Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph b. of subsection 7 8 (2) of section 9 of P.L.1944, c.255 (C.43:16A-9) to the contrary, a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System with at 9 least 20 years of creditable service who is certified as terminally 10 ill and who, within one month of that certification, becomes 11 incapable mentally or physically of applying for ordinary 12 13 disability retirement before death shall be deemed to be retired on the date of the member's death if¹, on or before the 60th day 14 following that date of death or the effective date of this act, 15 whichever is later,¹ the surviving beneficiary makes that request 16 in writing to the board. Upon approval by the board, the request 17 shall become irrevocable, and the survivors of the member shall 18 receive all benefits due to survivors of an ordinary disability 19 20 retiree of the retirement system. This act shall take effect immediately and shall be 21 2. 22 retroactive to April 1, 1994. 23 24 25 26 Provides that certain PFRS members may be declared retirees at 27 28 time of death.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2738 [1R].

Assembly Bill No. 2738 [1R] provides that a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) with at least 20 years of creditable service who is certified as terminally ill and who, within one month of that certification, becomes incapable mentally or physically of applying for ordinary disability retirement before death shall be deemed to be retired on the date of the member's death if the surviving beneficiary makes that request in writing to the PFRS board of trustees. Upon approval by the board, the request shall become irrevocable, and the survivors of the member shall receive all benefits due to survivors of an ordinary disability retiree of the retirement system.

Survivor benefits under PFRS with respect to non-service connected death consist of the return of the member's contributions plus a lump sum equal to 3 1/2 times the member's compensation in the last year of creditable service.

Survivor benefits under PFRS with respect to the death of an ordinary disability retiree consist of (1) a death benefit equal to 3 1/2 times the compensation in the last year of service if the retiree is under 55 years of age and 1/2 of such compensation if the member is 55 or older, (2) a pension for the surviving spouse of 50% of average final compensation plus 15% of such compensation to one surviving child or 25% of such compensation to two or more children, or if there is no surviving spouse or the spouse dies or remarries, 20% of average final compensation to one surviving children, and 50% to three or more children ("average final compensation" is the average of the member's three highest-paid years of service), and (3) paid health benefits coverage, if the employing municipality has exercised the option to so provide, N.J.S.A.52:14-17.38 (State Health Benefits Program) or N.J.S.A.40A:10-23 (self-insurance plan).

The legislation is retroactive to April 1, 1994.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The bill affects one member of PFRS. However, if circumstances occur, the statute could affect a small number of others. The difference in amounts is more crucial to the family than its impact on the retirement system in general. STATEMENT TO

Survivor benefits payable under PFRS with respect to the death of an ordinary disability retiree consist of (1) a death benefit in an amount equal to 3 1/2 times the member's compensation in the last year of creditable service if the retiree is under 55 years of age and 1/2 of such compensation if the member is 55 or older, N.J.S.A.43:16A-5, subsection (3); (2) a pension for the surviving spouse of 50% of average final compensation plus 15% of such compensation to one surviving child or 25% of such compensation to two or more children, or if there is no surviving spouse or the spouse dies or remarries, 20% of average final compensation to one surviving child, 35% to two surviving children, and 50% to three or more children ("average final compensation" is the average of the three highest-paid years of member's service), N. J.S.A. 43:16A-12.1, subsection a.; and (3) paid health benefits coverage, if the employing municipality has exercised the option to so provide, N.J.S.A.52:14-17.38 (State Health Benefits Program) or N.J.S.A.40A:10-23 (self-insurance plan).

The legislation is retroactive to April 1, 1994.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee adopted amendments to this legislation to require that application by a surviving beneficiary under the bill shall be made not later than the 60th day following the death of the member or the date on which the legislation takes effect as law, whichever is later.

Survivor benefits payable under PFRS with respect to the non-service connected death of an active member consist of the return of the member's aggregate contributions plus a lump sum payment of an amount equal to 3 1/2 times the member's compensation in the last year of creditable service, N.J.S.A.43:16A-9, subsection (1).

Survivor benefits payable under PFRS with respect to the death of an ordinary disability retiree consist of (1) a death benefit in an amount equal to 3 1/2 times the member's compensation in the last year of creditable service if the retiree is under 55 years of age and 1/2 of such compensation if the member is 55 or older, N.J.S.A.43:16A-6, subsection (3); (2) a pension for the surviving spouse of 50% of average final compensation plus 15% of such compensation to one surviving child or 25% of such compensation to two or more children, or if there is no surviving spouse or the spouse dies or remarries, 20% of average final compensation to one surviving child, 35% to two surviving children, and 50% to three or more children ("average final compensation" is the average of the member's three highest-paid years of service), N.I.S.A. 43:16A-12.1, subsection a.; and (3) paid health benefits coverage, if the employing municipality has exercised the option to so provide, N.J.S.A.52:14-17.38 (State Health Benefits Program) or N.J.S.A.40A:10-23 (self-insurance plan).

The legislation is retroactive to April 1, 1994.

PENSION AND HEALTH BENEFITS REVIEW COMMISSION ACTION

On October 13, 1995, the commission recommended that the Legislature not enact this bill because "it is a liberalization of established standards for retirement."
