- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1980, c.104 (C.32:14-1.1) is amended to read as follows:

STATEMENT

This bill would make various amendments to the compact of June 2, 1937 between the states of New Jersey and New York

concerning Palisades Interstate Park and the Palisades Interstate Park Commission. It would also amend the implementing law in New Jersey for that compact. Concurrence or enactment of similar provisions by the State of New York to some of the proposed amendments to the compact and implementing law would be required.

These amendments would:

- (1) clarify and expand the authority of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission to acquire and manage park lands in northern New Jersey and southern New York;
- (2) provide that such lands could be acquired not only for the usual park purposes but also for the purposes of protecting, maintaining, and enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies;
- (3) clarify that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission may seek, receive, and retain financial or other aid or assistance from the federal government or any state, local, or other governmental entity or authority, which aid or assistance may be used in the commission's discretion in either state for any park purpose except as may be specifically designated or restricted by law or by the terms of any such aid or assistance;
- (4) provide that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, in consultation with the appropriate governmental agencies of the State of New York as designated by that state, may, from time to time, select and locate such lands lying within Rockland and Orange counties in the State of New York, including the area known as Sterling Forest, as may, in the opinion of the commission in consultation with those agencies, be proper and necessary to be reserved for the purpose of establishing a park and thereby preserving the scenic beauty of those areas, or for other recreation and conservation purposes, including protecting, maintaining, and enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies;
- (5) provide that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, in consultation with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, may also, from time to time, select and locate such lands lying within the Highlands or Skylands areas of Bergen, Hunterdon, Morris, Passaic, Somerset, Sussex, or Warren counties in the State of New Jersey, as may, in the opinion of the commission in consultation with the department, be proper and necessary to be reserved for the purpose of establishing a park and thereby preserving the scenic beauty of those areas, or for other recreation and conservation purposes, including protecting, maintaining, and enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies; and
- (6) make various amendments for technical reasons or for purposes of consistency.

The Assembly Environment and Energy Committee favorably reports an Assembly committee substitute for Assembly Bill No. 623.

This committee substitute generally would clarify and expand the authority and jurisdiction of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission to acquire and manage park lands in northern New Jersey, and provide that such lands could be acquired not only for the usual park purposes but also for the purposes of protecting, maintaining, or enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies.

Specifically, the committee substitute would:

- (1) provide that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, in consultation with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, may, from time to time, select and locate such lands lying within the Highlands or Skylands areas of Bergen, Hunterdon, Morris, Passaic, Somerset, Sussex, or Warren counties in the State of New Jersey, as may, in the opinion of the commission in consultation with the department, be proper and necessary to be reserved for the purpose of establishing a park and thereby preserving the scenic beauty of those areas, or for other recreation and conservation purposes, or for the purposes of protecting, maintaining, or enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies;
- (2) clarify that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission may seek, receive, and retain financial or other aid or assistance from the federal government or any state, local, or other governmental entity or authority, which aid or assistance may be used in the commission's discretion in the State of New Jersey for any park purpose except as may be specifically designated or restricted by law or by the terms of any such aid or assistance; and
- (3) make various amendments for technical reasons or for purposes of consistency.

The Senate Environment Committee favorably releases Assembly Bill No. 623 (ACS)(1R) with committee amendments.

The Assembly bill, as amended by committee, would expand the authority and jurisdiction of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission to acquire and manage park lands in northern New Jersey, and provide that such lands could be acquired not only for the usual park purposes but also for the purposes of protecting, maintaining, or enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies.

Specifically, the bill would:

- (1) provide that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission may, in consultation with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and in cooperation with the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission, select, locate, acquire, and maintain, such lands lying within the Highlands or Skylands areas of Bergen, Hunterdon, Morris, Passaic, Somerset, or Warren counties in the State of New Jersey, including those areas lying within the North Jersey Water Supply District. These lands may be acquired for the purpose of establishing a park and thereby preserving the scenic beauty of those areas, for other recreation and conservation or historic preservation purposes, or for the purposes of protecting, maintaining, or enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies as well as conserving watershed lands;
- (2) clarify that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission may seek, receive, and retain financial or other aid or assistance from the federal government or any state, local, or other governmental entity or authority, which aid or assistance may be used in the commission's discretion in the State of New Jersey for any park purpose except as may be specifically designated or restricted by law or by the terms of any such aid or assistance; and
- (3) provide that decisions of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission relating to the protection of water supplies will be made in cooperation with the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission.

The bill also provides that the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission shall have sole authority in identifying any surplus water within the lands administered by the Palisades Interstate Park Commission.

The committee amended the bill to remove Sussex county as an area in which the commission may locate and acquire lands; to specifically include hunting and fishing among the recreational activities allowed on the lands; and to eliminate the commission's powers of eminent domain in New Jersey, except for those existing eminent domain powers of the commission relating to the location, construction, maintenance, and operation of the Henry Hudson Drive and the Palisades Interstate Parkway.



Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 623 (Second Reprint)

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14, of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 623 (Second Reprint) with my recommendations for reconsideration.

