## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### INTRODUCED APRIL 14, 1980

By Senators FELDMAN, DODD, HERBERT and CAUFIELD

Referred to Committee on Energy and Environment

AN ACT concerning the powers, functions and duties of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, amending N. J. S. 59:1-3, repealing R. S. 32:14-1, R. S. 32:14-27 and R. S. 32:14-28, and supplementing Chapter 14 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1. The Legislature finds and declares that the Palisades Inter-1 state Park constitutes a natural and historic resource of 2 immeasurable value; that concern for the preservation of this 3 resource resulted in the enactment, in 1937, of an interstate 4 compact between New Jersey and New York; that this compact õ established the Palisades Interstate Park Commission as a sepa-6 7 rate agency charged with the responsibility of maintaining this interstate park; that the separation of this commission from all 8 other agencies of State government has tended to impede, rather 9 than facilitate, the discharging of this responsibility; and that, in 10order to insure the realization of the purpose of the interstate 11 12compact, it is necessary to alter the powers, functions and duties of the commission, all as hereinafter provided. 13

1 2. As used in this act:

2 Commission'' means the Palisades Interstate Park Com-3 mission.

b. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Environmental5 Protection.

6 c. "Council" means the Citizens Advisory Cuncil on the Pali-7 sades Interstate Park created by section 9 hereof.

8 d. "Department" means the Department of Environmental 9 Protection.

3. The Palisades Interstate Park Commission established by
 compact between the states of New Jersey and New York pursuant
 to P. L. 1937, c. 148 of the Laws of New Jersey and Chapter 170 of
 EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

4 the New York Laws of 1937, and approved by the Congress of the 5 United States pursuant to PL 75-706, is continued and allocated 6 within the Department of Environmental Protection. Notwith-7 standing this allocation, the commission shall be independent of 8 any supervision or control by the department or by the commis-9 sioner or any officer or employee thereof, except as otherwise 10 expressly provided in this act.

4. a. The commission shall prepare its annual budget request in
 consultation with the department. The request shall be submitted
 to the Governor and the Legislature as part of the annual budget
 request of the department.

5 b. The commission shall prepare its annual request for the 6 funding of capital projects in consultation with the department. 7 The request shall be submitted to the New Jersey Commission on 8 Capital Budgeting and Planning, pursuant to the provisions of 9 section 3 of P. L. 1975, c. 208 (C. 52:9S-3), as part of the depart-10 ment's annual request for the funding of capital projects.

5. a. Commission projects for the acquisition or development of 1 land for recreation and conservation purposes shall be considered 2State projects for the purposes of eligibility for funding pursuant 3 to the provisions of the "New Jersey Green Acres Bond Act of 4 1961" (P. L. 1961, c. 46), the "New Jersey Green Acres Bond Act  $\mathbf{5}$ of 1971" (P. L. 1971, c. 165), the "New Jersey Green Acres and  $\mathbf{6}$ 7Recreation Opportunities Bond Act of 1974" (P. L. 1974, c. 102), the "New Jersey Green Acres Bond Act of 1978" (P. L. 1978.  $\mathbf{8}$ c. 118), as well as any other Green Acres Bond Act adopted subse-9 quent to the effective date of this amendatory and supplementary 10 act. Requests by the commission for funding shall be submitted to 11 12the department and reviewed in the same manner as similar 13requests from other State departments, divisions, agencies or instrumentalities thereof. 14

b. The commission shall coordinate its planning for the acquisi-15tion, development and use of lands for recreation and conservation 16purposes with planning conducted by the department for the 17 $\mathbf{18}$ preparation and revision of (1) the Comprehensive Master Plan, pursuant to P. L. 1977, c. 348 (C. 13:8A-55); and (2) the New 1920Jersey Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan, pur-21suant to the "Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 221965" (PL 94-422).

1 6. a. The Attorney General shall provide legal services to the 2 commission in the same manner as these services are provided to 3 the department. 4 b. The commission shall be entitled to call to its assistance and 5 avail itself of the services of such employees of the department, 6 or of any State, county or municipal department, board, commis-7 sion or agency as may be required and made available to it.

