#### **STATEMENT**

This Assembly substitute requires the State Health Benefits Program to provide coverage for a minimum of 72 hours of inpatient care following a modified radical mastectomy and a minimum of 48 hours of inpatient care following a simple mastectomy. The substitute also provides that a carrier under the program shall not require a health care provider to obtain authorization from the carrier for prescribing 72 or 48 hours, as appropriate, of inpatient care.

#### AS for S1705

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The substitute also provides that the provisions of the substitute 2 shall not be construed to: require a patient to receive inpatient care for 72 or 48 hours, as appropriate, if the patient in consultation with the 3 4 patient's physician determines that a shorter length of stay is medically appropriate; or relieve a patient or physician from any insurer 5 notification requirements. The Senate Health Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1705 with committee amendments.

As amended by committee, this bill requires the State Health Benefits Program to provide coverage for a minimum of 72 hours of inpatient care following a modified radical mastectomy and a minimum of 48 hours inpatient care following a simple mastectomy with a lymph node dissection. The bill also provides that a carrier under the program shall not require a health care provider to obtain authorization from the carrier for prescribing 72 or 48 hours, as appropriate, of inpatient care.

The committee amended the bill to add minimum coverage requirements for a simple mastectomy with a lymph node dissection; to clarify that a patient may be discharged sooner that the mandated minimum coverage when medically appropriate; and to clarify that the provisions of the bill do not relieve a patient or physician from any insurer notification requirements. Amendments also specify the types of mastectomies covered under the provisions of the bill.

The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 2651.

This bill requires the State Health Benefits Program to provide coverage for a minimum of 72 hours of inpatient care following a mastectomy and a minimum of 48 hours inpatient care following a lymph node dissection for the treatment of breast cancer. The bill also provides that a carrier under the program shall not require a health care provider to obtain authorization from the carrier for prescribing 72 or 48 hours, as appropriate, of inpatient care.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS**

The committee adopted amendments to this bill to conform the description of the benefits mandated under the legislation to the description of those benefits contained in a comparable measure (Assembly committee substitute for Assembly, Nos. 10, 2551, 2524 and 2575, now on 2nd reading in the General Assembly) applicable to health benefits contracts issued by State-licensed health insurance providers (hospital service corporations, medical service corporations and health service corporations) or under any of various State-regulated health plans and policies.

Gov. Christie Whitman today signed legislation that requires the State Health Benefits Program to provide adequate medical coverage for women following mastectomies.

S-1705, sponsored by Senators Peter Inverso (R-Mercer/Middlesex) and John Mattheussen (R-Camden/Gloucester) and Assemblyman Joseph Azzolina (R-Middlesex/Monmouth), will require the State Health Benefits Program to provide coverage for a minimum of 72 hours of inpatient care following a modified radical mastectomy and a minimum of 48 hours following a simple mastectomy.

The law states that the health care provider is not required to obtain authorization from the carrier before prescribing the length of stay of 72 or 48 hours, as appropriate. A patient may be discharged sooner than the mandated minimum if medically appropriate.

The Governor also conditionally vetoed legislation that requires hospital, medical and health service corporations and commercial insurers to provide a minimum of 72 hours inpatient care following a modified radical mastectomy and a minimum of 48 hours inpatient care following a mastectomy.

While the Governor supports the intention of the bill, to prevent women from being released from hospitals despite their doctor's opinion that a longer stay is necessary, she recommended that procedures for notification be streamlined to avoid redundancy.

S-1704 was sponsored by Senators Peter Inverso and Jack Sinagra (R-Middlesex) and Assembly Members Joseph Azzolina, Steve Corodemus (R-Monmouth), Rose Heck (R-Bergen),

Charlotte Vandervalk (R-Bergen), Shirley Turner (D-Mercer), Carol Murphy and Kevin O'Toole (R-Essex/Union), Joel Weingarten (R-Essex/Union) and Francis Blee (R-Atlantic).

The Governor signed the following bills:

AJR-44, sponsored by Assembly Members Nicholas Asselta (R-Cape May/Atlantic/Cumberland) and John Gibson (R-Cape May/Atlantic/Cumberland), designates portion of Route 47 in Vineland as the "Nello Melini Memorial Highway." The designation honors the late Nello Melini, a leader of the poultry industry in New Jersey who owned and operated the largest chick hatchery in the state.

A-1139, sponsored Assemblypersons Carol Murphy (R-Essex/Morris/Passaic) and Alex DeCroce (R-Essex/Morris/Passaic), authorizes the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue license plates to benefit the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research in its efforts to find new methods of treating and preventing cancer. The bill also provides that funds collected from the license plates be placed into the existing Cancer Research Fund in the Department of Health and Senior Services.

A-1206, sponsored by Assemblymen Kenneth LeFevre (R-Atlantic) and Francis Blee (R-Atlantic), amends current law to modify the definition of prostitution to delete the requirement that an offer for sexual activity must take place in a public place. This bill also mandates that individuals arrested for engaging in prostitution be fingerprinted, and it establishes a new disorderly persons offense criminalizing loitering for the purpose of prostitution.

A-2174, sponsored by Assemblyman David W. Wolfe (R-Monmouth/Ocean and Assemblyman James W. Holzapfel (R-Monmouth/Ocean) requires architects to complete continuing education requirements as a condition of biennial license renewal. Waivers of these continuing education requirements may be granted by the board on an individual basis due to hardship.

A-2221, sponsored Assemblymen Richard Bagger (R-Middlesex/Morris/ Somerset/Union) and John Wisniewski (D-Middlesex), establishes the "Foreign Country Money-Judgements Recognition Act," which prescibes the uniform procedure for the enforcement of money judgements and embodies rules consistent with those applied by the majority of courts in this country.

S-208, sponsored by Senator Leonard T. Connors, Jr., (R-Atlantic/Burlington/Ocean), and Senator Joseph A. Palaia (R-Monmouth), establishes a 15-member Council on Undocumented Aliens in the Department of Labor (DOL). The Council would be responsible for studying various aspects of the undocumented alien population in the State, including, but not limited to,
