INTRODUCED SEPTEMBER 19, 1994

By Senators SINAGRA and ADLER

AN ACT concerning the practice of medicine and surgery and supplementing Chapter 9 of Title 45 of the Revised Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. A physician licensed by the State Board of Medical Examiners, or a physician who is an applicant for a license from the State Board of Medical Examiners shall notify the board within 10 days of any action taken against the physician's medical license by any other state licensing board or any action affecting the physician's privileges to practice medicine by any out-of-State hospital, health care facility, health maintenance organization or other employer.
- b. A physician who is in violation of this section is subject to disciplinary action and civil penalties pursuant to sections 8, 9 and 12 of P.L.1978, c.73 (C.45:1-21 to 22 and 45:1-25).
- ¹c. The State Board of Medical Examiners shall notify all physicians licensed by the board of the requirements of this section within 30 days of the date of enactment of this act.¹
 - 2. This act shall take effect on the 60th day after enactment.

Requires physicians to report out-of-State licensure disciplinary actions to Board of Medical Examiners.

The Assembly Commerce and Regulated Professions Committee reports favorably Senate, No. 1408(1R).

This bill requires State licensed physicians and applicants for State licensure to notify the State Board of Medical Examiners within 10 days of any action taken against them by a licensing board in another state and any action affecting the physician's privileges to practice medicine by any out-of-State hospital, health care facility, health maintenance organization or other employer.
