1 AN ACT concerning State aid for public school districts, ¹amending
2 and¹ supplementing P.L.1996, c.138 and making an appropriation.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. ¹(New section)¹ Notwithstanding any provision of P.L.1996,
8 c.138 (C:18A:7F-1 et seq.) or any rule or regulation promulgated
9 pursuant thereto to the contrary, for the 1997-98 school year a school
10 district, county vocational school district, or county special services
11 school district shall receive additional State aid equal to the amount by
12 which the district's State aid was reduced in the 1996-97 school year
13 pursuant to the provisions of P.L.1995, c.236 (C.18A:7E-²**[1]** ⁶² et
14 seq.). ¹The additional aid received by a district shall be an adjustment
15 to the district's spending growth limitation for the 1997-98 school
16 year.¹ For the 1998-99 school year and thereafter, this additional
17 amount shall be included in the school district's or county vocational
18 school district's prebudget year net budget and prebudget year net
19 T&E budget.

8 by more than the district's stabilization aid growth limit. In the event
9 that total stabilized aid exceeds the prebudget year total by a rate
10 greater than the stabilization aid growth limit, the commissioner shall
11 adjust the components of total stabilized aid so that they total exactly
12 the prebudget year total increased by the stabilization aid growth limit.
13 For the 1997-98 school year, the prebudget year total shall include
14 foundation aid, transition aid, categorical aids for special education,
15 bilingual education and county vocational education, and

17 (2) resident enrollment projected for October 1997 exceeds 99
18 percent of the resident enrollment for October 1991 or resident
19 enrollment projected for October 1997 is less than resident enrollment
20 for October 1991 by 35 or fewer pupils or the prebudget year
21 equalized tax rate exceeded the Statewide average equalized school
22 tax rate by 10% or more.

23 An eligible district shall be aided in the amount of its total aid
24 decline, after offset by any stabilization aid provided pursuant to
25 subsection b. of this section, or \$4,000,000, whichever is less. The
26 commissioner, in consultation with the Commissioner of the

10 shall receive additional supplemental stabilization aid as follows:

11 (1) when the sum of the district's total aid payable for the
12 categories listed in subsection b. of this section, aid payable pursuant
13 to subsections c. and d. of this section, and aid payable pursuant to
14 subsection c. of section 18 of this act exceeds the prebudget year total
15 for the same aids pursuant to subsection b. of this section, the district
16 shall receive an amount equal to the excess of the State aid generated

18 1996-97 over the excess calculated pursuant to this paragraph; or

19 (2) when the district's prebudget year aid pursuant to subsection b.
20 of this section equals or exceeds the sum of the total aid payable for
21 the categories listed in subsection b. of this section, aid payable
22 pursuant to subsections c. and d. of this section, and aid payable
23 pursuant to subsection c. of section 18 of this act, the district shall
24 receive an amount equal to the State aid generated by such placements
25 in the county special services school district in 1996-97.

26 f. Supplemental school tax reduction aid shall be paid to any
27 district which meets the following criteria:

28 (1) the district's 1996-97 net budget per pupil is less than 115% of
29 the State average net budget per pupil;

30 (2) the district's 1996-97 equalized tax rate of the general fund is
31 greater than 130% of the Statewide average equalized school tax rate;

32 (3) the district does not receive any supplemental core curriculum
33 standards aid; and

34 (4) the district is not included within the Department of
35 Education's district factor groups I or J based on the 1990 federal
36 census data.

37 Each district which is determined to be eligible to receive aid
38 pursuant to this subsection shall receive aid according to the following
39 formula:

STATEMENT

25

26 The "Comprehensive Educational Improvement and Financing Act
27 of 1996," P.L.1996, c.138, repealed the "School Efficiency Program
28 Act." This bill would return to school districts in the 1997-98 school
29 year the amount of State aid which was deducted from their aid
30 entitlement in the 1996-97 school year. In addition, the bill makes
31 clear that beginning in the 1998-99 school year this additional State
32 aid amount will be included in the district's prebudget year net budget
33 and prebudget year net T&E budget.

