AN ACT concerning the use of certain health care facilities by licensed psychologists and amending P.L.1983, c.28.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1983, c.28 (C.26:2H-12.1) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. 1a.1 Any health care facility licensed pursuant to P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.), which provides medical or surgical care, shall provide for the use of the facility by, and appropriate privileges for, duly licensed podiatrists and psychologists. Use of the facility and privileges of a podiatrist or psychologist shall be subject to nondiscriminatory rules and regulations governing such use or privileges established by the governing body of the facility for persons licensed as physicians and surgeons pursuant to R.S.45:9-6 and dentists pursuant to R.S.45:6-19.
- ¹b. Nothing in this act shall be construed to require a hospital to grant admitting privileges to a psychologist or to permit the exercise of those privileges granted by the hospital without appropriate collaboration with the attending physician of the patient who is receiving or will receive care or treatment from the psychologist.¹

STATEMENT

 This bill amends P.L.1983, c.28 (C.26:2H-12.1) to provide that a State licensed, practicing psychologist may visit a patient of his who is hospitalized for a medical or surgical reason to maintain continuity of care. The visit may be for therapeutic purposes if the patient's attending physician so approves and the visit is in accordance with the medical staff bylaws and policies of the governing body of the hospital.

The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 698 (1R).

This bill amends P.L.1983, c.28 (C.26:2H-12.1) to provide that any licensed health care facility which provides medical or surgical care, shall provide for the use of the facility by, and appropriate privileges for, duly licensed psychologists. Use of the facility and privileges of a psychologist shall be subject to nondiscriminatory rules and regulations governing such use or privileges established by the governing body of the facility for physicians and dentists. The bill provides, however, that nothing in this bill shall be construed to require a hospital to grant admitting privileges to a psychologist or to permit the exercise of those privileges granted by the hospital without appropriate collaboration with the attending physician of the patient who is receiving or will receive care or treatment from the psychologist.
