1 AN ACT concerning the membership of the New Jersey Horse Racing
2 Injury Compensation Board and amending P.L.1995, c.329.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 4 of P.L.1995, c.329 (C.34:15-132) is amended to read
8 as follows:

9 4. There is hereby established the "New Jersey Horse Racing Injury
10 Compensation Board," which shall be in, but not of, the Department
11 of Law and Public Safety.

12 a. The board shall consist of ~~[six]~~ seven members as follows: the
13 Commissioner of Insurance, or his designee; the Attorney General, or
14 his designee; one member of the New Jersey Racing Commission
15 elected by the members of the commission, or his designee; and ~~[three]~~
16 four members of the horse racing industry appointed by the Governor,
17 one of whom shall represent the thoroughbred industry, one of whom
18 shall represent the standardbred industry ~~[and]~~, one of whom shall
19 represent the racetrack owners and one of whom shall represent
20 jockeys regularly riding at New Jersey racetracks. In making these
21 appointments, the Governor shall take into consideration the
22 recommendations of the thoroughbred and standardbred industries
23 ~~[and]~~, the racetrack owners and the organization which represents the
24 largest number of jockeys regularly riding at New Jersey racetracks,
25 respectively.

26 b. Members of the board shall serve without compensation but may
27 be reimbursed for their expenses out of the administrative funds of the
28 board.

29 c. The affirmative vote of at least four members shall constitute a
30 majority for the transaction of any business and a quorum shall consist
31 of a simple majority.

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34 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