1 7. The commission and the department shall determine whether 2 any of the areas or facilities in the New Jersey section of the  $\mathbf{3}$ Palisades Interstate Park are appropriate for inclusion within the State trails system pursuant to P. L. 1974, c. 159 (C. 13:8-30 4 5 et seq.), the New Jersey Natural Areas System pursuant to P. L. 6 1975, c. 363 (C. 13:1B-15.12a et seq.), the New Jersey Wild and Scenic Rivers System pursuant to P. L. 1977, c. 236 (C. 13:8-45 7et seq.), or the New Jersey Register of Historic Places pursuant 8 9 to P. L. 1970, c. 268 (C. 13:1B-15.128 et seq.). These determina-10tions and inclusions shall be made within 18 months of the effective date of this amendatory act. 11

1 8. The commission shall, within 18 months of the effective date 2 of this act:

a. Conduct a feasibility study of imposing tolls on some portion
of the Palisades Parkway, as well as other sources of funding, and
report the results thereof to the Governor and the Legislature;

b. Examine the fees charged at its marinas\*[, camps]\* and other
facilities, and make such revisions thereto as are necessary to
conform with fees charged for comparable public or private facilities;

10 c. Study and evaluate the existing payments in lieu of taxes 11 made to affected New Jersey municipalities, pursuant to P. L. 1947, 12 c. 73 (C. 54:4A-4 et seq.), as compared with similar payments 13 made to affected New York municipalities, and to make recom-14 mendations to the Governor and the Legislature for changes in 15 the method or amount of such payments, including cost estimates 16 and potential sources of funding therefor;

d. Consider the consolidation of any existing facilities which,
in the judgment of the commission, would facilitate maintenance
and security programs;

e. Solicit the interest of private groups in running park concessions and, where appropriate, maintaining buildings and
grounds frequently used by particular groups; and

f. Consider the imposition of a beverage container deposit re-quirement on containers sold within the Palisades Interstate Park.

9. a. There is created in the department a Citizens Advisory
 2 Council on the Palisades Interstate Park, the membership of which
 3 shall consist of seven members appointed by the commissioner.
 4 The members shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner, and

5 shall be chosen from among those residents of this State who are
6 familiar with and make regular use of the lands and facilities
7 within the New Jersev section of the Palisades Interstate Park.

8 The council shall advise the commissioner and the commission

9 concerning the management, maintenance and utilization of the10 New Jersey section.

b. The council shall elect a chairman from among its members,and shall meet at the call of the chairman, the commissioner, orthe commission.

c. Members of the council shall serve without compensation but
may be reimbursed, subject to the limits of funds appropriated or
otherwise made available for such purposes, for expenses actually
incurred in attending meetings of the council and in performance
of their duties as members thereof.

19 d. The commissioner and the commission shall provide the20 council with such assistance and information as may be necessary21 for the purposes of this section.

1 10. The Civil Service Commission shall, within 1 year of the 2 effective date of this act, reexamine the titles and salary ranges 3 of all employees of the commission who are covered by Title 11 of 4 the Revised Statutes, subject to the approval of the commission, 5 and make such changes therein as may be required to provide 6 parity with other comparable State or local civil service positions.

1 11. N. J. S. 59:1-3 is amended to read as follows:

2 59:1-3. Definitions. As used in this subtitle:

3 "Employee" includes an officer, employee, or servant, whether
4 or not compensated or part-time, who is authorized to perform any
5 act or service; provided, however, that the term does not include
6 an independent contractor.

7 "Employment" includes office, position or employment.

8 "Enactment" includes a constitutional provision, statute, ex-9 ecutive order, ordinance, resolution or regulation.

"Injury" means death, injury to a person, damage to or loss of
property or any other injury that a person may suffer that would
be actionable if inflicted by a private person.

13 "Law" includes enactments and also the decisional law applici14 ble within this State as determined and declared from time to time
15 by the courts of this State and of the United States.

16 "Public employee" means an employee of a public entity.

17 "Public entity" includes the State, and any county, municipality,

18 district, public authority, public agency, and any other political19 subdivision or public body in the State.

"State" shall mean the State and any office, department, division, bureau, board, commission or agency of the State, but shall not include any such entity which is statutorily authorized to sue and be sued. "State" also means the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, but only with respect to employees, property and activities within the State of New Jersey.

26 "Statute" means an act adopted by the Legislature of this State27 or by the Congress of the United States.

