- 7 1. Section 7 of P.L.1977, c.225 (C.34:1A-51) is amended to read 8 as follows:
- 7. a. There is created in the division the New Jersey Tourism
 Advisory Council which shall consist of [17] 18 members:
- 11 (1) Two members of the Senate, to be appointed by the President 12 thereof, not more than one of whom shall be of the same political 13 party, and two members of the General Assembly, to be appointed by 14 the Speaker thereof, not more than one of whom shall be of the same 15 political party;

The Assembly Senior Issues, Tourism and Gaming Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 970.
