P.L. 1996, CHAPTER 7, *approved March 15, 1996*  
Senate No. 355

1 **AN ACT** concerning the collection of child support payments,  
2 amending P.L.1981, c.417 and supplementing chapter 17 of Title  
3 2A of the New Jersey Statutes.

4

5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
6 of New Jersey:

7

8 1. Section 2 of P.L. 1981, c.417 (C:2A:17-56.8) is amended to  
9 read as follows:

10 2. Every complaint, notice or pleading for the entry or modification  
11 of an order of a court **[entered or modified]** which includes child  
12 support shall include a written notice to the obligor stating that the  
13 child support provision of the order shall, and the medical support  
14 provision may, as appropriate, be enforced by an income withholding  
15 upon the current or future income due from the obligor's employer or  
16 successor employers and upon the unemployment compensation  
17 benefits due the obligor and against debts, income, trust funds, profits  
18 or income from any other source due the obligor except as provided  
19 in section 3 of P.L.1981, c.417 (C.2A:17-56.9). The written notice  
20 shall also state that the driver's license and professional or  
21 occupational licenses held or applied for by the obligor may be denied,  
22 suspended or revoked if: the child support arrearage is equal to or  
23 exceeds the amount of child support payable for six months; the  
24 obligor fails to provide health insurance for the children as ordered by  
25 the court for six months; or a warrant for the obligor's arrest has been  
26 issued by the court due to failure to pay child support as ordered,  
27 failure to appear at a hearing to establish paternity or child support, or  
28 failure to appear at a hearing to enforce a child support order and said  
29 warrant remains outstanding. The written notice shall also state that  
30 the amount of a IV-D child support order and the provisions for  
31 medical support coverage shall be reviewed and updated, as necessary,  
32 at least every three years.

33 The court shall ensure that in the case of each obligor against whom  
34 a support order is or has been issued or modified, the obligor's income  
35 shall be withheld to comply with the order. An amount shall be  
36 withheld to pay the support obligation and it shall include an amount  
37 to be applied toward liquidation of arrearages reduced to judgments,  
38 payments for paternity testing procedures and provisions for medical  
39 support coverage when applicable. **[The income withholding]** These

1 provisions shall also be applicable to all orders issued on or before the  
2 effective date of this act.

3 (cf: P.L.1995, c.58, s.2)

5 2. (New section) As used in sections 2 through 13 of this act:

6 "Appropriate enforcement methods" means mechanisms such as  
7 income withholding, withholding of civil lawsuits, and execution of the  
8 assets of the obligor which can result in immediate payment of the  
9 child support arrearage when available. In appropriate cases, the  
10 license revocation process may be used as an alternative to Rule 5:7-5  
11 of the Rules Governing the Courts of the State of New Jersey.

12 "Child support" means the periodic payment of support for  
13 dependents in accordance with a court order or judgment. Child  
14 support may include spousal support or alimony if those amounts are  
15 unallocated in the order or judgment. Child support also includes the  
16 health insurance provisions of a court order or judgment.

17 "Child support- related warrant" means an outstanding warrant for  
18 the arrest of a child support obligor or putative father issued by the  
19 court for failure to pay child support as ordered, failure to appear at  
20 a hearing to establish paternity or child support, or failure to appear  
21 at a hearing to enforce a child support order.

22 "Court" means the Family Part of the Superior Court of New  
23 Jersey.

24 "License" means any license, registration or certificate issued by the  
25 State of New Jersey or its agencies or boards that is directly necessary  
26 to provide a product or service for compensation, or to operate a  
27 motor vehicle.

28 "Licensing authority" means any department, division, board,  
29 agency or other instrumentality of State government that issues a  
30 license, registration, certificate or other authorization to provide  
31 goods or services for compensation, to operate a motor vehicle.

32 "Obligee" means any person to whom a child support obligation is  
33 payable including, but not limited to, the custodian of the child who is  
34 the subject of the order or a county welfare agency that is providing  
35 benefits under the program of aid to families with dependent children  
36 to the custodian of the child.

37 "Obligor" means any person who owes child support in accordance  
38 with an order issued by the Superior Court of New Jersey or a foreign  
39 order registered in this State under P.L.1981, c.243 (C:2A:4-30.24 et  
40 seq.). "Obligor" may include a putative father if the basis of a license  
41 suspension or revocation action is a warrant for failure to appear at a  
42 hearing to establish paternity.

