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P.L. 1996, CHAPTER 31, *approved June 6, 1996* Senate No. 100

1 AN ACT exempting certain farm tractors from motor vehicle 2 registration and amending R.S.39:3-24.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
of New Jersey:

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1. R.S.39:3-24 is amended to read as follows:

8 39:3-24. (a) The director shall register farm tractors and traction 9 equipment used for farm operation to travel upon the public highways. 10 The fee for such registration shall be \$5 per annum, whether the 11 registration is issued for the yearly period or only a portion thereof. 12 Such traction equipment or farm tractors may draw farm machinery 13 and implements while in transit from one farm to another without 14 additional registration therefor.

15 (b) The director may register motor vehicles, not for hire, used exclusively as farm machinery or farm implements, to travel upon the 16 17 public highways, from one farm, or portion thereof, to another farm, 18 or portion thereof, both owned or managed by the registered owner of 19 the vehicle or vehicles. The fee for such registration shall be \$5 per 20 annum, whether the registration is issued for a yearly period or only a 21 portion thereof. Any vehicle so registered and any truck registered 22 pursuant to the provisions of 39:3-25 of this Title may draw not more 23 than one vehicle used exclusively on the farm and a vehicle so drawn 24 need not be registered.

25 (c) No vehicle registered pursuant to this section shall be operated 26 on a public highway at any time from sunset to sunrise. Every such 27 vehicle when operated on a public highway shall have means adequate to control the movement of and to stop and hold such vehicle on any 28 29 up or down grade and shall be operated in accordance with uniform 30 rules and regulations prescribed by the Director of the Division of 31 Motor Vehicles. Such rules and regulations shall specify the coverings 32 that may be used on the wheels of such vehicles, the days, hours and conditions under which such vehicles can be operated, the 33 34 circumstance under which escort vehicles shall be required, the 35 distance that may be traveled upon the public highways and such 36 vehicle equipment or other requirements or restrictions as may be 37 necessary to protect the safety of the users of the public highways.

Motor vehicles, not for hire, which are used exclusively as farm
 tractors, traction equipment, farm machinery or farm implements
 which cannot be operated at a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour
 shall not be required to be registered under this section.

AN ACT exempting certain farm tractors from motor vehicle
 registration and amending R.S.39:3-24.

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4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey:

1. R.S.39:3-24 is amended to read as follows:

8 39:3-24. (a) The director shall register farm tractors and traction 9 equipment used for farm operation to travel upon the public highways. 10 The fee for such registration shall be \$4.00 per annum, whether the 11 registration is issued for the yearly period or only a portion thereof. 12 Such traction equipment or farm tractors may draw farm machinery 13 and implements while in transit from one farm to another without 14 additional registration therefor.

15 (b) The director may register motor vehicles, not for hire, used 16 exclusively as farm machinery or farm implements, to travel upon the public highways, from one farm, or portion thereof, to another farm, 17 18 or portion thereof, both owned or managed by the registered owner of 19 the vehicle or vehicles. The fee for such registration shall be \$2.00 per 20 annum, whether the registration is issued for a yearly period or only a 21 portion thereof. Any vehicle so registered and any truck registered 22 pursuant to the provisions of 39:3-25 of this Title may draw not more than one vehicle used exclusively on the farm and a vehicle so drawn 23 24 need not be registered.

25 (c) No vehicle registered pursuant to this section shall be operated 26 on a public highway at any time from sunset to sunrise. Every such 27 vehicle when operated on a public highway shall have means adequate to control the movement of and to stop and hold such vehicle on any 28 29 up or down grade and shall be operated in accordance with uniform 30 rules and regulations prescribed by the Director of the Division of 31 Motor Vehicles. Such rules and regulations shall specify the coverings that may be used on the wheels of such vehicles, the days, hours and 32

1 conditions under which such vehicles can be operated, the 2 circumstance under which escort vehicles shall be required, the 3 distance that may be traveled upon the public highways and such 4 vehicle equipment or other requirements or restrictions as may be 5 necessary to protect the safety of the users of the public highways.

Motor vehicles, not for hire, which are used exclusively as farm
tractors, traction equipment, farm machinery or farm implements
which cannot be operated at a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour
shall not be required to be registered under this section.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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SPONSORS STATEMENT

This bill would exclude farm tractors and equipment which cannot attain speeds of greater than 20 miles per hour from being registered as motor vehicles. Tractors that are capable of reaching speeds of greater than 20 miles per hour would not be excepted from registration.

The farm tractors excepted from registration under the bill rarely use the roads, crossing them only to reach other sections of farmland. Therefore, registration of these farm vehicles as motor vehicles is an unnecessary expense for farmers, and an unnecessary administrative expense for the State.

The Senate Senior Citizens, Veterans Affairs and Agriculture Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No.100.

This bill would exclude farm tractors and equipment that cannot attain speeds of greater than 20 miles per hour from being registered as motor vehicles. Tractors that are capable of reaching speeds of greater than 20 miles per hour would not be excepted from registration. The annual registration fee is \$5.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1996 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

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LEGISLATIVE FISCAL ESTIMATE TO BRARY COPY

Senate Bill No. 100 of 1996 excludes farm tractors, traction equipment, farm machinery and farm implements which cannot attain speeds greater than 20 miles per hour from being registered as motor vehicles.

Currently, all farm tractors and equipment which travel upon the public highways are required to be registered with the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) in the Department of Transportation. The annual registration fee for farm tractors, traction equipment, farm machinery or farm implements is \$5.

In a previous estimate for a similar proposal, Senate Bill No. 176 of 1994, DMV assumed that all farm vehicles currently registered would become exempt from registration fees. Thus, approximately 4,300 farm tractors and other types of traction equipment and 4,600 motor vehicles used as farm machinery and farm implements would be excluded.

If that previous DMV assumption was continued, the exclusion would result in a total annual revenue loss of about \$57,000. This amount is composed of \$44,500 from registration fees, \$8,900 from emergency medical helicopter surcharges imposed pursuant to P.L.1992, c.87 (C.39:3-8.2) and \$3,600 from reflectorized license plate surcharges imposed pursuant to P.L.1989, c.202 (C.39:3-33.9).

As an offset, DMV previously estimated a savings of \$5,700 from various materials and supplies. Consequently, the apparent net cost to the State would be \$51,300 in foregone annual revenue.

The Office of Legislative Services finds that DMV's previous estimate may overstate the net cost to the State. The previous DMV estimate represents the maximum loss to the State. However, not all currently registered farm tractors and vehicles may meet the criteria established by this bill. In addition, DMV did not account for a possible reduction in administrative costs associated with processing a reduced number of registrations. Therefore, the actual "loss" to the State may be lower than the inferred \$51,300 amount.

The legislative fiscal estimate has been produced by the Office of Legislative Services due to the failure of the Executive Branch to respond to our request for a fiscal note.

This fiscal estimate has been prepared pursuant to P.L.1980, c.67.
