BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. The Delaware River and Bay Authority is authorized to plan, finance, develop, construct, purchase, lease, maintain, operate, improve and otherwise effectuate a project, at a site ¹[in the State of New Jersey, within a municipality with a population greater than 4,900 and less than 5,500 according to the latest federal decennial census, with an area less than two square miles, and within a county of the sixth class with a population greater than 90,000 and less than 100,000 according to the latest federal decennial census] located in the City of North Wildwood, Cape May County¹, consisting of a multi-purpose sports stadium and other buildings, structures, facilities, properties and appurtenances related thereto, or incidental to, necessary for, or complementary to, the project, which in the judgment of the authority is required for the sound economic development of a multi-purpose sports stadium suitable for the holding of athletic games and other athletic contests or sporting events, exhibitions, spectacles, meetings, entertainment events or other expositions related to the purposes of the project.

The "Delaware-New Jersey Compact," P.L.1961, c.66 (C.32:11E-1) was amended in 1989 to authorize the Delaware River and Bay Authority to undertake economic development projects in Delaware and certain counties in New Jersey including Cape May, Cumberland, Camden, Gloucester and Salem.

Section 1 of P.L.1989, c.191 (C.32:11E-1.1) requires the authority to obtain legislative approval and authorization prior to undertaking a specific project in New Jersey.

This bill is intended to provide the legislative authorization needed by the authority to construct a multi-purpose sports stadium in New Jersey.

The bill authorizes the authority to undertake such a project in a municipality which has a population greater than 4,900 and less than 5,500, according to the latest federal decennial census, which has an area of less than two square miles and which is located in a county of the sixth class with a population greater than 90,000 and less than 100,000, according to the latest federal decennial census.

Authorizes the Delaware River and Bay Authority to construct a multi-purpose sports stadium in New Jersey.

The Assembly Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2829, with committee amendments.

The "Delaware-New Jersey Compact," P.L.1961, c.66 (C.32:11E-1) was amended in 1989 to authorize the Delaware River and Bay Authority to undertake economic development projects in Delaware and in the counties of Cape May, Cumberland, Camden, Gloucester and Salem in New Jersey.

Assembly Bill No. 2829, as amended by the Committee, is intended to provide legislative authorization needed by the Delaware River and Bay Authority, as required pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1989, c.191 (C.32:11E-1.1) prior to undertaking a specific project in New Jersey, which according to this bill, is to construct a multi-purpose sports stadium in the City of North Wildwood, Cape May County.

The Committee adopted technical amendments to the bill: 1) removing the requirement in the title that the bill supplement the "Delaware-New Jersey Compact", P.L.1961, c.66 (C.32:11E-1 et seq.); 2) removing the population criteria in section 1 and replacing it with a specification that the project be located in the City of North Wildwood, Cape May County; and 3) amending the synopsis to also make reference to North Wildwood.
