# [FIRST REPRINT] ASSEMBLY, No. 2440

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### **INTRODUCED JANUARY 10, 1995**

By Assemblywoman VANDERVALK, Assemblyman Zisa, Assemblywoman Weinberg, Assemblymen DiGaetano, Russo, Felice, Assemblywoman Heck and Assemblyman Roma

AN ACT creating the Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission and supplementing Title 13 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. The Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission, a body corporate and politic with corporate succession, is created in the Division of Parks and Forestry of the Department of Environmental Protection. The commission is an instrumentality exercising public and essential governmental functions. Exercise by the commission of the powers conferred by this act is deemed to be an essential governmental function of the State.
- The commission shall consist of the following nine members: the Director of the <sup>1</sup>[Divisions] Division <sup>1</sup> of Parks and Forestry or the director's designee; one representative each from the County of Bergen, the Blauvelt-Demarest Foundation, River Edge Borough, and New Milford Borough; and two representatives each from the Bergen County Historical Society and Teaneck Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. The members of the commission shall elect annually a chairman and vice-chairman from their number, and a secretary and treasurer who need not be members of the commission. The same person may be elected to serve both as secretary and treasurer. The chairman of the commission shall be its presiding officer and the vice-chairman shall serve as chairman in the absence of the chairman. The commission shall organize and adopt procedures for the conduct of its business. Five members of the commission shall constitute a quorum and the concurrence of five members of the commission shall be necessary to validate all acts of the commission.
- 2. a. The Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission shall coordinate and implement federal, State, county, municipal, and private development policies and other activities relating to the historic preservation and recreational use of the property under the commission's jurisdiction.
- b. The commission has jurisdiction over the area in Bergen County known as New Bridge Landing, in the Borough of River Edge, between Main Street and Hackensack Avenue and extending into Teaneck Township and the Borough of New Milford, the area being situated along the banks of the Hackensack River.
- 3. The Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission <sup>1</sup>[has the power] shall have the following powers<sup>1</sup>:

EXPLANATION--Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

- a. To sue and be sued in its own name, but the members of the commission shall be held harmless for acts performed in good faith;
  - b. To adopt a seal and alter the same at <sup>1</sup>its<sup>1</sup> pleasure;

- c. To adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and the conduct of its business;
- d. To maintain an office or offices at such place or places within the State as it may designate;
- e. To appoint officers, who need not be members of the commission, in addition to a secretary and a treasurer, as the commission deems advisable, and to employ other employees and agents as may be necessary or desirable in its judgment, to fix their compensation, and to promote and discharge officers, employees and agents all without regard to the provisions of Title 11A, Civil Service, of the New Jersey Statutes;
- f. To acquire in the name of the commission, hold and dispose of <sup>1</sup>real and <sup>1</sup> personal property <sup>1</sup>[and lands]<sup>1</sup> in the exercise of its powers and the performance of its duties under this act;
- g. To make, enter into, and perform all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance of its duties and the execution of its powers under this act;
- h. To request the State <sup>1</sup>[Historical] <u>Historic</u><sup>1</sup> Preservation Officer to place the lands and buildings under the commission's jurisdiction on the National Register of Historic Places pursuant to the "National Historic Preservation Act <sup>1</sup>[of 1966]<sup>1</sup>," Pub.L.89-665 <sup>1</sup>(16 U.S.C.§470 et al.)<sup>1</sup>, as amended <sup>1</sup>and supplemented by the "National Historic Preservation Act Amendments of 1980," Pub.L.96-515 <sup>1</sup>[(16 U.S.C.§470 et seq.)], and the "National Historic Preservation Act Amendments of 1992," Pub.L.102-575, or any future amendments or supplements thereto <sup>1</sup>;
- i. To acquire and hold real and personal property by gift, purchase, devise, bequest, or by other means and to preserve and administer these properties;
- j. To conduct public information and education programs relating to the historic nature of the property under the commission's jurisdiction;
- k. To apply to the Department of Environmental Protection for <sup>1</sup>[a grant] grants<sup>1</sup> from the <sup>1</sup>["Green Trust Fund," created pursuant to section 16 of the "New Jersey Green Acres Bond Act of 1983," P.L.1983, c.354] <u>Green Acres or historic preservation bond programs or other appropriate funding sources<sup>1</sup>, for the purpose of acquisitions pursuant to subsection f. of this section <sup>1</sup>or for the purposes of development, preservation, or maintenance of those acquired properties<sup>1</sup>; and</u>
- l. To do all acts and things necessary or convenient to carry out the powers expressly granted in this act  $^{1}[;]_{\underline{.}}^{1}$
- 4. The Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission has the specific power to contract for the construction, reconstruction, restoration, or maintenance of all lands, buildings, landscaping, bridges, docks, and facilities under its jurisdiction including the maintenance, restoration, and reconstruction of the Steuben House, the Demarest House, the Campbell-Christie House, the Westervelt-Thomas Barn and the construction and operation of a

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visitor center, library, mill site, curator's residence, parking area, and other appropriate structures.

