performing all regular duties at the customary place of employment. 35 d. Notwithstanding other provisions of this section relating to the 36 amount of death benefit applicable to a member who has acquired or shall acquire additional death benefit coverage, the death benefit 37

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1 payable in the event of death occurring on or after the effective date 2 of P.L. ) (now pending before the Legislature as , c. (C. 3 this bill) and during the first year of membership shall be based upon 4 the member's annual base salary. The effective date of coverage of any 5 person electing to purchase additional death benefit coverage pursuant 6 to the provisions of subsections a. or c. of this section shall be the first 7 day of the month immediately following the date of such election 8 unless evidence of insurability is required as a condition of such 9 election in which event the effective date of coverage shall be the first day of the month which immediately follows the later of (1) the date 10 11 of such election, or (2) the date such evidence is determined to be 12 satisfactory.

13 e. The State House Commission shall establish schedules of 14 contributions to be made by the members who elect to purchase the 15 additional death benefit coverage. Such contributions shall be so 16 computed that the contributions made by or on behalf of all covered 17 members in the aggregate shall be sufficient to provide for the cost of the benefits provided under this section. 18 Such schedules of 19 contributions shall be subject to adjustment from time to time by the 20 commission, as the need may appear.

21 f. Upon the receipt of proper proofs of the death in service of any 22 such member while covered for the additional death benefit coverage 23 there shall be paid to such person, if living, as the member shall have 24 nominated by written designation duly executed and filed with the 25 retirement system, otherwise to the executor or administrator of the 26 member's estate, an amount equal to one and one-half times the compensation received by the member in the last year of creditable 27 28 service or some lesser amount as may be provided by the retirement 29 system and elected to purchase by the member.

30 g. The contributions of a member for the additional death benefit 31 coverage shall be deducted from the member's compensation, but if there is no compensation from which such contributions may be 32 33 deducted it shall be the obligation of the member to make such 34 contributions directly to the retirement system or as directed by the State House Commission. 35

h. Any other provision of P.L.1973, c.140 (C.43:6A-1 et seq.) 36 37 notwithstanding, the contributions of a member for the additional death benefit coverage under this section shall not be returnable to the 38 39 member or the member's beneficiary in any manner, or for any reason whatsoever, nor shall any contributions made for the additional death 40 41 benefit coverage be included in any annuity payable to any such 42 member or beneficiary.

43 i. A member who has elected to purchase the additional death 44 benefit coverage provided by this section may file with the retirement 45 system, and alter from time to time during the member's lifetime as 46 desired, a duly attested nomination of the payee of the death benefit A2361

1 provided under this section. Such member may also file with the 2 retirement system, and alter from time to time during the member's 3 lifetime as desired, a request directing payment of said benefit in one 4 sum or in equal annual installments over a period of years or as a life 5 annuity. Any such nomination or request shall be made in writing on 6 a form satisfactory to the retirement system and shall be effective upon 7 receipt by the retirement system. Upon the death of such member, a 8 beneficiary to whom a benefit is payable in one sum may elect to 9 receive the amount payable in equal annual installments over a period 10 of years or as a life annuity. If more than one beneficiary is nominated 11 and the member has not specified their respective interests, the beneficiaries shall share equally. If any beneficiary predeceases the 12 member, the interest of that beneficiary shall terminate and shall be 13 14 shared equally by such of the beneficiaries as survive the member 15 unless the member has made written request to the contrary in the beneficiary nomination. Any amounts due for which there is no 16 17 beneficiary at the death of the member or beneficiary shall be payable 18 to the estate of the member or beneficiary. 19 j. All other provisions of this section notwithstanding, this section 20 and the benefits provided under this section shall not come into effect 21 until a required percentage of the members shall have applied for the 22 additional death benefit coverage under this section. This required 23 percentage shall be fixed by the State House Commission. Applications for such additional death benefit coverage shall be 24 25 submitted to the secretary of the commission in such manner and upon 26 such forms as the commission shall provide. 27 28 2. The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably Assembly, No. 2361.

The Senate State Management, Investment and Financial Institutions Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2361.

This bill allows members of the Judicial Retirement System to purchase additional death benefit coverage in an amount equal to one and one-half times the member's compensation in the final year of service. The State House Commission shall establish schedules of contributions to be made by the members who elect to purchase the additional death benefit coverage. The contributions of a member for the additional death benefit coverage shall be deducted from the member's compensation.

At its December 13, 1996 meeting, the Pension and Health Benefits Review Commission adopted a recommendation "that the Legislature enact A-2361 to provide judges with the opportunity to purchase additional life insurance at no cost to the State."

### LEGISLATIVE FISCAL ESTIMATE TO

# ASSEMBLY, No. 2361 STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: FEBRUARY 6, 1997

Assembly Bill No. 2361 of 1996 provides optional contributory insurance coverage to any member of the Judicial Retirement System for a death benefit in an amount equal to one and one-half times the member's compensation in the final year of service. The terms of the coverage are similar to those applicable to the optional contributory death benefit coverage available to members of the Public Employees' Retirement System.

The Office of Legislative Services notes that this benefit is similar to the optional contributory death benefit coverage available to members of the other State-administered retirement systems and because this benefit will be paid with employee contributions it will not result in additional costs to the State.

This legislative fiscal estimate has been produced by the Office of Legislative Services due to the failure of the Executive Branch to respond to our request for a fiscal note.

This fiscal estimate has been prepared pursuant to P.L.1980, c.67.