43 "Probation Division" means the Probation Division of the Superior  
44 Court which is responsible for enforcing child support orders in New  
45 Jersey.

46 "State IV-D agency" means the Division of Family Development in

1 the Department of Human Services.

2

3 3. a. (New section) If the child support arrearage equals or  
4 exceeds the amount of child support payable for six months or  
5 court-ordered health insurance for the child is not provided for six  
6 months or a child support-related warrant exists, and the obligor is  
7 found to possess a license in the State and all appropriate enforcement  
8 methods to collect the child support arrearage, as defined in section 2  
9 of P.L. ,c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature as this bill) have  
10 been exhausted, the Probation Division shall send a written notice to  
11 the obligor, by certified and regular mail, return receipt requested, at  
12 the obligor's last-known address or place of business or employment,  
13 advising the obligor that the obligor's license shall be revoked or  
14 suspended unless, within 30 days of the postmark date of the notice,  
15 the obligor pays the full amount of the child support arrearage, or  
16 provides proof that health insurance for the child has been obtained,  
17 or makes a written request for a court hearing to the Probation  
18 Division. If a child support- related warrant for the obligor exists, the  
19 license revocation or suspension process shall be terminated if the  
20 obligor pays the full amount of the child support arrearage, provides  
21 proof that health insurance for the child has been obtained as required  
22 by the court order, or surrenders to the county sheriff or the Probation  
23 Division.

24 b. If the obligor fails to take one of the actions in subsection a. of  
25 this section within 30 days of the postmark date of the notice and there  
26 is proof that service on the obligor was effective, the Probation  
27 Division shall file a certification with the court setting forth the  
28 obligor's non-compliance with the support order and the obligor's  
29 failure to respond to the written notice of the potential license  
30 suspension or revocation. If, based on the papers filed by the  
31 Probation Division, the court is satisfied that service on the obligor  
32 was effective as set forth in this section, it shall without need for  
33 further due process or hearing, enter a court order suspending or  
34 revoking all licenses held by the obligor. Upon the entry of the order,  
35 the Probation Division shall forward a copy to the obligor and all  
36 appropriate licensing authorities.

37 Simultaneous certified and regular mailing of the written notice  
38 shall constitute effective service unless the United States Postal  
39 Service returns the mail to the Probation Division within the 30-day  
40 response period marked "moved, unable to forward," "addressee not  
41 known," "no such number/street," "insufficient address," or  
42 "forwarding order expired." If the certified mail is returned for any  
43 other reason without the return of the regular mail, the regular mail  
44 service shall constitute effective service. If the mail is addressed to the  
45 obligor at the obligor's place of business or employment, with postal  
46 instructions to deliver to addressee only, service will be deemed

1 effective only if the signature on the return receipt appears to be that  
2 of the obligor. Acceptance of the certified mail notice signed by the  
3 obligor, the obligor's attorney, or a competent member of the  
4 obligor's household above the age of 14 shall be deemed effective  
5 service.

6 c. If the obligor requests a hearing, the Probation Division shall  
7 file a petition for a judicial hearing in accordance with section 5 of  
8 P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature as this bill). The  
9 hearing shall occur within 45 days of the obligor's request. If, prior to  
10 the hearing, the obligor pays the full amount of the child support  
11 arrearage or provides health insurance as ordered, the license  
12 revocation process shall be terminated. No license revocation action  
13 shall be initiated if the Probation Division has received notice that the  
14 obligor has pending a motion to modify the child support order if that  
15 motion was filed prior to the date that the notice of the license  
16 suspension or revocation was sent by the Probation Division. The  
17 court shall consider the Probation Division's petition to revoke or  
18 suspend a license in accordance with section 5 of P.L. , c. (C. )  
19 (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

20

21 4. (New section) Child support payments not presently made  
22 through the Probation Division shall be so made, upon the application  
23 of the obligee to the Probation Division and prior to the application of  
24 the provisions of this act.

