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#### P.L.1994, CHAPTER 156, approved December 9, 1994 1994 Assembly No. 1147

AN ACT concerning certain foreign insurance and surety companies and supplementing Title 17 of the Revised Statutes.

4 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the 5 State of New Jersey:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law, rule or 6 regulation to the contrary, the Commissioner of Insurance may 7 waive any requirement that a foreign or alien insurance or surety 8 company which has applied for a certificate of authority to 9 10 transact business in this State shall, for a period of five years 11 prior to the date of the application for the New Jersey certificate of authority, have been authorized by its state or 12 13 country of domicile to engage in, and in fact have been actively engaged in, the kind of insurance business for which it seeks the 14 certificate of authority, if the insurer or surety meets all other 18 requirements for admission to this State and upon a finding, by 16 17 the commissioner, that the line or lines of insurance for which 18 the insurer or surety has applied for a certificate of authority are presently underserved in this State. 19

This act shall take effect immediately.

The Assembly Insurance Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1147.

This bill authorizes the Commissioner of Insurance to waive the "seasoning" requirement which foreign or alien insurers must meet before receiving a certificate of authority to transact business in this State. Currently, a foreign or alien insurance or surety company which has applied for a certificate of authority to transact its business in this State must first demonstrate that, for at least five years, it has been authorized in its state or country of domicile to engage in the same line or lines of insurance and that it has been actively so engaged. Under the bill, the commissioner could waive this requirement if the insurer meets all other requirements for admission to this State and upon a finding, by the commissioner, that the line or lines of insurance for which the insurer or surety seeks authorization are underserved in this State.

The Senate Commerce Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1147.

This bill authorizes the Commissioner of Insurance to waive the five-year seasoning requirement for admission of a foreign or alien property and casualty insurer or surety if the insurer or surety meets all other requirements for licensure and the commissioner finds that the lines of insurance for which the insurer has applied are presently underserved in this State. Currently, a foreign or alien property and casualty insurer or surety which has applied for a certificate of authority to transact its business in this State must first demonstrate that, for a least five years, it has been authorized in its state or country of domicile to engage in the same line or lines of insurance and that it has been actively so engaged.
