1 AN ACT concerning the employment of personnel at certain
2 State correctional facilities and amending P.L.1983, c.280.

4 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the*
5 *State of New Jersey:*

6 1. Section 1 of P.L.1983, c.280 (C.11:9-2.1) is amended to read
7 as follows:

8 1. Notwithstanding any provisions of law relating to required
9 residence for State employees in Title 11 of the Revised Statutes,
10 the appointing authority of any State correctional facility located
11 in a county with a population of more than [117,000] 135,000 but
12 less than [133,000] 175,000 inhabitants, according to the [latest]
13 1990 federal decennial census, shall appoint to positions of
14 employment with the facility residents of the county in which the
15 facility is located and residents of any adjoining county with a
16 population of less than [83,000] 100,000, according to the 1990
17 federal decennial census, and shall give first preference in
18 appointments to positions of employment to residents of the
19 municipality in which the facility is located and second
20 preference in appointments to positions of employment ¹(1)¹ to
21 residents of the county in which the facility is located¹; (2), in
22 the case of any such State correctional facility in operation on
23 the effective date of P.L. . c. (now pending before the
24 Legislature as this bill), to residents of any adjoining county of
25 the sixth class having a population of less than 100,000, according
26 to the 1990 federal decennial census; and (3), in the case of any
27 such State correctional facility which becomes operational after
28 the effective date of P.L. , c. (now pending before the
29 Legislature as this bill), to residents of any adjoining county of
30 the third class having a population of less than 70,000, according
31 to the 1990 federal decennial census¹, provided that:

32 a. The residents permanently appointed possess at least the
33 minimum qualifications required by Civil Service specifications
34 for the available positions, have lived in the county for at least
35 six months and have complied with other requirements of Title 11
36 of the Revised Statutes; and

37 b. A sufficient number of qualified residents exists for
38 permanent appointment to available positions.

39 ¹[Third] Except as otherwise provided in this section, third¹
40 preference in appointments to positions of employment shall be
41 given to residents of any adjoining county with a population of

15 facility is located and residents of any adjoining county with a
16 population of less than [83,000] 100,000, according to the 1990
17 federal decennial census, and shall give first preference in
18 appointments to positions of employment to residents of the
19 municipality in which the facility is located and second
20 preference in appointments to positions of employment to
21 residents of the county in which the facility is located, provided
22 that:

23 a. The residents permanently appointed possess at least the
24 minimum qualifications required by Civil Service specifications
25 for the available positions, have lived in the county for at least
26 six months and have complied with other requirements of Title 11
27 of the Revised Statutes; and

28 b. A sufficient number of qualified residents exists for
29 permanent appointment to available positions.

30 Third preference in appointments to positions of employment
