P.L.1995, CHAPTER 207, approved August 14, 1995 1994 Assembly No. 17 (Second Reprint)

AN ACT ¹[directing] <u>authorizing</u>¹ the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development to develop new strategies to attract and retain businesses and supplementing chapter 1B of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "New Jersey Industry Sector Network Development Act."
 - 2. The Legislature finds and declares that:
- a. The Department of Commerce and Economic Development admirably provides generic services and technical assistance to businesses that request such help;
- b. The department should now complement its existing, generic types of assistance with appropriate, specific strategies oriented towards promoting businesses in high potential and mid-potential growth industry sectors, and businesses in declining industry sectors that have the potential for revitalization; and
- c. These new, specific strategies ¹[should] may¹ include ¹assistance in¹ the creation of industry sector networks wherein similar businesses work together and learn from each other thereby enabling such networks to benefit from economies of scale and thus enhance their competitiveness in current markets and also permit their entry into new, larger markets.
 - 3. As used in this act:
- ²[1"Department" means the Department of Commerce and Economic Development. 1]²
- "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development²[.];²
- ²"Department" means the Department of Commerce and Economic Development;²
- ¹"Economic master plan commission" means the New Jersey Economic Master Plan Commission established by Executive Order No. 1 issued by the Governor on January 18, 1994²[.J¹;²

"Industry sector network" means ¹[groups] <u>clusters</u> ¹ of two or more ¹[key industries] <u>businesses within a key industry</u> working jointly to manufacture, sell or market products, develop technologies or create or disseminate information ²[.]; and ²

"Key industry" means an industry that makes or could make an important contribution to the economy of the State, ¹[including but not limited to,] which may include², ² but need not be limited to, healthcare, ¹ pharmaceuticals, chemicals, communications,

- ^{15.} In implementing the goals of section 4 of this act, the commissioner shall encourage the division or a designated non-profit entity, as the case may be, to coordinate efforts with existing economic development programs and to cooperate with other public and private organizations, which may include, but need not be limited to, State and local agencies and commissions involved with business network development, utility companies, industry trade and business groups or associations, or ²[a]² private sector non-profit groups organized to promote economic development in the State.¹

STATEMENT

 This bill directs the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development to assist industries with similar products or services to join into networks. It is intended that networks of similar industries would work together and learn from each other thereby enhancing their competitiveness in current markets and also permitting their entry into new, larger market areas. The need for job retention and job expansion is important to the economic well-being of the State and the creation of industry networks would surely promote our economy. Therefore, it is essential that the State act as a catalyst for the creation of industry sector networks.

The Assembly Economic Development, Agriculture and Military and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 17, with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill authorizes the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development to assist industries with similar products or services to join into networks. It is intended that networks of similar industries would work together and learn from each other thereby enhancing their competitiveness in current markets and also permitting their entry into new, larger market areas. The need for job retention and job expansion is important to the economic well-being of the State and the creation of industry networks would surely promote our economy. Therefore, it is essential that the State act as a catalyst for the creation of industry sector networks.

The committee amended the bill to authorize rather than require the commissioner to assist in the development of industry sector networks.

The amendments also redefine and clarify the term "industry sector network" and give the commissioner discretion to determine which sectoral networks shall be developed. The committee amendments also give the commissioner the flexibility to delegate responsibilities for developing industry sector networks to a non-profit corporation to assist the department in implementing the goals of the bill.

The New Jersey Economic Master Plan Commission and the Assembly Task Force on Business Retention, Expansion, and Export Opportunities both recommended the formation of industry networks. The committee amendments are intended to enhance the commissioner's ability to implement the Economic Master Plan Commission's recommendation that the proposed non-profit corporation, Prosperity New Jersey, be involved with network formation. The committee also intends that the proposed Blueprint for Growth, Inc., recommended by the Assembly Task Force, should also provide assistance in this effort, thereby, promoting an Executive/Legislative partnership to strengthen the growth of industry sector networks in the State.

The Senate Natural Resources, Trade and Economic Development Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 17 (1R), with committee amendments.

This bill authorizes the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development to act (1) through the Department of Commerce and Economic Development, or (2) through a non-profit entity which may include a non-profit corporation organized to implement the recommendations of the economic master plan commission, to assist certain New Jersey "key industries." Key industry, as defined in the bill, means an industry that makes or could make an important contribution to the economy of the State. The bill lists types of industries that would be considered "key industries."

The bill authorizes the commissioner to assist these key industries with the creation of industry sector networks, which are defined by the bill to mean clusters of two or more businesses within a key industry working together to manufacture, sell or market products, develop technologies or create or disseminate information. The commissioner is also authorized to assist with: the development of a program designed to train persons who would assist in the formation of industry sector networks; the development of industry related markets; the establishment of industry related training and education programs; the improvement of industry products or quality of services; the development of solutions that hinder the marketing of products or services; the adoption of policies to ensure that industry proprietary information remains confidential; and, any other industry problems or opportunities that may arise.

The bill also authorizes the commissioner to allocate matching funds to help an industry sector network with network start-up costs and activities in order to stimulate private sector financing to promote self-sufficient networks.

The committee amendments are technical in nature and serve to clarify the sponsor's intent.