25

26 5. (New section) The court shall suspend or revoke a license if it  
27 finds that: a. all appropriate enforcement methods as defined in section  
28 2 of P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature as this bill)  
29 have been exhausted, b. the obligor is the holder of a license, c. the  
30 requisite child support arrearage amount exists or health insurance for  
31 the child has not been provided as ordered pursuant to section 3 of  
32 P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature as this bill), d. no  
33 motion to modify the child support order, filed prior to the date that  
34 the notice of the license suspension or revocation was sent by the  
35 Probation Division, is pending before the court, and e. there is no  
36 equitable reason, such as involuntary unemployment, disability, or  
37 compliance with a court-ordered plan for the periodic payment of the  
38 child support arrearage amount, for the obligor's non-compliance with  
39 the child support order.

40 If the court is satisfied that these conditions exist, it shall first  
41 consider suspending or revoking a driver's license prior to a  
42 professional license. If the obligor fails to appear at the hearing after  
43 being properly served with notice, the court shall order the suspension  
44 or revocation of all licenses held by the obligor. In the case of a  
45 driver's license, if the court finds that the license revocation or  
46 suspension will result in a significant hardship to the obligor, to the

1 obligor's legal dependents under 18 years of age living in the obligor's  
2 household, to the obligor's employees, or to persons, businesses or  
3 entities to whom the obligor provides goods or services, the court may  
4 allow the obligor to pay 25% of the past-due child support amount  
5 within three working days of the hearing, establish a payment schedule  
6 to satisfy the remainder of the arrearages within one year, and require  
7 that the obligor comply with any current child support obligation. If  
8 the obligor agrees to this arrangement, no suspension or revocation of  
9 any licenses shall be ordered. Compliance with the payment agreement  
10 shall be monitored by the Probation Division. If the obligor has good  
11 cause for not complying with the payment agreement within the time  
12 permitted, the obligor shall immediately file a motion with the court  
13 and the Probation Division requesting an extension of the payment  
14 plan. The court may extend the payment plan if it is satisfied that the  
15 obligor has made a good faith effort to comply with the plan and is  
16 unable to satisfy the full amount of past-due support within the time  
17 permitted due to circumstances beyond the obligor's control. In no  
18 case shall a payment plan extend beyond the date the dependent child  
19 reaches the age of 18. If the obligor fails to comply with the  
20 court-ordered payment schedule, the court shall, upon receipt of a  
21 certification of non-compliance from the obligee or Probation  
22 Division, and without further hearing, order the immediate revocation  
23 or suspension of all licenses held by the obligor. If required by  
24 existing law or regulation, the court shall order that the obligor  
25 surrender the license to the issuing authority within 30 days of the date  
26 of the order.

27

28 6. (New section) a. The Probation Division shall provide the  
29 licensing authority with a copy of the order requiring the suspension  
30 or revocation of a license. Upon receipt of an order requiring the  
31 suspension or revocation of a license for non-payment of child  
32 support, the licensing authority shall immediately notify the licensee of  
33 the effective date of the suspension or revocation, which shall be 20  
34 days after the postmark of the notice, direct the licensee to refrain  
35 from engaging in the activity associated with the license, surrender any  
36 license as required by law, and inform the licensee that the license shall  
37 not be reinstated until the court or Probation Division certifies that all  
38 child support arrearage is satisfied. The Probation Division and the  
39 State IV-D agency in association with the affected licensing authorities  
40 may develop electronic or magnetic tape data transfers to notify  
41 licensing authorities of restrictions, suspensions, revocations and  
42 reinstatements. No liability shall be imposed on a licensing authority  
43 for suspending or revoking a license if the action is in response to a  
44 court order issued in accordance with P.L. ,c. (C. )(pending before  
45 the Legislature as this bill). Licensing authorities shall not have  
46 jurisdiction to modify, remand, reverse, vacate or stay a court order to

