13 lottery prize in excess of [\$2,500] ¹[\$600] \$1,000¹.

The Assembly Senior Citizens and Social Services Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 1864 (1R).

This bill amends the law which allows withholding of lottery prizes to satisfy child support arrearages or public assistance overpayments by lowering the threshold at which data exchange between appropriate agencies begins from \$2,500 to \$1,000. It is the sponsor's intent that prizes in excess of \$1,000 shall be offset by satisfying child support arrearages or public assistance overpayments.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 230 which was amended and released by this committee on this date.

The Senate Women's Issues, Children and Family Services Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 1864 with committee amendments.

As amended, the bill amends the law which allows withholding of lottery prizes to satisfy child support arrearages or public assistance overpayments by lowering the threshold at which data exchange between appropriate agencies begins from \$2,500 to \$1,000. It is the sponsor's intent that prizes in excess of \$1,000 shall be offset by satisfying child support arrearages or public assistance overpayments.

The committee amended the bill to increase the threshold at which data exchange between appropriate agencies begins from \$600 to \$1,000.
