DATED: NOVEMBER 17, 1997

The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1140.

This bill amends the law governing the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) to provide an alternative basis for the computation of an accidental disability retirement allowance under that system.

A PFRS member who retires for accidental disability receives a retirement allowance of % of the actual annual compensation upon which contributions were made. Present law specifies that the annual compensation rate to be used in computing this benefit is the rate applicable at the time of the accident. Under the bill, the member would be entitled to have the benefit computed instead on the basis of the annual compensation rate applicable at the time of the member's retirement, if that rate would provide a greater benefit to the member.

Any benefit increase under the legislation is to apply to accidental disability beneficiaries who retired on or after April 1, 1991, but only to payments made on or after the date on which the bill takes effect as law. The bill provides that a retiree whose basic retirement benefit is increased under its provisions would be exempt from any offsetting reduction in the amount of the pension adjustment (cost of living) allowance for which the retiree is presently eligible.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1140 of 1996.

Under current law, a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) who retires on accidental disability receives a retirement allowance of 2/3 of the member's actual annual compensation for which contributions were being made at the time of the occurrence of the accident. This bill provides that the member may instead receive a retirement allowance of 2/3 of the member's actual annual compensation for which contributions were being made at the time of the member's retirement, whichever provides the largest possible benefit to the member.

Any increased pension benefits payable under this bill will apply to any member who retired on an accidental disability retirement on or after April 1, 1991, but will apply only to pension benefits payable on or after the date of enactment of this bill. The bill also provides that retirees will maintain their pension adjustment benefits.

The Pension and Health Benefits Review Commission recommended enactment of this bill on July 12, 1996.

FISCAL IMPACT

In a legislative fiscal estimate prepared by the Office of legislative Services (OLS) on this bill, the OLS notes that there is no information available to indicate the number of individuals who might be affected by this legislation, but expects the number to be small. Based on information from the most recent actuarial valuation of the retirement system, there are probably about 75 members who retired since April 1, 1991 on accidental disability benefits who might be eligible. However, no information is available to indicate the number of members whose retirement benefits would be enhanced by using their annual compensation at the time of retirement instead of their annual compensation at the time of the accident.

The Senate State Management, Investment and Financial Institutions Committee reports favorably Senate, No. 1140.

At present, a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) who retires on accidental disability receives a retirement allowance of 2/3 of the member's actual annual compensation for which contributions were being made at the time of the occurrence of the accident. This bill provides that the member may instead receive a retirement allowance of 2/3 of the member's actual annual compensation for which contributions were being made at the time of the member's retirement, whichever provides the largest possible benefit to the member.

Any increased pension benefits payable under this act shall apply to the benefits received by any member who retired on an accidental disability retirement on or after April 1, 1991 and shall apply only to pension benefits payable on or after the effective date of this act. The bill also provides that retirees will maintain their pension adjustment benefits.

At its July 12, 1996 meeting, the Pension and Health Benefits Review Commission recommended enactment of this bill.

Senate Bill No. 1140 of 1996 would establish an alternate basis for the calculation of an accidental disability retirement allowance payable to members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS). At present, a member of the PFRS who retires on an accidental disability receives a retirement allowance of 2/3 of the member's actual annual compensation for which contributions were being made at the time of the accident. This bill provides that the member may instead receive a retirement allowance of 2/3 of the member's actual annual compensation for which contributions were being made at the time of the member's retirement, whichever provides the largest possible benefit to the member.

Any increased pension benefits payable under this act shall apply to the benefits received on or after April 1, 1991 and shall apply only to pension benefits payable on or after the effective date of this act. The bill also provides that retirees will maintain their pension adjustment benefits.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) notes that there is no information available to indicate the number of individuals who might be affected by this legislation, but expects the number to be small. According to the most recent actuarial valuation of the retirement system, dated July 1, 1994, there are 2,126 members of the PFRS retired on disability benefits. Of this number, 71 retired during 1994, 78 during 1993 and 93 during 1992, for an average of 81 annually. These numbers include those members who retire as a result of a jobrelated accident, accidental disability, and those members who retire on ordinary disability. The actuary estimates 30.3 percent (25 members annually) of the members who retire on disability benefits retire on accidental disability benefits.

Based on this information, there are probably about 75 members who retired since April 1, 1991 on accidental disability benefits who might be eligible. However, no information is available to indicate the number of members whose retirement benefits would be enhanced by using their annual compensation at the time of retirement instead of their annual compensation at the time of the accident.

This legislative fiscal estimate has been produced by the Office of Legislative Services due to the failure of the Executive Branch to respond to our request for a fiscal note.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 7 of P.L.1944, c.255 (C.43:16A-7) is amended to read a follows:

(1) Upon the written application by a member in service, by one acting in his behalf or by his employer any member may be retired on an accidental disability retirement allowance; provided, that the medical board, after a medical examination of such member, shall certify that the member is permanently and totally disabled as a direct result of a traumatic event occurring during and as a result of the performance of his regular or assigned duties and that such disability was not the result of the member's willful negligence and that such member is mentally or physically incapacitated for the performance of his usual duty and of any other available duty in the department which his employer is willing to assign to him.