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 2741.

The "Comprehensive Educational Improvement and Financing Act of 1996," P.L.1996, c.138, repealed the "School Efficiency Program Act," P.L.1995, c. 235. This bill would return to school districts in the 1997-98 school year the amount of State aid which was deducted from their aid entitlement in the 1996-97 school year. The 1996-97 State aid penalties were based on the individual district's budgeted per pupil administrative spending in the 1995-96 school year. In addition, the bill makes clear that beginning in the 1998-99 school year this additional State aid amount will be included in the district's prebudget year net budget and prebudget year net T&E budget.

In the 1996-97 school year, \$6,602,749 was deducted from the State aid entitlement of 63 school districts. This bill appropriates the same amount of money for additional State aid to those districts in the 1997-98 school year.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2741, with committee amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 2741, as amended, returns to school districts in the 1997-98 school year the amount of State aid which was deducted from their aid entitlement in the 1996-97 school year. The 1996-97 State aid penalties were based on the individual district's budgeted per pupil administrative spending in the 1995-96 school year. In addition, the bill makes clear that beginning in the 1998-99 school year this additional State aid amount will be included in the district's prebudget year net budget and prebudget year net T&E budget.

The bill also provides supplemental stabilization aid in the 1997-98 school year to county vocational schools in which the secondary resident enrollment for October 1996 exceeds the resident enrollment projected for October 1997. The aid will equal the amount of the district's aid decline between the 1996-97 school and 1997-98 school years up to a maximum amount of \$500,000. In addition the bill provides \$302,689 in core curriculum standards aid to the Great Meadows Regional School District. This aid was under calculated for the 1997-98 school year because the special education students with the district were not included.

FISCAL IMPACT:

In the 1996-97 school year, \$6,602,749 was deducted from the State aid entitlement of 63 school districts. This bill appropriates the same amount of money for additional State aid to those districts in the 1997-98 school year. The bill also provides an additional \$1,524,522 in State aid to six county vocational schools in the 1997-98 school year and \$302,689 to the Great Meadows Regional School District to correct an error in the calculation of the district's 1997-98 core curriculum standards aid.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

The amendments provide that the budget cap of any district which receives State aid under the bill's provisions will be increased by the amount of that additional aid in the 1997-98 school year. The amendments also provide supplemental stabilization aid to certain county vocational school districts and additional aid to the Great Meadows Regional School District to correct an error in the calculation of the district's 1997-98 care curriculum standards aid.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2741 (1R) with amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 2741 (1R), as amended, returns to 63 school districts in the 1997-98 school year the amount of State aid which was deducted from their aid entitlement in the 1996-97 school year as penalties. The 1996-97 State aid penalties were based on the individual district's budgeted per pupil administrative spending in the 1995-96 school year. In addition, the bill makes clear that beginning in the 1998-99 school year this additional State aid amount will be included in the district's prebudget year net budget and prebudget year net T&E budget.

The bill also provides supplemental stabilization aid in the 1997-98 school year to county vocational schools in which the secondary resident enrollment for October 1996 exceeds the resident enrollment projected for October 1997. The aid will equal the amount of the districts' aid decline between the 1996-97 and 1997-98 school years up to a maximum amount of \$500,000.

As amended and reported, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1964/2036/1922 SCS (Bennett/Inverso/Bassano/Lynch) as amended and reported by this committee on June 12, 1997.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amended the bill to remove the section concerning additional State aid to Great Meadows Regional School District in the amount of \$302,689 to provide the correct core curriculum standards aid entitlement. Instead, this amount will be provided in the FY1998 annual appropriations act. In addition, a technical amendment was made to correct a citation error.

FISCAL IMPACT:

For the 1997-98 school year, this bill appropriates \$6,602,749 as additional State aid to 63 school districts; this amount equals the amount that was deducted from State aid entitlements for these

districts in the 1996-97 school year. The bill also provides an additional \$1,524,522 in State aid to six county vocational schools for the 1997-98 school year.