A. Summary of Bill

This bill clarifies and expands the authority and jurisdiction of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission to acquire and manage park land in northern New Jersey. The bill provides that such lands may be acquired not only for preserving scenic beauty and promoting recreation and historic preservation but also for the purpose of protecting, maintaining, or enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies. In consultation with the Department of Environmental Protection and the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission, the Palisades Interstate Park Commission is empowered, in this bill, to identify and require such lands. The North Jersey District Water Supply Commission is granted sole authority, however, to determine which water is surplus and to approve or disapprove the sale of surplus water.

B. Recommended Action

I agree entirely that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission should play a vital role in managing park land in northern New Jersey and that environmental considerations should be considered as important as scenic beauty, recreation, and historic preservation in acquiring park lands. By reposing "sole authority" in a regional water supply commission to identify surplus water and to approve and disapprove the sale of surplus water, however, the bill has potentially undermined the authority

of the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to the "Water Supply Management Act," P.L. 1981, c.262 (C.58:1A-2 et seq.), to oversee water policy for the State as a whole. To address this conflict, I am recommending that the bill be amended to reassert the authority of the Department of Environmental Protection and to clarify the role of the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission.

Accordingly, I am returning Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 623 (Second Reprint) and recommend that it be amended as follows:

Page 3. Section 3. Line 2:

Delete "The North Jersey District"

Page 3, Section 3, Lines 3-6:

Delete in their entirety and insert "In relation to lands acquired by the Interstate Park (Palisades Commission within the region served by the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission, the North Jersey District Water Commission Supply determine which waters are surplus, and no surplus waters or rights thereto shall sold, leased, or used without review and comment by North Jersey District Water Supply Commission. Nothing in this section shall be limit construed the to authority of the Department of Environmental Protection to manage water supplies pursuant "Water Supply to the Management Act," P.L. 1981, c.262 (C.58:1A-1 et seq.)."

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. The preamble of the compact of June 2, 1937 with the State of New York, relating to Palisades Interstate Park and the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, which is compiled at R.S.32:17-2, is amended to read as follows:

32:17-2. Preamble; consideration of agreement

Whereas, heretofore the states of New York and New Jersey have co-operated in the establishment and maintenance of an interstate park along the front of the Palisades in said states and in the mountainous lands in Rockland and Orange counties in the state of New York and in the state of New Jersey, by respectively enacting legislation creating in each state a body politic by the name and style of "commissioners of the Palisades Interstate park", with power to acquire lands for such park, and improve and manage the same, and by respectively appointing, in practically all cases, the same persons as members of each of such state bodies politic; and

Whereas, it is confidently believed that the creation, by interstate compact, of a joint corporate municipal instrumentality to hold and manage such interstate park will provide greater flexibility and harmony in the management of the park,

Now, therefore, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual advantages and benefits, including protecting, maintaining, and enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies, to accrue to the peoples of the states of New York and New Jersey from this compact and in consideration of the mutual covenants of the parties hereto herein contained, the sovereign state of New York and the sovereign state of New Jersey do hereby agree as follows:

- 2. Article V of the compact of June 2, 1937 with the State of New York, relating to Palisades Interstate Park and the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, which is compiled at R.S.32:17-7, is amended to read as follows:
- 32:17-7. Gifts, bequests or devises; use of revenue and income; reports and estimates

EXPLANATION--Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

ARTICLE V.

- 1. All money, securities and other property, real and personal, heretofore received by either of the state boards or hereafter received by the commission by way of gift, bequest or devise, may be retained by the commission and, except in so far as the purpose or manner of using the same is otherwise specifically designated or restricted by the terms of any such gift, bequest or devise, may be used in the commission's discretion in either state for any park purpose; and the commission may likewise retain and use all revenue and income arising solely from such money, securities and other property so received by way of gift, bequest or devise or from facilities or operations financed solely by funds so received. In the case of revenue and income arising partly from specific property received by way of gift, bequest or devise or from specific facilities or operations financed partly by funds so received, the commission may likewise retain and use such proportion of such revenue and income as the amount of gifts, bequests or devises, or the proceeds thereof, invested in each such property, facility or operation, bears to the total amount invested therein. The legislature of either state may from time to time by law specifically made applicable to the commission prescribe other terms and conditions upon which or purposes for which any gifts, bequests or devises thereafter made of money, securities or other property may be accepted for use in such state or used in such state or prescribe a different manner of administering gifts, bequests or devises thereafter made in such state and the disposition of all revenues or income arising therefrom.
- 2. Either state may from time to time by law require the commission to render to any designated official or official body of such state such reports and such estimates of revenues and expenditures as may be specified in such law.
- 3. The commission may seek, receive, and retain financial or other aid or assistance from the federal government or any state, local, or other governmental entity or authority, which aid or assistance may be used in the commission's discretion in either state for any park purpose except as may be specifically designated or restricted by law or by the terms of any such aid or assistance.

