PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1994 SESSION

By Senators PALAIA and CODEY

AN ACT concerning the disposition of certain penalties imposed by the New Jersey Racing Commission, supplementing P.L.1940, c.17 (C.5:5-22 et seq.) ¹[and amending P.L.1993, c.15]¹.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, whenever the New Jersey Racing Commission imposes a monetary penalty on any licensee for a violation of the provisions of P.L.1940, c.17 (C.5:5-22 et seq.), or any regulation promulgated thereunder, the penalty shall be deposited in the Backstretch Fund established pursuant to subsection b. of section 1 of P.L.1993, c.15 (C.5:5-44.8).
- ¹[2. Section 1 of P.L.1993, c.15 (C.5:5-44.8) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. a. The New Jersey Racing Commission shall designate one of the racing days authorized each year to a holder of a permit to hold or conduct a horse race meeting pursuant to P.L.1940, c.17 (C.5:5-22 et seq.) as "Charity Racing Day for Backstretch Benevolency Programs" or shall allot to each such permit holder one additional racing day to be known as "Charity Racing Day for Backstretch Benevolency Programs."
- b. All moneys received by the commission as its share of the total contributions to all parimutuel pools conducted or made on the racing day designated or allotted pursuant to subsection a. of this section shall be deposited in a separate fund to be known as the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund, which is hereby created in the Department of the Treasury. The moneys in the fund shall be appropriated exclusively to the commission to be used by it to fund programs which promote the health, safety, or welfare of backstretch employees. As used in this subsection, "backstretch employee" means any person employed at a racetrack as a stable hand, groom, walker or exerciser or in any similar position designated by the commission which involves the handling or care of horses.
- c. The New Jersey Racing Commission shall establish a Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund Advisory Committee. The committee shall consist of six members appointed by the commission and members shall serve at the pleasure of the commission for indefinite terms. It shall be the duty of the advisory committee to make recommendations to the commission concerning programs to benefit backstretch employees which

The Assembly Veterans, Military Affairs and Gaming Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 163.

This bill requires that penalties imposed and collected by the New Jersey Racing Commission from any licensee for violations of the statutes or regulations are to be placed in the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund established in the Department of the Treasury pursuant to subsection b. of section 1 of P.L.1993, c.15 (C.5:5-44.8).

The Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund moneys are to be used exclusively by the commission to fund programs which promote the health, safety, or welfare of backstretch employees. Currently, the fund receives the commission's share of the total contributions to all parimutuel pools conducted or made on the racing day designated by the commission as "Charity Racing Day for Backstretch Benevolency Programs."

"Backstretch employee" means a person employed at a racetrack as a stable hand, groom, walker or exerciser or in any similar position designated by the commission which involves the handling or care of horses.

The bill also creates a six member Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund Advisory Committee to make recommendations to the commission concerning programs benefiting backstretch employees.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 163, with committee amendments.

Senate Bill No. 163, as amended, requires the deposit of penalties collected by the New Jersey Racing Commission from any licensee for violations of the racing statutes or regulations into the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund, which was established pursuant to P.L.1993, c.15 (C.5:5-44.8) and enacted into law January 20, 1993.

The moneys in the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund are used by the commission for programs which promote the health, safety and welfare of backstretch employees. The fund already receives the commission's share of the total contributions to all parimutuel pools conducted or made on racing days designated by the commission as "Charity Racing Day for Backstretch Benevolency Programs." The commission has used the moneys in the fund during the past year for educational programs, clothing and supplies related to medical needs and counseling services.

A "backstretch employee" is a person employed at a racetrack as a stable hand, groom, walker or exerciser or in any similar position designated by the commission which involves the handling or care of horses.

FISCAL IMPACT:

In the fiscal note to this bill, the Department of Law and Public Safety estimated a loss of General Fund revenues of \$66,765, \$60,000 and \$60,000 in the first three years, respectively, following enactment. This estimate represents monetary penalties from racing violations that will be deposited into the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund instead of the General Fund.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amendments delete provisions for the creation of a Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund Advisory Committee. The planned functions of the committee would have been duplicative of the current oversight advisory committee function of the Racing Commission.

The Senate Senior Citizens, Veterans Affairs and Agriculture Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 163.

This bill requires that penalties imposed and collected by the New Jersey Racing Commission from any licensee for violations of the statutes or regulations are to be placed in the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund established pursuant to subsection b. of section 1 of P.L.1993, c.15 (C.5:5-44.8).

Moneys in the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund are used by the commission to fund programs which promote the health, safety, or welfare of backstretch employees. At present, the fund receives the commission's share of the total contributions to all parimutuel pools conducted or made on the racing day designated by the commission as "Charity Racing Day for Backstretch Benevolency Programs."

The bill also creates a six member Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund Advisory Committee to make recommendations to the commission concerning programs benefiting backstretch employees.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 1994 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 163.

Senate Bill No. 163 requires the deposit of penalties collected by the New Jersey Racing Commission from any licensee for violations of the racing statutes or regulations into the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund, which was established pursuant to P.L.1993, c.15 (C.5:5-44.8) and enacted into law January 20, 1993.

The moneys in the Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund are used by the commission for programs which promote the health, safety and welfare of backstretch employees. The fund already receives the commission's share of the total contributions to all parimutuel pools conducted or made on racing days designated by the commission as "Charity Racing Day for Backstretch Benevolency Programs." The commission has used the monies in the fund during the past year for educational programs, clothing and supplies related to medical needs and counseling services.

"Backstretch employee" means a person employed at a racetrack as a stable hand, groom, walker or exerciser or in any similar position designated by the commission which involves the handling or care of horses.

Finally, the bill creates a six member Backstretch Benevolency Programs Fund Advisory Committee to make recommendations to the commission concerning programs for backstretch employees that should receive support from the fund.

FISCAL IMPACT

According to the New Jersey Racing Commission, approximately \$65,000 to \$70,000 in monetary penalties annually will be deposited into the Backstretch Benevolency Program Fund as a result of this bill.

An additional \$50,000 annually will be deposited into the fund as a result of the proceeds from any racing day designated by the commission as "Charity Racing Day for Backstretch Benevolency Programs."
