The Senate Health Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 262.

This bill amends the "Uniform Anatomical Gift Act," (C.26:6-57 et seq.), to allow an accredited college program for mortuary science to become a donee of anatomical gifts of body parts. This would enable these schools to obtain the necessary body parts needed to provide their students with adequate clinical experience.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 1994-95 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 262.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2863 (Kramer/Wright), which the committee also reported on this date.