- 3. Section 1 of P.L.1980, c.104 (C.32:14-1.1) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. The Legislature finds and declares that the Palisades Interstate Park constitutes a natural and historic resource of immeasurable value; that concern for the preservation of this resource resulted in the enactment, in 1937, of an interstate compact between New Jersey and New York; that from time to time it may benefit either or both of the states of New Jersey and New York to utilize the Palisades Interstate Park Commission as the administering agency for parkland that may be acquired in southern New York or northern New Jersey; that this compact established the Palisades Interstate Park Commission as a separate agency charged with the responsibility of maintaining this interstate park; that the separation of this commission from

all other agencies of State government has tended to impede. rather than facilitate, the discharging of this responsibility; and that, in order to insure the realization of the purpose of the interstate compact, it is necessary to alter the powers, functions and duties of the commission, all as hereinafter provided.

- 4. Section 5 of P.L.1980, c.104 (C.32:14-1.5) is amended to read as follows:
- 5. a. Commission projects for the acquisition or development of land for recreation and conservation purposes, including protecting, maintaining, and enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies, shall be considered State projects for the purposes of eligibility for funding pursuant to the provisions of the "New Jersey Green Acres Bond Act of 1961" (P.L.1961, c.46), the "New Jersey Green Acres Bond Act of 1971" (P.L.1971. "New Jersey Green Acres and Recreation the Opportunities Bond Act of 1974" [(P.L.1974, c. 108)] (P.L.1974, c.102) , the "New Jersey Green Acres Bond Act of 1978" (P.L.1978, c. 118), as well as any other Green Acres Bond Act adopted subsequent to the effective date of [this amendatory and supplementary act] P.L.1980, c.104 (C.32:14-1.1 et al.) . Requests by the commission for funding shall be submitted to the department and reviewed in the same manner as similar requests from other State departments, divisions, instrumentalities thereof.
- b. The commission shall coordinate its planning for the acquisition, development and use of lands for recreation and conservation purposes with planning conducted by the department for the preparation and revision of (1) the Comprehensive Master Plan, pursuant to P.L.1977, c.348 (C.13:8A-55); and (2) the New Jersey Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan, pursuant to the "Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965" (P.L.94-422).

- 5. R.S.32:14-5 is amended to read as follows:
- 32:14-5. Lands included in and purpose of park; authority to acquire

Palisades Interstate Park Commission shall, from time to time, select and locate such lands lying between the top or steep edge of the Palisades or the crest of the slope in places where the steep Palisade rocks are absent and the high-water line of the Hudson river, from the New York State line on the north, to a line beginning at the intersection of the southern line of the old Fort Lee dock or landing with the high-water line of the Hudson river and running thence in a westerly direction and at right angles to said high-water line of the Hudson river to the east side of the river road running from Edgewater to Fort Lee, in Bergen county, on the south, and such lands or rights in lands belonging to persons other than the State, as may lie between the exterior bulkhead line established in the Hudson river and the high-water line of the Hudson river, as may, in the opinion of the commission, be proper and necessary to be reserved for the purpose of establishing a park and thereby preserving the scenic beauty of the Palisades.

The commission:

a. in consultation with the appropriate governmental agencies of the State of New York as designated by that state, may also, from time to time, select and locate such lands lying within Rockland and Orange counties in the State of New York, including the area known as Sterling Forest, as may, in the opinion of the commission in consultation with those agencies, be proper and necessary to be reserved for the purpose of establishing a park and thereby preserving the scenic beauty of those areas, or for other recreation and conservation purposes, including protecting, maintaining, and enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies; and

b. in consultation with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, may also, from time to time, select and locate such lands lying within the Highlands or Skylands areas of Bergen, Hunterdon, Morris, Passaic, Somerset, Sussex, or Warren counties in the State of New Jersey, as may, in the opinion of the commission in consultation with the department, be proper and necessary to be reserved for the purpose of establishing a park and thereby preserving the scenic beauty of those areas, or for other recreation and conservation purposes, including protecting, maintaining, and enhancing the quality and quantity of water supplies.

6. R.S.32:14-7 is amended to read as follows:

32:14-7. Gifts, contributions or bequests; power to purchase, sell or lease

Palisades Interstate Park Commission shall have power to receive by gift, contribution or bequest, moneys, stocks, bonds, securities or other property, and own, hold, invest or otherwise use the same. The commission shall have power to purchase or otherwise acquire personal property and to hold the same. The commission shall have power to sell all personal property, supplies, chattels, material, profits a prendre and the right to surplus waters which it decides to be not necessary or desirable for the uses and purposes of the park, and to lease, charter, license or privilege the use, for park or other purposes, of all personal property.

The commission may seek, receive, and retain financial or other aid or assistance from the federal government or any state, local, or other governmental entity or authority, which aid or assistance may be used in the commission's discretion in either state for any park purpose except as may be specifically designated or restricted by law or by the terms of any such aid or assistance.

Before any proceedings shall be had or taken for acquiring by condemnation the title to any of the lands selected and located under [section 32:14-5 of this Title] R.S.32:14-5, Palisades Interstate Park Commission shall cause to be made, by such engineer and surveyor as it shall select, a map of the parcel or parcels of lands and rights in lands which it shall determine and
