1 AN ACT concerning the membership of the New Jersey Tourism  
2 Advisory Council and amending P.L.1977, c.225.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 7 of P.L.1977, c.225 (C.34:1A-51) is amended to read  
8 as follows:

9 7. a. There is created in the division the New Jersey Tourism  
10 Advisory Council which shall consist of **[17]** 18 members:

11 (1) Two members of the Senate, to be appointed by the President  
12 thereof, not more than one of whom shall be of the same political  
13 party, and two members of the General Assembly, to be appointed by  
14 the Speaker thereof, not more than one of whom shall be of the same  
15 political party;

16 (2) **[Twelve]** Thirteen public members, not more than seven of  
17 whom shall be of the same political party, who shall be appointed by  
18 the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate, one of whom  
19 shall be designated as chairman by the Governor for the term of the  
20 member's appointment, and **[11]** 12 of whom shall be chosen from  
21 persons who by experience or training represent the areas of the  
22 tourist industry cited in subparagraphs (a) through **[(k)]** (l) of this  
23 paragraph:

- 24 (a) One representative of the lodging sector;  
25 (b) One representative of the food service sector;  
26 (c) One representative of the transportation sector;  
27 (d) One representative of a regional tourism council;  
28 (e) One representative of the convention and visitor bureaus sector;  
29 (f) One representative of the tour/receptive services sector;  
30 (g) One representative of the outdoor recreation sector;  
31 (h) One representative of the historical and cultural arts sector;  
32 (i) One representative of the entertainment or amusement sector;  
33 (j) One representative of the financial community; **[and]**  
34 (k) One representative of the marketing/research sector; and  
35 (l) One representative of the eco-tourism sector; and

6 appointed to a three-year term, each representative of the lodging,  
7 food service, convention and visitors bureaus, and entertainment  
8 interests shall be appointed to a two-year term, and each  
9 representative of the regional tourism councils, outdoor recreation,  
10 and historical and cultural arts interests shall be appointed to a  
11 one-year term. Members shall serve until their successors are  
12 appointed and qualified. Vacancies occurring other than by expiration  
13 of term shall be filled for the unexpired term only.

The Assembly Senior Issues, Tourism and Gaming Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 970.

This bill adds a representative of the eco-tourism sector of the tourist industry to the membership of the New Jersey Tourism Advisory Council. Currently the council has 17 members 11 of whom represent the lodging sector, the food service sector, the transportation sector, a regional tourism council, the convention and visitor bureaus sector, the tour/receptive services sector, the outdoor recreation sector, the historical and cultural arts sector, the entertainment or amusement sector, the marketing/research sector, and the financial community. Eco-tourism encompasses activities such as bird-watching, wildlife tours and whale-watching.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1996 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Senate Natural Resources and Economic Development Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 970.

This bill adds a representative of the eco-tourism sector of the tourist industry to the membership of the New Jersey Tourism Advisory Council. Currently the council has 17 members 11 of whom represent the lodging sector, the food service sector, the transportation sector, a regional tourism council, the convention and visitor bureaus sector, the tour/receptive services sector, the outdoor recreation sector, the historical and cultural arts sector, the entertainment or amusement sector, the marketing/research sector, and the financial community. Eco-tourism encompasses activities such as bird-watching, wildlife tours and whale-watching.

This bill is identical to Senate No. 779, also favorably reported by the committee.
