#### INTRODUCED JANUARY 31, 1994

AN ACT concerning construction standards for school buildings <sup>2</sup>[and], <sup>2</sup> supplementing chapter 18A of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes <sup>2</sup>and P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.)<sup>2</sup>.

# BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. The State Board of Education shall adopt no regulation or policy which requires as a condition for approval of plans and specifications for the erection, alteration, improvement or repair of a public school facility<sup>2</sup> [:
- a.]<sup>2</sup> capacity requirements which exclude space occupied by movable furniture, equipment and other items when calculating net square footage<sup>2</sup> [;
- b. refurbishment of a school facility based upon an automatic threshold, involving percentage increases in square footage or the relative costs of the building addition, beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code <sup>1</sup>[in effect at the time the building was constructed] which directly impact on the health and safety of the students<sup>1</sup>; or
- c. refurbishment of a newly reopened school facility beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code which directly impact on the health and safety of the students]<sup>2</sup>.
- 22. The Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs, in consultation with the State Board of Education, is directed to develop a building code specifically designed to foster cost-effective school building construction, while ensuring through its provisions that necessary health and safety requirements are met. The code shall be designed for use throughout the State and shall supplement the State Uniform Construction Code, P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.). The commissioner may promulgate this code as a separate document from the State Uniform Construction Code, or may, if the commissioner finds it feasible and useful, incorporate its provisions directly into, and make them an integral part of, that code.<sup>2</sup>
- <sup>2</sup>3. The code adopted by the Commissioner of Community Affairs pursuant to section 2 of this act shall not require as a condition for approval of plans and specifications for the erection, alteration, improvement or repair of a public school facility:

# BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. The State Board of Education shall adopt no regulation or policy which requires as a condition for approval of plans and specifications for the erection, alteration, improvement or repair of a public school facility:
- a. capacity requirements which include movable furniture, equipment and other items when calculating net square footage;
- b. refurbishment of a school facility based upon an automatic threshold, involving percentage increases in square footage or the relative costs of the building addition, beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code in effect at the time the building was constructed; or
- c. refurbishment of a newly reopened school facility beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code in effect at the time the building was constructed.
  - 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### STATEMENT

This bill prohibits the State Board of Education from requiring as a condition for obtaining approval of plans and specifications for the erection, alteration, improvement or repair of a public school facility (1) capacity requirements which include such items as movable furniture and equipment; (2) refurbishment of a school building based upon an automatic trigger beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code in effect at the time the building was constructed; or (3) complete refurbishment of a newly reopened existing school building beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code in effect at the time the building was constructed.

Provides that State Department of Education shall not require certain standards to be met as condition for approval of plans for the construction or refurbishment of school facilities.

### STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MAY 5, 1994

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 496 with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill prohibits the State Board of Education from requiring as a condition for obtaining approval of plans and specifications for the erection, alteration, improvement or repair of a public school facility (1) capacity requirements which exclude space occupied by such items as movable furniture and equipment in the calculation of net square footage; (2) refurbishment of a school building based upon an automatic trigger beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code in effect at the time the building was constructed; or (3) complete refurbishment of a newly reopened existing school building beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code which directly impact on the health and safety of the students.

The committee amended the bill to clarify the prohibition against certain regulations which specify capacity requirements in the calculation of net square footage and which specify the requirements of the building code for the refurbishment of a newly reopened school facility.

#### REPLACE TITLE TO READ:

AN ACT concerning construction standards for school buildings <sup>2</sup>[and] <sup>2</sup> supplementing chapter 18A of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes <sup>2</sup>and P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.]<sup>2</sup>.

#### REPLACE SECTION 1 TO READ:

- 1. The State Board of Education shall adopt no regulation or policy which requires as a condition for approval of plans and specifications for the erection, alteration, improvement or repair of a public school facility<sup>2</sup> [:
- a.]<sup>2</sup> capacity requirements which exclude space occupied by movable furniture, equipment and other items when calculating net square footage<sup>2</sup> [;
- b. refurbishment of a school facility based upon an automatic threshold, involving percentage increases in square footage or the relative costs of the building addition, beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code <sup>1</sup>[in effect at the time the building was constructed] which directly impact on the health and safety of the students <sup>1</sup>: or

The Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs, in consultation with the State Board of Education, is directed to develop a building code specifically designed to foster cost-effective school building construction, while ensuring through its provisions that necessary health and safety requirements are met. The code shall be designed for use throughout the State and shall supplement the State Uniform Construction Code, P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.). The commissioner may promulgate this code as a separate document from the State Uniform Construction Code, or may, if the commissioner finds it fible and useful, incorporate its provisions directly into, a make them an integral part of, that code.
- 3. The code adopted by the Commissioner of Community Affairs pursuant to section 2 of this act shall not require as a condition for approval of plans and specifications for the erection, alteration, improvement or repair of a public school facility:
- a. refurbishment of a school facility based upon an automatic threshold, involving percentage increases in square footage or the relative costs of the building addition, beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code which directly impact on the health and safety of students; or

b. refurbishment of a newly reopened school facility beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code which directly impact on the health and safety of the students.<sup>2</sup>

#### **RENUMBER SECTION 2 AS SECTION 4**

#### **REPLACE SYNOPSIS TO READ:**

Provides that State Board of Education shall not require certain standards to be met as condition for approval of school facilities plans and directs Commissioner of Community Affairs to develop a building code specific to school buildings.

#### **STATEMENT**

These amendments direct that the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs, in consultation with the State Board of Education, develop a building code designed to foster cost-effective school building construction, while ensuring that health and safety requirements are met. The code shall be designed for use throughout the State and shall supplement the State Uniform Construction Code. The bill stipulates that the code adopted by the commissioner shall not require as a condition for the approval of construction plans and specifications of a public school facility either: a. refurbishment of a school facility based upon an automatic threshold, involving percentage increases in square footage or the relative costs of the building addition, beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code which directly impact on the health and safety of students; or b. refurbishment of a newly reopened school facility beyond that necessary to meet the requirements of the appropriate building code which directly impact on the health and safety of students.

The bill in its original form had prohibited the State Board of Education from adopting any regulation or policy which would require either a. or b. as a condition for the approval of plans and specifications. However, the regulations governing a. and b. are actually regulations of the Department of Community Affairs promulgated in connection with the "State Uniform Construction Code Act." P.L.1975, C.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq).
