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P.L. 1997, CHAPTER 75, *approved April 17, 1997*

1 AN ACT requiring health insurance coverage for reconstructive breast  
2 surgery to restore symmetry, and amending and supplementing  
3 parts of the statutory law.

5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
6 of New Jersey:

8 1. Section 1 of P.L.1983, c.50 (C.17:48-6b) is amended to read as  
9 follows:

10 1. Every subscription certificate and group and individual contract  
11 providing hospital service benefits delivered, issued, executed or  
12 renewed in this State, or approved for issuance or renewal in this State  
13 by the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance on or after the  
14 effective date of this act, shall provide benefits, following a  
15 mastectomy on one breast or both breasts, for reconstructive breast  
16 surgery, [including but not limited to] surgery to restore and achieve  
17 symmetry between the two breasts, and the cost of prostheses and,  
18 under any contract providing outpatient x-ray or radiation therapy,  
19 benefits for outpatient chemotherapy following surgical procedures in  
20 connection with the treatment of breast cancer shall be included as a  
21 part of the outpatient x-ray or radiation therapy benefit. The  
22 provisions of this section shall apply to all contracts in which the  
23 hospital service corporation has reserved the right to change the  
24 premium. Such benefits shall be provided to the same extent as for  
25 any other sickness under the contract.

11 State, or approved for issuance or renewal in this State by the  
12 Commissioner of Banking and Insurance on or after the effective date  
13 of this act, shall provide benefits, following a mastectomy on one  
14 breast or both breasts, for reconstructive breast surgery, [including but  
15 not limited to:] surgery to restore and achieve symmetry between the  
16 two breasts, and the costs of prostheses and, under any policy  
17 providing outpatient x-ray or radiation therapy, the costs of outpatient  
18 chemotherapy following surgical procedures in connection with the  
19 treatment of breast cancer shall be included as a part of the outpatient  
20 x-ray or radiation therapy coverage. The provisions of this section  
21 shall apply to all policies in which the insurer has reserved the right to

31 the health maintenance organization provides health care services to

35 contract for health care services providing outpatient x-ray or

## 1 STATEMENT

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3 This bill requires health insurers, including hospital service  
4 corporations, medical service corporations, health service  
5 corporations, commercial insurers and health maintenance  
6 organizations, to provide insurance coverage for the costs associated  
7 with all stages of the reconstruction that may be necessary following  
8 breast cancer surgery, including symmetry operations on the opposite  
9 breast, in order to restore a woman's body to wholeness. Insurers and  
10 health maintenance organizations are required under current law to  
11 provide prostheses and, under any contract for health care services  
12 providing outpatient x-ray or radiation therapy, outpatient  
13 chemotherapy following surgical procedures in connection with the  
14 treatment of breast cancer as a part of the outpatient x-ray or radiation  
15 therapy.

16 Breast cancer is the most common cancer in American women,  
17 afflicting 182,000 women per year, striking one out of nine and  
18 causing the death of 46,000 women a year. Coping with this disease  
19 is a medical and emotional struggle since it carries with it the fear of  
20 disfigurement in a society that places great value on physical  
21 appearance. Breast reconstruction is extremely important to restore  
22 a sense of wholeness and well being in society, family, and  
23 interpersonal relationships. There is no known cause or cure for this  
24 epidemic.

The Senate Health Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1783.

This bill requires health insurers, including hospital service corporations, medical service corporations, health service corporations, commercial insurers and health maintenance organizations, to provide insurance coverage for the costs associated with all stages of reconstructive breast surgery that may be necessary following breast cancer surgery, including symmetry operations on the opposite breast. Insurers and health maintenance organizations are required under current law to provide prostheses and, under any contract for health care services providing outpatient x-ray or radiation therapy, outpatient chemotherapy following surgical procedures in connection with the treatment of breast cancer as a part of the outpatient x-ray or radiation therapy.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer in American women, afflicting 182,000 women per year, striking one out of nine and causing the death of 46,000 women a year.

This bill is identical to Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill Nos. 2550 and 11 (Heck/Vandervalk), which is pending before the General Assembly.
