AN ACT concerning the Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled program, amending P.L.1994, c.67 and supplementing P.L.1975, c.194 (C.30:4D-20 et seq.).

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

 1. Section 1 of P.L.1994, c.67, the fiscal year 1995 annual appropriations act, on page 179, at lines 1 through 7 is amended to read as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, no amount of the appropriation hereinabove for Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled - Claims P.L.1975, c.194 (C.30:4D-20 et seq.) shall be expended for payment to a pharmacy unless, at the time of the prescription drug purchase for which the claim is submitted, the label on the prescription drug or the receipt prominently displayed the usual [over-the-counter] price charged to other persons in the community by the pharmacy; provided, however, that this provision shall be inoperative for the period from July 1, 1994 until the 90th day following enactment of P.L. ..., c. (now pending before the Legislature as this bill).

(New section) Payments to pharmacies made by the "Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled" program in accordance with section 3 of P.L.1975, c.194 (C.30:4D-22) shall not be made unless, at the time of each prescription drug purchase for which a pharmacy submits a claim, the pharmacy prominently displays on the receipt provided with the drug the usual price charged to other persons in the community by the pharmacy.

3. This act shall take effect immediately, but section 2 shall remain inoperative until July 1, 1995 and shall expire July 1, 1998.

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This bill amends language in the FY 1995 appropriations act concerning the provision of information to PAAD recipients as to the actual cost of the medication they purchase under the program.

The amendments are intended to make it easier for pharmacists to comply with the informational requirement and to provide PAAD recipients with meaningful information as to the cost of the medication.

As modifications to existing computer hardware and software may be required in order to provide the information in question to PAAD recipients, the bill prohibits the imposition of any penalties upon pharmacists for non-compliance for the period from July 1, 1994 until the bill's effective date.

The Assembly Commerce and Regulated Professions Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2090 with amendments.

This amended bill revises language in the FY 1995 appropriations act concerning the provision of information by pharmacists to PAAD recipients as to the actual cost of the medication they purchase under the program. The language in the FY 1995 appropriations act provides that the required price information be placed on the label on the prescription drug. This bill instead offers a pharmacist the option of placing the information on either the receipt provided to a PAAD recipient or on the prescription label.

The amendments also clarify that the provisions contained in section 1 of this bill shall be inoperative for the period from July 1, 1994 until the ninetieth day following enactment of this bill.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably a Senate committee substitute for Senate Bill No. 1429 and Assembly Bill No. 2090.

This Senate committee substitute changes language in the FY 1995 appropriations act (section 1) and supplements current law (section 2) to require pharmacists to give certain cost information to recipients of the Pharmaceutical Assistance for the Aged and Disabled (PAAD) program. The language in the FY 1995 appropriations act requires a pharmacist, as a condition of receiving payments from the PAAD program, to note the actual cost of medication purchased by the PAAD recipient on the label of the prescription drug. This bill offers a pharmacist the option of placing this information on the receipt provided to the recipient for the remainder of FY1995 and then requires the information to be placed on the receipt for the next three fiscal years.

The bill also specifies that section 1 will be inoperative from July 1, 1994, until the 90th day following enactment of the committee substitute, and section 2 will be in effect for three full fiscal years following enactment.

FISCAL IMPACT

The bills which comprise this committee substitute were not certified as requiring a fiscal note.