5. This act shall take effect immediately.

Creates Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission.

- c. To adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and the conduct of its business;
- d. To maintain an office or offices at such place or places within the State as it may designate;
- e. - i. To acquire and hold real and personal property by gift, purchase, devise, bequest, or by other means and to preserve and administer these properties;
- j. To conduct public information and education programs relating to the historic nature of the property under the commission's jurisdiction;
- k. To apply to the Department of Environmental Protection for a grant from the "Green Trust Fund," created pursuant to section 16 of the "New Jersey Green Acres Bond Act of 1983," P.L.1983, c.354, for the purpose of acquisitions pursuant to subsection f. of this section; and
- l. To do all acts and things necessary or convenient to carry out the powers expressly granted in this act;
- 4. #### STATEMENT

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The Historic New Bridge Landing Site in Bergen County is associated culturally and historically with the early settlement of the nation and the State. The site played a key role in the Continental Army's retreat from Fort Lee, which inspired Thomas Paine to observe: "These are the times that try men's souls." The site includes numerous structures of historical importance and interest to the general public, including the Steuben House, the Westervelt-Thomas Barn, the Demarest House and the Campbell-Christie House foundations. These structures, foundations and other remains have been identified as dating from the Revolutionary War period and earlier, spanning over 400 years of American cultural and historical development.

New Bridge Landing is the historic community that surrounds the narrows of the Hackensack River and serves as the hinge between the northern and southern valleys of the Hackensack River. The river and surrounding wetlands are of unique environmental and scenic beauty. The site is significant from pre-historic times, through the earliest European settlement, as a Revolutionary War battlefield, as a commercial center during the 19th century, and as a recreation and arts center in the early 20th century. This broad perspective spanning over 400 years provides an opportunity for valuable research and educational programs. Coupled with living history activities, historic reenactments, environmental interpretation, and recreation on the river, Historic New Bridge Landing provides a unique experience for tourists and residents.

Because the land and the various structures are owned and operated by various bodies and organizations, an entity is needed to coordinate the activities of these bodies in order to recreate this whole area as a unified historic-cultural-educational park.

This bill creates the Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission to act as the coordinating entity. The commission may contract for the preservation of the current buildings and lands as well as construct and operate a visitor center, curator's residence and library. It is believed that once the New Bridge Landing site has been properly restored, it will be a premier historic, cultural, educational and recreational facility, not only for local and State residents, but for visitors from other states as well.

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Creates Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission.

The Assembly Environment and Energy Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 2440 with committee amendments.

This bill creates the nine-member Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission within the Division of Parks and Forestry in the Department of Environmental Protection to act as the coordinating entity for various bodies and organizations that own and operate properties and structures in the historic community of New Bridge Landing in Bergen County, for the purpose of re-creating the area as a unified historic-cultural-educational park. Under the bill, the commission may also contract for the preservation of the current buildings and lands as well as construct and operate a visitor center, library, mill site, curator's residence, parking area, and other appropriate structures.

The Historic New Bridge Landing Site is associated culturally and historically with the early settlement of the nation and the State. The site includes numerous structures of historical importance and interest to the general public, including the Steuben House, the Westervelt-Thomas Barn, the Demarest House and the Campbell-Christie House foundations. New Bridge Landing is the historic community that surrounds the narrows of the Hackensack River and serves as the hinge between the northern and southern valleys of the Hackensack River. The river and surrounding wetlands are of unique environmental and scenic beauty. The site is significant from pre-historic times, through the earliest European settlement, as a Revolutionary War battlefield, as a commercial center during the 19th century, and as a recreation and arts center in the early 20th century.

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the commission could apply for grants from the Green Acres or historic preservation bond programs or other appropriate funding sources to fund acquisitions and development, preservation, or maintenance activities. The committee also made technical and other clarifying amendments to the bill.
