BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 2 of P.L.1953, c.171 (C.32:1-146.7) is amended to read as follows:

Any violation within the State of these rules and regulations 10 set forth in section one hereof shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00) or by a term of imprisonment not 11 12 exceeding [thirty] 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, except that a violation of these rules and regulations related to 13 the unauthorized offering, soliciting, or providing of ground 14 transportation services or business shall be punishable by a fine of 15 16 not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 or by a term of 17 imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or by both such fine and 18 imprisonment. A second or subsequent offense related to the 19 unauthorized offering, soliciting or providing of ground transportation services or business shall be punishable by a fine of 20 21 not less than \$750 or more than \$1,500 or by a term of 22 imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and 23 imprisonment. Such a violation shall be tried in a summary way 24 and shall be within the jurisdiction of and may be brought in the 25 Superior Court or municipal court where the offense was 26 committed. BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 2 of P.L.1953, c.171 (C.32:1-146.7) is amended to read as follows:

Any violation within the State of these rules and regulations set forth in section one hereof shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00) or by a term of imprisonment not exceeding [thirty] 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, except that a violation of these rules and regulations related to the unauthorized offering, soliciting, or providing of ground transportation services or business shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 or by a term of imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment. A second or subsequent offense related to the unauthorized offering, soliciting or providing of ground transportation services or business shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$750 or more than \$1,500 or by a term of imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Such a violation shall be tried in a summary way and shall be within the jurisdiction of and may be brought in the Superior Court or municipal court where the offense was committed. The rules of the Supreme Court shall govern the practice and procedure in such proceedings. [Proceedings under this section may be instituted on any day of the week, and the institution of the proceedings on a Sunday or a holiday shall be no bar to the successful prosecution thereof. Any process served on a Sunday or a holiday shall be as valid as if served on any other day of the week.]

So-called "hustlers" of ground transportation services at Newark International Airport aggressively solicit arriving passengers with offers of rides to various destinations, often at a negotiated price. Hustlers have been known to charge fares far greater than those of legitimate operators, intimidating passengers to pay or risk not having their luggage returned. All too often, tourists' and visitors' first impression of New Jersey is a gauntlet of these aggressive hustlers creating an "out-of-control" image of the airport, the State and the region. Hustlers are often not properly insured and operate outside any regulatory environment. In addition, the hustlers conduct an economy" cash business, with obvious "underground implications. By diverting passengers from taxis, licensed vans and limousines, hustlers weaken the financial underpinnings of the legitimate ground transportation industries, limiting their opportunities to expand and provide more jobs.

The Assembly Transportation and Communications Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 1826 with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill would increase the penalties for violating rules and regulations of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey relating to the unauthorized offering, soliciting or providing of ground transportation services at the air, bus or marine terminals operated by the Port Authority.

So-called "hustlers" of ground transportation services at International Airport aggressively solicit passengers with offers of rides to various destinations, often at a negotiated price. Hustlers have been known to charge fares far greater than those of legitimate operators, intimidating passengers to pay or risk not having their luggage returned. Hustlers are often properly insured and operate outside any environment. In addition, the hustlers conduct an "underground economy" cash business, with obvious tax implications. diverting passengers from taxis, licensed vans and limousines, hustlers weaken the financial underpinnings of the legitimate ground transportation industries, limiting their opportunities to expand and provide more jobs.

This bill increases the current penalty of a \$10 fine or a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days to a penalty of a fine of not less than \$500 or more than \$1000 or a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days, or both for the first offense, and a fine of not less than \$750 or more than \$1,500 or a term of imprisonment not to exceed 90 days, or both for the second and subsequent offenses. These increased penalties would apply only to violations related to the unauthorized offering, soliciting or providing of ground transportation services or business.

The committee adopted amendments restoring language concerning service of process which was inadvertantly deleted.
