P.L. 1995, CHAPTER 247, approved September 12, 1995 1995 Senate No. 2066

AN ACT establishing the Legislative Initiative Municipal Block Grant Program, supplementing Title 52 of the Revised Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. There shall be appropriated annually by the Legislature for each State fiscal year an amount not less than \$33,000,000 for the Legislative Initiative Municipal Block Grant Program. The amount appropriated shall be distributed to municipalities on or before September 1 of the State fiscal year in proportion to the number of residents of each municipality as determined pursuant to the most recent federal decennial census. The payment of Legislative Initiative Municipal Block Grant Program aid shall be used solely and exclusively by each municipality for the purpose of reducing the amount the municipality is required to raise by local property tax levy for municipal purposes. If the amount of the payment exceeds the amount required to be raised by local property tax levy for municipal purposes, the balance of the payment shall be used to reduce the amount the municipality is required to collect for county purposes, notwithstanding the provisions of this or any other law to the contrary. The Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs shall certify annually that each municipality has complied with the requirements set forth herein.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2066.

Senate Bill No. 2066 makes the Legislative Initiative Municipal Block Grant Program enacted as part of the appropriations act for the 1995 fiscal year a permanent program of State block grant aid to municipalities. The bill requires that the Legislature annually appropriate an amount of not less than \$33 million, the amount appropriated by the 1995 appropriations act, to the program. The funds are distributed to municipalities based on their population, as measured by the most recent federal decennial census. The funds must be used for property tax reduction.

As reported, this bill is identical to the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill Nos. 2963 and 2758 of 1995.

FISCAL IMPACT

The bill requires the Legislature to annually appropriate not less than \$33 million to municipalities, distributed on the basis of population, for property tax reduction.