- 1 restrict, suspend or revoke a license for non-payment of child support.
- 2 b. If a licensee, upon receipt of the notice of suspension or  
3 revocation from the licensing authority, disputes that he is an obligor,  
4 the licensee shall notify the licensing authority and the Probation  
5 Division by registered mail within 20 days of the postmark of the  
6 notice and request a hearing. Upon receipt of the licensee's request for  
7 a hearing, the Probation Division shall determine if the licensee is an  
8 obligor. If the Probation Division determines that the licensee is an  
9 obligor, the Probation Division shall file a petition for a judicial  
10 hearing on the issue of whether the licensee is an obligor. The hearing  
11 shall occur within 30 days. If the Probation Division determines that  
12 the licensee is not an obligor, the Probation Division shall so notify the  
13 licensee and the licensing authority. The licensing authority shall not  
14 suspend or revoke a person's license, if the licensing authority  
15 received proper notice of the licensee's request for a hearing pursuant  
16 to this subsection, until the court finds that the licensee is an obligor.  
17 The Probation Division shall notify the licensing authority of the  
18 court's finding. Upon receipt of the court's finding that the licensee is  
19 an obligor, the licensing authority shall immediately suspend or revoke  
20 the obligor's license without additional review or hearing.
- 21 c. The revocation or suspension of a license ordered by the court  
22 in accordance with P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature  
23 as this bill) shall continue until the obligor files with the licensing  
24 authority either a court order restoring the license or a Probation  
25 Division certification attesting to the full satisfaction of the child  
26 support arrearage.
- 27 d. Each licensing authority shall require license applicants to certify  
28 on the license application form, under penalty of perjury, that the  
29 applicant does not have a child support obligation, the applicant does  
30 have such an obligation but the arrearage amount does not equal or  
31 exceed the amount of child support payable for six months, or the  
32 applicant is not the subject of a child-support related warrant. A  
33 license shall not be granted to an obligor who applies for a license if  
34 there is an arrearage equal to or exceeding the amount of child support  
35 payable for six months or who is the subject of a child support-related  
36 warrant. The application form shall state that making a false statement  
37 may subject the applicant to contempt of court. It shall also state that  
38 if the applicant's certification is found to be false, the licensing  
39 authority shall take disciplinary action including, but not limited to,  
40 immediate revocation or suspension of the license.
- 41 e. For all licenses issued or renewed in the State after the effective  
42 date of P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature as this bill),  
43 the licensing authority shall record the full name, mailing address,  
44 Social Security number and date of birth of the applicant or licensee.  
45 All affected licensing authorities shall cooperate and enter into  
46 agreements with the Probation Division and the State IV-D agency to

1 exchange information to effectuate the purposes of P.L. , c. (C. )  
2 (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The Division of Motor  
3 Vehicles in the Department of Law and Public Safety and other  
4 appropriate licensing agencies shall amend their regulations and public  
5 notices to permit Social Security numbers collected by those agencies  
6 to be used for child support enforcement purposes. License  
7 information obtained through data matches with licensing authorities  
8 shall be maintained on the Automated Child Support Enforcement  
9 System in the Department of Human Services for future use.

10

11 7. (New section) The obligor shall pay all fees associated with the  
12 revocation, suspension or reinstatement of a license. Any fees paid by  
13 the obligor to the licensing authority to issue, renew or maintain a  
14 license shall not be refunded if the license is suspended or revoked in  
15 accordance with P.L. ,c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature as this  
16 bill).

17

18 8. (New section) Information regarding driver's licenses suspended  
19 or revoked in accordance with P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the  
20 Legislature as this bill) shall be made available by the Division of  
21 Motor Vehicles to insurance companies that issue motor vehicle  
22 policies. Insurance companies are prohibited from increasing a  
23 policyholder's rates solely because a license was suspended or revoked  
24 in accordance with P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature  
25 as this bill).

26

27 9. (New section) All actions taken to suspend or revoke a license  
28 in accordance with P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature  
29 as this bill) shall be carried out in full compliance with due process  
30 laws and the Rules Governing the Courts of the State of New Jersey.  
31 Service of process shall be made in accordance with applicable New  
32 Jersey court rules and statutes. For the purposes of P.L. , c. (C. )  
33 (pending before the Legislature as this bill), service of process may be  
34 effected by an employee of the Probation Division.

35

36 10. (New section) The State IV-D agency shall enter into  
37 cooperative agreements for federal IV-D funding with the Department  
38 of Law and Public Safety and any other appropriate licensing authority  
39 that is responsible for administering license suspensions and  
40 revocations in accordance with P.L. ,c. (C. )(pending before the  
41 Legislature as this bill) to the extent that the costs are eligible for  
42 federal financial participation under section 451 of Title IV, Part D of  
43 the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. §651 et seq.).

