STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED MARCH 15, 1994

By Senator CARDINALE

AN ACT concerning continuing education requirements for pharmacists, supplementing chapter 14 of Title 45 of the Revised Statutes, and repealing P.L.1972, c.61.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. The Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey shall require each person registered as a pharmacist, as a condition for biennial certification pursuant to R.S.45:14-11 and P.L.1972, c.108 (C.45:1-7), to complete ¹[not less than]¹ 30 credits of continuing pharmaceutical education and submit proof thereof, as provided in section 2 of this act, during each biennial registration period.
 - 2. a. The board shall:
- (1) Establish standards for continuing pharmaceutical education, including the subject matter and content of courses of study, the selection of instructors, and the ¹[number and]¹ type of continuing education credits required of a registered pharmacist as a condition for biennial certification;
- (2) Approve educational programs offering credit towards the continuing pharmaceutical education requirements; and
- (3) Approve other equivalent educational programs, including, but not limited to, home study courses, and shall establish procedures for the issuance of credit upon satisfactory proof of the completion of these programs.
- b. In the case of education courses and programs, each hour of instruction shall be equivalent to one credit.
- 3. a. In no event shall the board approve a continuing pharmaceutical education program, pursuant to subsection a. of section 2 of this act, that discriminates against any registered pharmacist in this State. The board shall only approve programs that are: provided on a reasonable nondiscriminatory basis; available to all registered pharmacists in this State; and offered in a manner that enables pharmacists from all areas of the State to attend.

 1 The board shall permit any pharmaceutical association or organization offering a continuing pharmaceutical education program approved by the board pursuant to section 2 of this act to impose a reasonable differential in registration fees for courses upon registered pharmacists who are not members of that pharmaceutical association or organization.

 1 The board may approve programs to be held within or outside of this State.
- b. In no event shall the board grant credits for or approve as a component of a continuing pharmaceutical education program,

pursuant to subsection a. of section 2 of this act: (1) participation in the routine business portion of any meeting of a pharmaceutical organization; or (2) any presentation that is offered to sell a product or promote a business enterprise.

- 4. The board may, in its discretion, waive requirements for continuing pharmaceutical education on an individual basis for reasons of hardship such as illness or disability, retirement of the registration certificate, or other good cause.
- 5. The board shall not require completion of continuing pharmaceutical education credits for an initial renewal of registration.
- 6. In the event a pharmacist completes a number of continuing education credit hours in excess of the number required by 1 [the board pursuant to] 1 section 1 [2] 1 of this act, the board may allow that these credits be carried over to satisfy the pharmacist's continuing education requirement for the next biennial certification period, but shall not be applicable thereafter.
 - 7. P.L.1972, c.61 (C.45:14-11.2 et seq.) is repealed.
- 8. This act shall take effect on the 90th day following enactment, except that the Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey may, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), promulgate regulations to effectuate the provisions of this act immediately.

29 Establishes jurisdiction of Board of Pharmacy over continuing 30 pharmaceutical education requirements.

- 5. The board shall not require completion of continuing pharmaceutical education credits for an initial renewal of registration.
- 6. In the event a pharmacist completes a number of continuing education credit hours in excess of the number required by the board pursuant to section 2 of this act, the board may allow that these credits be carried over to satisfy the pharmacist's continuing education requirement for the next biennial certification period, but shall not be applicable thereafter.
 - 7. P.L.1972, c.61 (C.45:14-11.2 et seq.) is repealed.
- 8. This act shall take effect on the 90th day following enactment, except that the Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey may, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), promulgate regulations to effectuate the provisions of this act immediately.

STATEMENT

 This bill provides that the Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey assume direct responsibility for continuing pharmaceutical education. The bill repeals P.L.1972, c.61 (C.45:14-11.2 et seq.), thereby abolishing the New Jersey Council on Continuing Pharmaceutical Education and removing its statutory authority in the area of continuing education for pharmacists.

The bill stipulates that the Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey is empowered to establish standards, approve programs and establish the number and type of credits of continuing education required for the biennial renewal of registration of all active pharmacists in this State.

Waivers of the continuing pharmaceutical education requirements may be granted by the board on an individual basis due to hardship or other good cause. In addition, the board shall not require completion of continuing pharmaceutical education credits for an initial renewal of registration.

The board may allow a registered pharmacist to carry over excess continuing education credits beyond what is required for a particular biennial certification period to satisfy the continuing education requirements for the next biennial certification period, but these credits shall not be applicable thereafter.

The bill stipulates that the Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey shall require that persons registered as pharmacists complete not less than 30 credits of continuing pharmaceutical education as a condition of biennial certification. In addition, the bill specifies that the board shall not grant any credits, or approve as part of any continuing pharmaceutical education program, participation in the routine business portion of any meeting of a pharmaceutical organization, or any presentation that is offered to sell a product or promote a business enterprise.

Establishes jurisdiction of Board of Pharmacy over continuing pharmaceutical education requirements.

The Senate Commerce Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 854.

This bill, as amended by the committee, transfers responsibility for continuing pharmaceutical education of pharmacists to the Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey from the New Jersey Council on Continuing Pharmaceutical Education, which is abolished by the repeal of P.L.1972, c.61 (C.45:14-11.2 et seq.) in the bill.

The bill stipulates that the Board of Pharmacy shall require that persons registered as pharmacists complete 30 credits of continuing pharmaceutical education as a condition of biennial renewal of registration. The Board of Pharmacy is empowered to establish standards for continuing pharmaceutical education, education programs and establish the type of credits of continuing pharmaceutical education required for the biennial renewal of registration of all active pharmacists in this State. The board may only approve continuing pharmaceutical education programs that are: provided on a reasonable nondiscriminatory basis; available to all registered pharmacists in this State; and offered in a manner that enables pharmacists from all areas of the State to attend. In addition, the board may not grant any credits for, or approve as any continuing pharmaceutical education program, part of participation in the routine business portion of any meeting of a pharmaceutical organization, or any presentation that is offered to sell a product or promote a business enterprise. The board must permit any pharmaceutical association offering a continuing pharmaceutical education program approved by the board to impose a reasonable differential in registration fees for courses upon registered pharmacists who are not members of that pharmaceutical association.

Waivers of the continuing pharmaceutical education requirements may be granted by the board on an individual basis due to hardship, retirement or other good cause. In addition, the board may not require completion of continuing pharmaceutical education credits for an initial renewal of registration.

The board may allow a registered pharmacist to carry over excess continuing pharmaceutical education credits beyond what is required for a particular biennial period to satisfy the continuing pharmaceutical education requirements for the next biennial period, but these credits may not be applicable thereafter.
