The Legislature finds and declares that the ²[upper]² Rahway river is an important natural, recreational, and economic resource utilized and enjoyed by the citizens of the State; that the value of this resource is heavily dependent upon water quality, and poor water quality is a potential threat to the public health, safety, and welfare, and to the environment; that the river has suffered in the past, and continues to suffer, from abuse and neglect due to point and nonpoint source pollution discharges, stormwater runoff, illegal dumping of litter and other debris, and ²[other environmental and aesthetic insults] is subject to flooding conditions, creating a threat to people and property throughout the river system².

The Legislature therefore determines that it is appropriate for the municipalities and counties within which the ²[upper]² Rahway river is located to form an intergovernmental cooperative working group to (1) develop recommended regional planning strategies and other regional policies, procedures, and model ordinances and resolutions, which would be implemented by each member municipality and county on a voluntary basis, (2) where appropriate, coordinate efforts of member municipalities and counties to clean up the ²[upper]² Rahway river system or any tributary or watershed land thereof ² and to

The committee amended the bill to add a representative from Middlesex county to the river committee; to add the Middlesex county municipalities of Carteret, Edison, and Woodbridge, and the Union county municipalities of Linden and Scotch Plains to the bill's definition of "river municipalities"; and to establish as a goal, where appropriate, the alleviating of flooding conditions in that river system. The committee also amended the bill to remove the world "upper" from the name of the river committee to reflect more accurately the scope of the bill.

This amendment specifies that the representative of Essex county to the Upper Rahway River Intergovernmental Cooperation Committee shall be selected by the county executive of Essex county and may be removed by the county executive of that county.

Assembly Bill No. 665 of 1996 creates the Upper Rahway River Intergovernmental Cooperation Committee for the purpose of fully restoring, promoting, preserving, and maintaining the environmental health and water quality of the upper Rahway river system. The committee is charged with achieving these goals by developing regional planning strategies, coordinating cleanup efforts, recommending State legislation, and acting as the lead agency for receiving or distributing public monies for environmental protection projects that affect the river. The bill specifies the composition and the responsibilities of the committee, and directs the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to provide technical and planning assistance as needed.

The Office of Legislative Services estimates that the bill will have no significant impact on local budgets, nor on the operating budget, staff or resources of the DEP because the participation level of the committee members and the DEP will likely be governed by the budgetary limitations of the participants (unless other funding sources are made available). The long-term fiscal impact of the bill on the local and State economies should be positive if the upper Rahway River is improved to the point where significant revenues can be generated from tourism and recreational opportunities initiated under the committee's direction.

This legislative fiscal estimate has been produced by the Office of Legislative Services due to the failure of the Executive Branch to respond to our request for a fiscal note.
