#### Abstract

AN ACT authorizing "Conquer Cancer" license plates and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

Be It Enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey: 1. a. The Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles may issue for a motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in the State special license plates bearing, in addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, the slogan "Conquer Cancer." These plates may include an emblem, to be designed by the Commissioner of Health and approved by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles, indicating support for, or an interest in, finding new methods of treating and preventing cancer. b. Application for issuance of a "Conquer Cancer" license plate shall be made to the director on such forms and in such manner as may be prescribed by the director. The director shall collect for each set of plates issued an application fee of ${ }^{1}$ [\$40] $\$ 0^{1}$, and an annual renewal fee of ${ }^{1}[\$ 12] \$ 10^{1}$, in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles. c. Monies collected from all fees for "Conquer Cancer" license plates shall be deposited in the Cancer Research Fund, established in the Department of Health pursuant to section 5 of P.L.1982, c. 40 (C.54:40A-37.1). ${ }^{2}$ Any monetary donation made available to the State to support the provisions of this bill shall be deposited in the Cancer Research Fund for use as set forth in this section. ${ }^{2}$ Interest or other income earned on monies deposited under this act into the Cancer Research Fund shall be credited to the fund for use as set forth in this section.

Funds shall be utilized by the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research: (1) ${ }^{\mathbf{2}} \underline{\text { first }}^{2}$ to reimburse the Division of Motor Vehicles for all costs ${ }^{1}$, including those costs associated with computer programing changes, ${ }^{1}$ incurred in producing, issuing, ${ }^{1}$ renewing ${ }^{1}$ and publicizing the availability of "Conquer Cancer" license plates; (2) to reimburse the Department of Health for the design and printing of notices, posters and signs to be utilized by the Division of Motor Vehicles; and (3) for '[institutional support services for its] ${ }^{1}$ approved research projects as defined in section 3 of P.L.1983, c. 6 (C.52:9U-3).
d. The director shall annually certify to the Commissioner of Health the average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the Division of Motor Vehicles in producing, issuing ${ }^{1}$, renewing ${ }^{1}$ and publicizing the availability of "Conquer Cancer" license plates. The commissioner shall annually report the Department of Health's costs and the division's costs to the Office of Management and Budget.
e. The director shall notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain "Conquer Cancer" license plates by including a notice with all motor vehicle registration renewals, and by posting appropriate posters or signs in all division facilities and offices, as may be provided by the Department of Health. The notices, posters and signs shall be designed by the Commissioner of Health after consulting with the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research. The designs shall be subject to the approval of the director. The Department of Health shall supply the division with the notices, posters and signs to be circulated or posted by the division.
f. The Commissioner of Health, the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research, and the director shall develop and enter into an interagency memorandum of agreement setting forth the procedures to be followed by the Department of Health, the commission and the division in carrying out their respective responsibilities under this act.
${ }^{1} \mathrm{~g}$. In the event that the average cost per license plate, as certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the $\$ 50$ application fee established in subsection b. of this section in two consecutive fiscal years, the director may discontinue the issuance of the "Conquer Cancer" license plate. ${ }^{1}$
2. This act shall take effect on the first day of the ${ }^{1}$ [fifth] seventh ${ }^{1}$ month after enactment; except the Commissioner of Health, the State Treasurer and the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles may take such action in advance of the effective date as may be necessary for he timely implementation of this act.

The Assembly Transportation and Communications Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 1139 with committee amendments.

This amended bill permits the issuance of special "Conquer Cancer" license plates to raise funds to assist the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research in its efforts to find new methods of treating and preventing cancer through its approved research projects at qualifying research institutions throughout the State.

Motorists who wish the plates, which will bear the slogan "Conquer Cancer" and may have a distinctive emblem, would be required to pay a $\$ 50$ application fee and a $\$ 10$ annual renewal fee. A portion of the revenues raised would be used to reimburse the Division of Motor Vehicles and the Department of Health for their costs related to the new plates. The existing Cancer Research Fund, out of which monies are appropriated for research projects of the commission, will serve as the depository for these fees to be allocated to future projects.

The committee amendments delete language which would have allowed funds realized by the "Conquer Cancer" license plates to be used for institutional support services for approved research projects in addition to funding the projects themselves. The committee adopted amendments to provide that the application fee for "Conquer Cancer" license plates be $\$ 50$, the standard application fee for special license plates, and the renewal fee be the $\$ 10$ standard renewal fee for special license plates. The standard fee eases the administration of the special license plate program. The committee also adopted clarifying amendments with respect to the costs incurred in relation to the special license plates. The committee amendments also delay the effective date of the bill to the first day of the seventh month following enactment to allow the division sufficient time to prepare the issuance of the special license plates. Finally, the committee amendments provide that the director may discontinue issuance of the special license plates should the program not recoup the division's costs for two consecutive fiscal years.

Technical review was performed on this prefiled bill, as required under Joint Rule 18A of the Senate and General Assembly.

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1139 (2R).

This bill permits the issuance of special "Conquer Cancer" license plates to raise funds to assist the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research in its efforts to find new methods of treating and preventing cancer through its approved research projects at qualifying research institutions throughout the State.

The special plates would bear the slogan "Conquer Cancer" and may include a distinctive emblem, designed by the Commissioner of Health and approved by the Director of Motor Vehicles. Motorists who wish to obtain the special plates would be required to pay a $\$ 50$ application fee and a $\$ 10$ annual renewal fee. A portion of the revenues raised would be used to reimburse the Division of Motor Vehicles and the Department of Health for their costs. The fees would be deposited into the Cancer Research Fund, from which monies are appropriated for research projects.

Any monetary donation made available to the State to support this license plate program would be deposited in the Cancer Research Fund and used in the same manner as monies collected from fees for the special plates.

The Director of Motor Vehicles may discontinue issuance of the special license plates if the average cost of the special plates exceeds the application fee in two consecutive fiscal years.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 727, which was amended and released by the committee on this date.

Assembly Bill No. 1139 (1R) of 1996 permits the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to issue special "Conquer Cancer" license plates. The director would be authorized to charge an initial application fee of $\$ 50$ and a $\$ 10$ renewal fee which shall be in addition to all fees otherwise prescribed by law. After reimbursing DMV for expenses associated with plate issuance, the remaining application and renewal fee revenues would be deposited into the Cancer Research Fund, established in the Department of Health pursuant to section 5 of P.L.1982, c. 40 (C.54:40A-37.1). In turn, the monies in the fund would be used by the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research for approved research projects as defined in section 3 of P.L.1983, c. 6 (C.52:9U-3).

In estimates for previous bills authorizing the issuance of special license plates, DMV estimated total fixed costs to be about $\$ 41,000$, for reprogramming agency and revenue automated systems, and for one-time die costs. Variable costs would be about $\$ 8$ for the issuance of each set of special plates. However, since DMV is generally unable to estimate public interest in new, special license plates, it does not project revenues.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) concurs with previous DMV cost estimates for the issuance of new, special license plates. However, as a possible reference range for potential revenues, OLS would note that DMV has estimated that FY 1996 revenues from special plates for animal welfare would provide about $\$ 433,000$, plates for wildlife conservation would provide about $\$ 236,000$, and plates for shore conservation would provide about $\$ 899,000$.

The legislative fiscal estimate has been produced by the Office of Legislative Services due to the failure of the Executive Branch to respond to our request for a fiscal note.

This fiscal estimate has been prepared pursuant to P.L.1980, c.67.
