BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 7 of P.L.1994, c.48 (C.18A:3B-7) is amended to read as follows:
- There is established a body corporate and politic, with 8 corporate succession, to be known as the "New Jersey 9 Presidents' Council." Each president of a public institution of 10 higher education in the State and of an independent institution 11 which receives direct State aid ³[and other institutions in the 12 State ²[, exclusive of those institutions dedicated primarily to the 13 preparation or training of ministers, priests, rabbis, or other 14 professional persons in the field of religion, l2 that are licensed by 15 the State of New Jersey to grant degrees therein but which do 16 not receive direct State aid]3 shall be a member of the council 17 and shall serve ex officio. ³The presidents of the two proprietary 18 schools which enroll the largest numbers of pupils in State 19 licensed degree programs shall also serve as members of the 20 council, ex officio, to represent the interests of all such schools. 21 The presidents of the two institutions primarily involved in the 22 23 preparation of professional persons in the field of religion which enroll the largest number of pupils in State licensed degree 24 programs shall also serve as members of the council, ex officio, 25

2. Section 8 of P.L.1994, c.48 (C.18A:3B-8) is amended to read as follows:

to represent the interests of all such schools.³

- 8. The council shall have the responsibility, consistent with State and federal law, to:
- a. provide public information and research on higher education issues:
- b. review and make recommendations to the commission concerning proposals for new programs that exceed the programmatic mission of an institution or that change the programmatic mission of an institution;
- c. review and comment on proposals for new programs that demand significant added resources or raise significant issues of duplication but do not exceed the programmatic mission of the institution or require a change in the programmatic mission. If the council determines that a proposed new program is unduly

expensive or unduly duplicative, the council shall refer that proposal to the commission for review; however, unless the commission disapproves of that program within 60 days of its referral, the program shall be deemed approved;

- d. encourage the formation of regional or other alliances among institutions including interinstitutional transfers, program articulation, cooperative programs and shared resources and develop criteria for "full faith and credit" transfer agreements between county colleges and other institutions of higher education. The council shall also keep institutions apprised of the discontinuance of programs at other institutions and each president shall notify the council of any such action;
- e. advise and assist the commission in developing and updating a plan for higher education in the State including, but not limited to, the establishment of new institutions, closure of existing institutions and consolidation of institutions;
- f. provide policy recommendations on Statewide higher education issues;
- g. recommend to the Governor, Legislature and commission on policy and overall levels of funding for student aid programs necessary to ensure accessibility to higher education;
- h. transmit to the Governor, Legislature and commission a general budget policy statement regarding overall State funding levels;
- i. upon referral from the commission pursuant to this act provide recommendations concerning institutional licensure and university status; $^1[and]^1$ and
- j. appoint subcommittees consisting of the presidents of the institutions of the various higher education sectors to decide matters, within the authority of the council. The presidents of the independent institutions shall develop a unified request for State support under chapter 72B of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes. The presidents of the county college sector shall develop a unified request for State support under chapter 64A of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes [; and
- k. consult with other institutions of higher education which do not receive direct State aid when actions of the council directly affect such institutions] ${}^{2}[^{1}]$; and

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 2392 (Second Reprint)

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning Assembly Bill No. 2392 (Second Reprint) with my recommendations for reconsideration.

A. Summary of Bill

The purpose of this bill is to add the presidents of non-traditional institutions of higher education to the New Jersey Presidents' Council (Council). Currently, membership on the Council is limited to institutions which receive direct State support since the goal of the Council is to bring together presidents of institutions with similar missions to advance common goals. Non-traditional schools such as proprietary schools and schools which train professional persons in the field of religion do not largely share the commonality of interests which other colleges and universities share. The inclusion of these non-traditional schools would significantly expand the size of the Council and therefore negatively impact on the ability of member institutions to exchange information, consult and reach consensus on issues of mutual concern.

B. Recommended Action

However, these non-traditional institutions should have a right to voice their concerns on issues being addressed by the Council which directly impact on them. My proposed conditional veto would give the presidents of the two proprietary schools and the two schools of religious instruction with the largest number of students in degree programs membership on the Council in order to represent the interests of all such schools. The addition of four presidents will not significantly alter the character of the Council while

providing these non-traditional schools with a voice in matters which concern them.

Therefore, I herewith return Assembly Bill No. 2392 (Second Reprint) and recommend that it be amended as follows:

Page 1, Section 1, Lines 12-17:

Delete from "and other institutions" through "but which do not receive direct State aid"

Page 1, Section 1, Line 18:

After "ex officio." insert "The presidents of the two proprietary schools which enroll the largest numbers of pupils in State licensed degree programs shall also serve as members of the council, ex officio, to represent the interests of all such schools. The presidents of the institutions primarily involved in the preparation of professional persons in the field of religion which enroll the largest number of pupils in State licensed degree programs shall also serve as of members the council. ex officio, to represent the interests of all such schools."

As amended by committee, this bill would make the presidents of private institutions of higher education which are licensed by the State to award degrees, but which do not receive direct State aid, members of the New Jersey Presidents' Council. At the present time, three institutions would qualify for membership under the bill: the DeVry Technical Institute; Katherine Gibbs; and, the Berkley School.

The committee amended the bill to restore language requiring the Presidents' Council to consult with other institutions of higher education which do not receive direct State aid when the council's actions directly affect the institutions.

As amended by committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1561 (1R).