1 12. On or before March 31 in each year, the commission shall  $\mathbf{2}$ make an annual report of its activities for the preceding calendar year to the Governor and to the Legislature. The report shall set 3 forth a complete operating and financial statement covering the 4 operations of the commission during the year, and shall include  $\mathbf{5}$ an account of the management, maintenance and utilization of 6 lands and facilities in the New Jersey section of the Palisades 7 Interstate Park, as well as a discussion of the implementation of 8 this act. 9

13. R. S. 32:14-1, R. S. 32:14-27 and R. S. 32:14-28 are repealed.
 14. Any transfer of responsibilities required by this act shall
 2 be made in accordance with the "State Agency Transfer Act,"
 3 P. L. 1971, c. 375 (C. 52:14D-1 et seq.).

1 15. This act shall take effect immediately, but section 11 shall
 2 apply only to causes of action against the commission which ac 3 crue subsequent to this effective date.

# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This bill would implement the recommendations of the Senate Energy and Environment Committee concerning the management, maintenance and utilization of lands and facilities in the New Jersey section of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission. These recommendations were contained in a Committee report which was submitted to the Senate on April 14, 1980.

In general, this bill is an attempt to solve certain management and financial problems of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission. This would be done by allocating the commission within the Department of Environmental Protection. Once brought within the department, the commission would:

(1) coordinate the preparation and submittal of its budget and capital needs requests with those of the department;

(2) be considered a State agency eligible for 100% Green Acres funding;

(3) coordinate its planning efforts with those of the department;

(4) be entitled to legal services from the Attorney General;

(5) be authorized to use staff provided by other State or local agencies;

(6) be provided with coverage under the "New Jersey Tort Claims Act" (P. L. 1972, c. 45);

(7) study means of raising revenues or decreasing costs by:

a. imposing a toll on the Palisades Interstate Parkway;

b. reviewing current fees;

c. consolidating existing facilities;

d. getting private groups to run concessions or maintain certain areas;

e. imposing "bottle bill" regulations.

In addition, this bill establishes a Citizens Advisory Council, to provide the commission with the advice of park users, and requires a Civil Service reexamination of existing job titles and salary ranges of commission employees. These changes, more fully outlined in the Committee report, are intended to improve the management and use of the scenic Palisades Interstate Park.

In reporting this measure, the Committee notes that the provisions of section 4 do *not* authorize the Department of Environmental Protection to alter or disapprove budget or capital need requests, and provide that commission requests become a portion of departmental requests.

A technical amendment to subsection b. of section 8 was adopted. This amendment was necessitated by the fact that the commission does not operate any camps within the New Jersey section of the Palisades Interstate Park.

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed <u>S-1164</u>, sponsored by Senator Matthew Feldman (D-Bergen), which places the New Jersey section of the Palisades Interstate Park within but not under the direct jurisdiction of the State Department of Environment Protection.

The bill implements the recommendations contained in a report released by the Senate Energy and Environment Committeesearlier this year, after hearings were held by the Committeeswhich revealed problems in the management, maintenance and utilization of the Park.

Under the bill, the Commission can: coordinate the preparation and submission of its budget, capital needs and planning efforts requests with those of DEP; be considered a State agency to be eligible for 100 percent Green Acres funding; be entitled to legal services from the Attorney General; and be authorized to use staff provided by other State or Local agencies.

In addition, the measure authorizes the Commission to conduct a feasibility study to recommend a method of raising revenues or reducing costs. Among the means to be studied are reviewing of current fees, consolidating existing facilities, imposing "bottle bill" regulations, encouraging private groups to run concessions or maintain certain areas or imposing a toll on the Palisades Interstate Parkway.

In signing the measure, the Governor stressed that the imposition of a toll on the Parkway "was only one of many options that the Commission will be studying as a means of raising revenues."

"This bill does not authorize the imposition of any tolls. It only authorizes a feasibility study. Should the Commission recommend such an action, further legislation and discussion of the problem would be certainly necessary," Byrne said.

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The bill also establishes a Citizens Advisory Council to provide the Commission with the advice of park users, requires a Civil Service re-examination of existing job titles and salary ranges of Commission employees and provides the Commission with access to the New Jersey Tort Claims Fund to pay any judgment that might. be entered against it.

The Park was established in 1937 by compact between the states of New York and New Jersey.
