STATEMENT

This bill provides for optional deductions from the retirement allowance of a beneficiary of the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF). Current law provides that, if possible, whenever any beneficiary of TPAF requests in writing that the Division of Pensions and Benefits make deductions from the beneficiary's retirement allowance or pension for the payment of premiums for the pensioners' group health insurance plan or the State Health Benefits Program, the division may make such deductions and transmit the sum so deducted to the companies carrying the policies. The bill would add a group dental insurance plan to the permitted deductions that may be requested

13 requested.

The bill also provides that whenever any TPAF beneficiary shall so request in writing, the Division of Pensions and Benefits shall make a deduction from the beneficiary's retirement allowance for the purpose of paying the beneficiary's dues to a bona fide professional organization, designated by the employee in the request and of which the beneficiary is a member, and shall transmit the sum so deducted to the designated organization. The bill provides to the retired members of TPAF the convenience of having dues for organizations such as the New Jersey Education Association or the New Jersey Retired Education Association deducted automatically from their retirement allowances.

Provides for optional deductions from TPAF retirement allowances.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 119 (2R).

Senate Bill No. 119 (2R) allows plan beneficiaries of the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF) or the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) to opt for deduction of their dental insurance premiums from their retirement allowances.

Current law provides that, if possible, whenever a beneficiary of TPAF or PERS requests in writing that the Division of Pensions and Benefits make deductions from the beneficiary's retirement allowance or pension for the payment of premiums for the beneficiary's group health insurance plan or the State Health Benefits Program, the division may make the deductions and transmit the sums deducted to the insurance plan carrier. The bill extends this deduction authorization option to the beneficiaries' dental insurance plan premiums, subject to the condition that at least 1,000 beneficiaries covered by a dental plan would have to request the deduction before the division would be required to make deductions from that plan.

The committee recommends that floor amendments be adopted to the bill that would encourage the State Treasurer and the Division of Pensions and Benefits to negotiate with each provider of a group dental insurance plan for which deductions are made pursuant to this bill for the payment of a reasonable administrative fee to be paid to the State to cover the administrative costs of making the deductions.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 1670 (1R) as reported by this committee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The bill is expected to have minimal fiscal impact. The dental premium option would be administered as an adjunct to the existing health insurance deduction program.

The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 119 (2R).

This bill provides for optional deductions of dental insurance premiums from the retirement allowance of a beneficiary of the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF) or the Public Employees' Retirement System.

Current law provides that, if possible, whenever a beneficiary of TPAF or PERS requests in writing that the Division of Pensions and Benefits make deductions from the beneficiary's retirement allowance or pension for the payment of premiums for the beneficiary's group health insurance plan or the State Health Benefits Program, the division may make the deductions and transmit the sums deducted to the insurance plan carrier. The bill would extend this deduction authorization option to the beneficiary's dental insurance plan premiums, provided that at least 1,000 beneficiaries under the appropriate system who are covered by the dental plan have requested such deductions to be made.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 119 (1R) of 1996 with amendments.

Existing law provides that a beneficiary under the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF) and the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) may request the Division of Pensions and Benefits to make deductions from the beneficiary's retirement allowance or pension for the payment of premiums for a group health insurance plan or the State Health Benefits Program. This bill would require the division to deduct premium payments for a group dental insurance plan for which 1,000 or more beneficiaries have requested deductions.

In addition, the committee recommends that, upon the enactment of this bill, the State Treasurer and the Division of Pensions and Benefits negotiate with each provider of a group dental insurance plan for which deductions are made pursuant to this bill for the payment of a reasonable administrative fee to be paid to the State to cover the administrative costs of making the deductions.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended the bill so that its provision would require deductions for any group dental insurance plan for which 1,000 or more beneficiaries of TPAF or PERS have requested deductions.

FISCAL IMPACT

According to the Division of Pensions and Benefits, the division will incur some additional costs to administer this new deduction. At this time, the amount of that additional cost is unknown.

Senate Bill No. 119 (1R) of 1996 permits deductions from the retirement allowance or pension of a beneficiary of the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) or the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF) for the payment of premiums for a group dental insurance plan.

The Office of Legislative notes that this bill would have virtually no impact on the State. Under current law, a beneficiary under the TPAF and the PERS may request the Division of Pensions and Benefits to make deductions from the beneficiary's retirement allowance or pension for the payment of premiums for a group health insurance plan or the State Health Benefits Program.

This legislative fiscal estimate has been produced by the Office of Legislative Services due to the failure of the Executive Branch to respond to our request for a fiscal note.

This fiscal estimate has been prepared pursuant to P.L.1980, c.67.
