9	"Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability
10	Act of 1980," Pub.L.96-510 (42 U.S.C.§9601 et seq.), and to other
11	federal liens, notice of which under any Act of Congress or any
12	regulation adopted pursuant thereto, are required or permitted to be
13	filed in such filing or recording office as a state may designate;
14	provided, however, that the provisions of this act shall not apply to
15	filing notice of federal tax liens pursuant to the Internal Revenue
16	Code, 26 U.S.C.§1 et seq., and which are subject to R.S.46:16-13.

18	2. (New section) Notices of liens upon real property for
19	obligations payable to the United States and certificates and notices
20	affecting the liens shall be filed in the office of the county recording
21	officer of the county or counties wherein the property subject to such
22	liens is situated.

24	3. (New section) Certification of notices of liens, certificates, or
25	other notices affecting federal liens by the Secretary of the Treasury
26	of the United States or his delegate, or by any official or entity of the

If a notice of federal lien, a refiling of a notice 4 of federal lien, or a notice of revocation of any certificate is presented 5 to the county recording officer, he shall endorse thereon his identification and the date and time of receipt and forthwith file it 6 7 alphabetically or enter it in an alphabetical index showing the name and 8 address of the person named in the notice, the date and time of receipt, 9 the title and address of the official or entity certifying the lien, and the total amount appearing on the notice of lien. 10

b. The fee for a certificate is \$8] <u>All notices received by</u> 24 a filing officer pursuant to this section and the index of the notices shall be held for public inspection by the filing officer¹. The Assembly Financial Institutions Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 601.

This bill applies to liens arising from the federal "Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980," 42 U.S.C.§9601 et seq., and to other federal liens, notice of which under any act of Congress or any regulations adopted pursuant thereto, are required or permitted to be filed in such filing or recording office as a state may designate. This act would require these liens to be filed in the county where the property is situated.

The bill also amends the statutory law concerning filing fees for federal tax liens to include other federal liens.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1996 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Senate State Management, Investments and Financial Institutions Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 601.

This bill, as amended, applies to liens arising from the federal "Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980," 42 U.S.C.§9601 et seq., and to other federal liens (excluding federal tax liens), notice of which under any act of Congress or any regulations adopted pursuant thereto, are required or permitted to be filed in such filing or recording office as a state may designate. This act would require these liens to be filed in the county where the property is situated. In addition, the bill would require that all notices received by a filing officer of the county in which the property is situated and the index of the notices be held for public inspection by the filing officer.

The bill also amends the statutory law concerning filing fees for federal tax liens to include other federal liens.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

An amendment to the bill removes the requirement that a filing officer, upon the request of any person, is to issue the filing officer's certificate showing whether there is on file, on the date and hour stated therein, any notice of lien or certificate or notice affecting any lien filed under the act and instead provides that the filing officer shall make available for inspection all notices received and the index of the notices.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 601 (1R).

Assembly Bill No. 601 (1R) applies to liens arising from the federal "Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980," 42 U.S.C.§9601 et seq., and to other federal liens, notice of which under any act of Congress or any regulations adopted pursuant thereto, are required or permitted to be filed in such filing or recording office as a state may designate. The bill does not apply to federal tax lines arising under the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. sec. 1 et seq.; the filing of those would continue to be subject to the provisions of R.S.46:16-13.

The bill requires a federal lien to be filed with the county recording officer of the county wherein the property subject to such lien is located. The fee for the filing of a notice and indexing of a federal lien on real estate or personal property, and for a certificate of discharge or subordination, will be \$8. The fee for the filing of all other notices, including a certificate of release or nonattachment, will be \$5. The bill amends the current \$8 fee charged for recording a notice of a federal tax lien to include other federal liens.

FISCAL IMPACT

In a fiscal estimate prepared by the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) on the bill in a previous legislative session, the OLS stated that the enactment of this bill would have no discernable fiscal impact on the State, since all lien filings will occur at the county level. The OLS noted that the fiscal impact at the county level should also be minimal. The county recording offices are generally well equipped to perform the function of filing and indexing liens. Assuming an increase in the number of non-tax federal liens filed, any costs associated with the increased filing should be offset by the filing fees permitted to be charged under the bill.