44

45 11. (New section) The license revocation provisions of P.L. ,  
46 c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature as this bill) apply to all



1 orders issued before or after the effective date of P.L. , c. (C. )  
2 (pending before the Legislature as this bill). All child support  
3 arrearage and health insurance provisions in existence on or before the  
4 effective date of P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before the Legislature as  
5 this bill) shall be included in determining whether a case is eligible for  
6 enforcement in accordance with P.L. , c. (C. )(pending before  
7 the Legislature as this bill). This act applies to all child support  
8 obligations ordered by any state, territory or district of the United  
9 States that are being enforced by the Probation Division, that are  
10 payable directly to the obligee, or have been registered in this State in

The Senate Women's Issues, Children and Family Services Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 355.

This bill would expand the enforcement powers of the Probation Division of the Superior Court which is responsible for enforcing child support orders in the State.

The bill allows for the suspension or revocation of any license, registration or certificate issued by the State that is directly necessary to provide a product or service for compensation, or to operate a motor vehicle for nonpayment of child support. The licenses would be restored once an individual becomes current on child support payments and a regular schedule has been established. If an obligor defaults on the payment schedule, the obligor's licenses, registrations or certificates, as the case may be, would be automatically denied, suspended or revoked.

Gov. Christie Whitman today visited Raphael's Life House, a transitional residence for homeless and pregnant women, in Elizabeth. Raphael's Life House assists these women in establishing an independent living situation for themselves and their children.

During the visit, Gov. Whitman signed into law S-355/A-1211 sponsored by Senators Richard Codey (D-Essex) and Wayne Bryant (D-Gloucester/Camden). This legislation will allow for suspension or revocation of driver's and professional/occupational licenses for nonpayment of child support.

"This law will send another strong signal that the obligation to support one's children is paramount," said Gov. Whitman. "In the case where a parent has been ordered by a court to provide child support, I believe the state has an obligation to ensure that such orders are met."

According to the legislation, if all appropriate enforcement methods to collect child support have been exhausted and an individual is six months behind in child support payments the individual will receive notification that both driver's and professional/occupational licenses will be revoked if obligations are not met within 30 days or a request for a court hearing has not been received.

The legislation provides for a strong enforcement mechanism, but strikes a balance by ensuring adequate due process for the individuals accused of being delinquent in paying child support. For instance, the bill authorizes the courts to establish a payment schedule in certain circumstances when the individual demonstrates that the revocation of a driver's license would result in "significant hardship" to the individual or the individual's family or business relations.

Gov. Whitman toured Raphael's Life house and commended the center for embodying much of the philosophy behind "Work First New Jersey", the welfare reform program she announced earlier this year.

"I want to congratulate the residents, who have made the courageous decision to take charge of their lives and provide a better life for themselves and their children," said Gov. Whitman. "I support the philosophy behind Raphael's Life House and am working to make it a reality for more women who find themselves in your situation," said Gov. Whitman.

Work First New Jersey is based on the belief that all work has dignity and the best preparation for a job is a job. To receive assistance, Work First New Jersey recipients will have to: follow work requirements; if teenage parents, stay in school and live under adult supervision; cooperate in child support collection efforts; and stay in the program for no more than five years. State government will help participants prepare for work and get into jobs and provide health insurance and child care, along with other financial and support services, during their transition from dependency to self sufficiency.

Raphael's Life House, incorporated in 1991, is run by the Catholic Community Services of the Archdiocese of Newark. The facility is a nondenominational non-profit funded through private donations, as well as grants and foundation money. Residents of Raphael's Life House are expected to attend school or work full time, to care for their new borns and to participate fully in the life of the residence. The facility provides job training, birthing classes, crisis counseling, welfare advocacy, parenting skills, tutoring and additional services by referral. The maximum stay is expected to be 12 months. A six month follow-up service is available to mothers who return to independent living in the community.

Senate President Donald Di Francesco (R-Middlesex, Morris, Somerset, Union) and Sen. Richard Codey (D-Essex), and Sen. Wayne Bryant (D-Gloucester/Camden) and Human Services Commissioner William Waldman joined Gov. Whitman at Raphael's Life House.
