- (12) The actuary of the system shall be selected by the Retirement Systems Actuary Selection Committee established by P.L.1992, c.125. He shall be the technical adviser of the board of trustees on matters regarding the operation of the funds created by the provisions of this act, and shall perform such other duties as are required in connection therewith.
- (13) At least once in each three-year period the actuary shall make an actuarial investigation into the mortality, service and compensation experience of the members and beneficiaries of the retirement system and, with the advice of the actuary, the board of trustees shall adopt for the retirement system such mortality, service and other tables as shall be deemed necessary and shall certify the rates of contribution payable under the provisions of this act.

- (15) On the basis of such tables recommended by the actuary as the board of trustees shall adopt and regular interest, the actuary shall make an annual valuation of the assets and liability of the funds of the system created by this act.

- (17) Each policeman or fireman member of the board of trustees shall be entitled to time off from his duty, with pay, during the periods of his attendance upon regular or special meetings of the board of trustees, and such time off shall include reasonable travel time required in connection therewith.

STATEMENT

This bill increases the membership of the board of trustees of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) from nine to 11 members. It allows the Governor to appoint five, rather than four, members and mandates that the board shall include one PFRS retiree member who shall be elected by PFRS retirees. It further provides that the two policemen and two firemen board members shall be active PFRS members and shall be elected by active PFRS members.

This bill will also: (1) increase the membership of the board from nine to 11; (2) provide that the Governor shall appoint five, rather than four, members (who shall be private citizens and who shall not be active or retired members of any police or fire department); (3) provide that the two policemen and two firemen board members shall be active PFRS members who shall be elected by active PFRS members; (4) provide that there shall be one PFRS retiree member who shall be elected by PFRS retirees; and (5) use the latest version of the law and correct references to the Division of Pensions and Benefits.

The Senate State Management, Investments and Financial Institutions Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 298.

This bill increases the membership of the board of trustees of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) from nine to 11 members. It allows the Governor to appoint five, rather than four, members and mandates that the board shall include one PFRS retiree member who shall be elected by PFRS retirees. It further provides that the two policemen and two firemen board members shall be active PFRS members and shall be elected by active PFRS members.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 1994 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
