INTRODUCED MARCH 3, 1994

By Senator HAINES

AN ACT concerning domestic livestock and animal cruelty and welfare laws, amending R.S.4:22-16, supplementing chapter 22 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, and making an appropriation.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. (New section) a. The State Board of Agriculture and the Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station and within six months of the date of enactment of this act, shall develop and adopt, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.): (1) standards for the humane raising, keeping, care, treatment, marketing, and sale of domestic livestock; and (2) rules and regulations governing the enforcement of those standards.
 - b. Notwithstanding any provision in this title to the contrary:
- (1) there shall exist a presumption that the raising, keeping, care, treatment, marketing, and sale of domestic livestock in accordance with the standards developed and adopted therefor pursuant to subsection at of this section shall not constitute a violation of any provision of this title involving alleged cruelty to, or inhumane care or treatment of, domestic livestock;
- (2) no person may be cited or arrested for a first offense ¹involving a¹ minor or incidental violation, as defined by rules and regulations adopted pursuant to subsection a. of this section, of any provision of this title involving alleged cruelty to, or inhumane care or treatment of, domestic livestock, unless that person has first been issued a written warning.
- c. For the purposes of this act. 'domestic livestock" means cattle, horses, donkeys, swine, sheep, goats, rabbits, poultry, fowl, and any other domesticated arounal deemed by the State Board of Agriculture and the Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station, to be domestic livestock for such purposes, according to rules and regulations adopted by the department ¹and the board ¹ pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act."
 - 2. R.S.4:22-16 is amended to read as follows:
- 4:22-16. Nothing contained in this article shall be construed to prohibit or interfere with:
- a. Properly conducted scientific experiments performed under the authority of the [State] Department of Health or the United States

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Department of Agriculture. [That department] Those departments may authorize the conduct of such experiments or investigations by agricultural stations and schools maintained by the State or federal government, or by medical societies, universities, colleges and [philanthropic] institutions incorporated or authorized to do business in this State and having among their corporate purposes investigation into the causes, nature, prevention and cure of diseases in men and animals; and may for cause revoke such authority;

- b. The killing or disposing of an animal or creature by virtue of the order of a constituted authority of the State;
- c. The shooting or taking of game or game fish in such manner and at such times as is allowed or provided by the laws of this State;
- d. The training or engaging of a dog to accomplish a task or participate in an activity or exhibition designed to develop the physical or mental characteristics of that dog. These activities shall be carried out in accordance with the practices, guidelines or rules established by an organization founded for the purpose of promoting and enhancing working dog activities or exhibitions; in a manner which does not adversely affect the health or safety of the dog; and may include avalanche warning, guide work, obedience work, carting, dispatching, freight racing, packing, sled dog racing, sledding, tracking, and weight pull demonstrations;
- e. The raising, keeping, care, treatment, marketing, and sale of domestic livestock in accordance with the standards developed and adopted therefor pursuant to subsection a. of section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (now before the Legislature as this bill). (cf: P.L.1985, c.433, s.1)
- 3. (New section) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture the sum of ¹[\$95,000] \$50,000¹ to further the purposes and activities of the Division of Animal Health in the department with respect to doniestic livestock, providing training for personnel enforcing this act, and employing necessary personnel to administer this act.
 - 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMEN F

It is the intent of this bill that it should be construed to allow the New Jersey Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, and its district (county) societies, in cooperation with the Department of Agriculture, to continue in the SPCA's statutory capacity to enforce the State's animal cruelty laws.

The Senate Senior Citizens, Veterans Affairs and Agriculture Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 713 with committee amendments.

This bill would provide that the State Board of Agriculture and the Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station and within six months of the date of enactment of the bill, shall develop and adopt: (1) standards for the humane raising keeping, care, treatment, marketing, and sale of domestic livestock; and (2) rules and regulations governing the enforcement of those standards.

The bill would also provide that:

- (1) there shall exist a presumption that the raising, keeping, care, treatment, marketing, and sale of domestic livestock in accordance with the standards developed and adopted therefor pursuant to the bill shall not constitute a violation of the animal cruelty and welfare laws of the State;
- (2) no person may be cited or arrested for a first offense minor or incidental violation, as defined by rule or regulation adopted pursuant to the bill, of the State's animal cruelty laws involving alleged cruelty to, or inhumane care or treatment of, domestic livestock, unless that person has first been issued a written warning.

This bill makes a general appropriation of \$95,000 from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture for the use of the Division of Animal Health in connection with carrying out the provisions and purposes of this bill. The bill also provides that the State's animal cruelty laws shall not be construed to prohibit or interfere with properly conducted scientific experiments performed under the authority of the Department of Health of the United States Department of Agriculture, and allows any institutions, not just those that are philanthropic, that are incorporated or authorized to do business in the State for certain purposes set forth in the law to be among those entities that may be authorized to conduct experiments or investigations without the concern of prohibition or interference due to enforcement of the State's animal cruelty laws.

The committee amended the bill to clarify that no person may be cited or arrested for a first offense involving a minor or incidental violation unless that person has first been issued a written warning and to reduce the appropriation from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture for carrying out the provisions of the bill from \$95,000 to \$50,000.

Senate Bill No. 713 (First Reprint)

To the Senate:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 15 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am appending to Senate Bill No. 713 (First Reprint) at the time of signing it my statement of the items, or parts thereof, to which I object so that each item, or part thereof, so objected to shall not take effect.

This bill would provide for an appropriation of \$50,000 from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture for the use of the Division of Animal Health in connection with the development and adoption of standards for the humane raising, keeping, care, treatment, marketing and sale of domestic livestock and the promulgation of rules and regulations governing the enforcement of those standards. Although I recognize the merit of this bill and its goal of setting standards for humane treatment of domestic livestock, I believe that this appropriation should be considered in the overall context of the State Budget.

Accordingly, I herewith append the following statement of objections to the sums, or parts thereof, appropriated by this bill.

Page 2, Section 3, Lines 30-35: After "3." delete in entirety
Page 2, Section 4, Line 36: Delete "4."
