1	AN ACT concerning the State program of financial assistance for
2	persons with cystic fibrosis and amending P.L.1989, c.270.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 3 of P.L.1989, c.270 (C.26:2O-3) is amended to read as follows:
- 3. a. A person with cystic fibrosis is eligible for assistance under this act for the purchase of supplemental, nutritious foods and prescription drugs and medical supplies and equipment that are necessary for the treatment of cystic fibrosis, if the person is 18 years of age or older and (1) the person's annual income is less than [\$25,000] \$30,000; or (2) the person's annual income is [\$25,000] \$30,000 or greater, but the person has incurred, within the last 12 months, prescription drug and medical supplies and equipment costs related to the treatment of cystic fibrosis, the total cost of which, when deducted from the person's income, reduces the person's income to under [\$25,000] \$30,000.
- b. A person with cystic fibrosis who is 18 years of age or older who has health insurance is eligible for financial assistance under this act of up to \$500 per year to help meet the cost of the deductible on the insurance policy if the person's annual income is less than \$30,000. This financial assistance may be provided in addition to assistance for the purchase of supplemental, nutritious foods and pharmaceutical drugs and medical supplies and equipment [and shall be provided without consideration of the person's annual income].
- c. Beginning in January 1995 and annually thereafter, the income eligibility limits provided in subsections a. and b. of this section shall increase in accordance with the Consumer Price Index published by the federal government. The Commissioner of Health shall annually adopt the new income eligibility limits by regulation, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.).

The Assembly Health and Human Resources Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 978.

This bill increases the income eligibility limits for recipients who receive benefits under the State program of financial assistance for persons with cystic fibrosis established pursuant to P.L.1989, c.270 (C.26:2O-1 et seq.). The annual income eligibility limit is increased from \$25,000 to \$30,000 for a person with cystic fibrosis to receive assistance for the purchase of supplemental, nutritious foods and prescription drugs and medical supplies and equipment that are necessary for the treatment of cystic fibrosis. If the person's income is \$30,000 or greater, but during the last 12 months, the person has incurred prescription drug and medical supplies and equipment costs related to the treatment of cystic fibrosis, which, when deducted from the person's income, reduces the person's income to under \$30,000, the person would also be eligible for financial assistance under this bill.

The bill additionally amends the cystic fibrosis financial assistance program by limiting the financial assistance available for the payment of health insurance deductible costs to a person with cystic fibrosis whose annual income is less than \$30,000. Current law does not provide for any income eligibility limits for this financial assistance.
