P.L. 1996, CHAPTER 147, *approved December 20, 1996*Assembly No. 2114

1 ANA CT establishing Pinelands preservation license plates and 2 supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 and chapter 18A of Title 13 of 3 the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. a. The director may issue for a motor vehicle registered in this 9 State special license plates bearing, in addition to the registration 10 number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by 11 law, words and an emblem indicating support for, or an interest in, 12 Pinelands preservation. The license plate shall be designed by the 13 director, in consultation with the Pinelands Commission created by 14 section 4 of P.L.1979, c.111 (C.13:18A-4). Issuance of Pinelands 15 preservation license plates shall be subject to all applicable requirements of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except 16 17 as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.

b. The director shall collect a \$50 application fee for the Pinelands preservation license plate in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of the motor vehicle. The director shall collect annually subsequent to the year of issuance of the license plate a \$10 fee for the license plate in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of the motor vehicle. The additional fees required by this subsection shall be deposited into the Pinelands Preservation Fund, established pursuant to section 2 of P.L., c. (C.) (now pending before the Legislature as this bill).

c. The director shall annually certify to the State Treasurer the 28 29 average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the Division of Motor Vehicles in producing, issuing, 30 31 renewing, making computer programming changes in connection with and publicizing the Pinelands preservation license plates. On a 32 quarterly basis, the State Treasurer shall transfer a sum equal to the 33 34 division's cost in connection with the Pinelands preservation license 35 plates from the Pinelands Preservation Fund, established pursuant to 36 section 2 of P.L. , c. (C.) (now before the Legislature as this bill), to the division. The annual certification of the average cost per 37

license plate shall be approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor.

- d. In the event that the average cost per license plate as certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the \$50 application fee established in subsection b. of this section in two consecutive fiscal years, the director may discontinue the issuance of Pinelands preservation license plates.
- e. The Pinelands Commission and the director shall develop and enter into an interagency memorandum of agreement on procedures to be followed to carry out their respective responsibilities under this act.

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- 2. a. There is created in the Department of the Treasury a non-lapsing, revolving fund to be known as the "Pinelands Preservation Fund." The fund shall be the depository of the fees collected pursuant to subsection b. of section 1 of P.L. , c.
- 17 (C.) (now before the Legislature as this bill). Interest or other 18 income earned on monies deposited into the Pinelands Preservation 19 Fund shall be credited to the fund.
- 20 b. Moneys in the Pinelands Preservation Fund shall be appropriated 21 and distributed exclusively: (1) to reimburse the Division of Motor 22 Vehicles for all costs incurred by that division, as stipulated by the 23 director of that division, in producing, issuing, renewing, making 24 computer programming changes in connection with and publicizing 25 the Pinelands preservation license plates; (2) to pay for the costs of 26 surveys and appraisals and other necessary costs incurred by the 27 Department of Environmental Protection to acquire lands in the 28 Pinelands National Reserve that have limited practical use because of 29 their location and that are held by landowners who both own less than 30 50 acres in the reserve and have exhausted existing remedies to secure relief; and (3) to pay for Pinelands acquisition projects approved by 31 32 the Commissioner of Environmental Protection in accordance with applicable State and federal laws relating to the protection of the 33 Pinelands National Reserve and the pinelands area. 34

Of the initial fees collected from the issuance of Pinelands preservation license plates, an amount not to exceed \$100,000 shall be allocated to the Division of Motor Vehicles to pay the cost of any computer programming changes that may be necessary to implement the Pinelands preservation license plates program established by this act.

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3. This act shall take effect on the 180th day after enactment.

The Assembly Environment, Science and Technology Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 2114.

This bill would establish a special Pinelands license plate, with proceeds obtained therefrom dedicated to the preservation of the Pinelands. The plate would bear words and an emblem designed by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles in consultation with the Pinelands Commission. Motor vehicle owners and lessees would be able to obtain the plate for an initial fee of \$50 and an annual \$10 renewal fee. These fees would be in addition to the registration fees otherwise prescribed by law.

The additional fees would be deposited in the "Pinelands Preservation Fund," created by the bill, and used exclusively to pay (1) for license plate costs, (2) for the costs of surveys and appraisals and other necessary costs incurred by the Department of Environmental Protection to acquire lands in the Pinelands National Reserve that have limited practical use because of their location and that are held by landowners who both own less than 50 acres in the reserve and have exhausted existing remedies to secure relief, and (3) for approved Pinelands acquisition projects in accordance with applicable State and federal laws relating to the protection of the Pinelands National Reserve and the pinelands area.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2114.

Assembly Bill No. 2114 establishes a special license plate for Pinelands preservation. The plate would bear words and an emblem designed by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) in consultation with the Pinelands Commission. Motor vehicle owners and lessees would be able to obtain the plate for an initial fee of \$50 and an annual \$10 renewal fee. These fees would be in addition to the registration fees otherwise prescribed by law.

The additional fees would be deposited in the "Pinelands Preservation Fund," created by the bill, and to be used for approved Pinelands acquisition projects; and the costs of surveys, appraisals and other costs incurred to acquire lands in the Pinelands National Reserve that have limited practical use because of their location and that are held by landowners who own less than 50 acres in the reserve and have exhausted existing remedies to secure relief.

The additional fees would also be used to annually reimburse the DMV for the costs of producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing this special plate, as well as any computer reprogramming costs. Initially, this reimbursement cannot exceed \$100,000. The bill requires the Joint Budget Oversight Committee to certify annually the average cost per license plate.

As reported, this bill is identical to Senate No. 210 (1R) of 1996.

FISCAL IMPACT:

In the past on other bills authorizing the issuance of special license plates, the DMV estimated total fixed costs at \$41,000 for reprogramming agency and revenue automated systems and for one-time die costs. The DMV does not attempt to estimate public interest in new plates; therefore, it does not offer a revenue estimate.

As a reference, the division in Figural Year 1996 estimated that the animal welfare license plans would rake \$433,000, the wildlife conservation license plate - \$236,000, and the shore protection license plate - \$299,000.

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LEGISLATIVE FISCAL ESTIMATE TO

Assembly Bill No. 2114 of 1996 permits the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to issue special Pinelands license plates. The director would be authorized to charge an initial application fee of \$50 and a \$10 renewal fee which shall be in addition to all fees otherwise required by law. After reimbursing DMV for expenses associated with the issuance of the special plates, the remaining application and renewal fees are to be deposited in the "Pinelands Preservation Fund" for the acquisition, and costs related thereto, of property located in the Pinelands National Reserve.

In estimates for previous bills authorizing the issuance of special license plates, DMV estimated total fixed costs to be about \$41,000, for reprogramming agency and revenue automated systems, and for one-time die costs. Variable costs would be about \$8 for the issuance of each set of special plates. However, since DMV is generally unable to estimate public interest in new, special license plates, it does not project revenues.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) concurs with previous DMV cost estimates for the issuance of new, special license plates. However, as a possible reference range for potential revenues, OLS would note that DMV has estimated that FY 1997 revenues from special plates for animal welfare would provide about \$353,000, plates for wildlife conservation would provide about \$180,000, and plates for

shore conservation would provide about \$629,000.

This fiscal estimate has been prepared pursuant to P.L.1980, c.67.
