1 AN ACT concerning plenary retail consumption licenses granted 2 to certain nonprofit corporations and amending P.L.1985, c.151.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1985, c.151 (C.33:1-19.7) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. It shall be lawful for the governing board or body of any municipality, upon the approval of the Director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, to issue a plenary retail consumption license to a nonprofit corporation, which conducts musical or theatrical performances or concerts on premises with a seating capacity of 1,000 persons or more, [to authorize] authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages ¹by the nonprofit corporation or its restaurant operator who has been approved pursuant to procedures established by the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control¹ for consumption on the licensed premises only during performances and the [hour] two hours immediately preceding and the [hour] two hours immediately following performances.

For the purposes of this section, "licensed premises" shall include the premises where the musical or theatrical performance or concert is held and any adjacent premises owned and operated by the licensee.

A license issued under the provisions of this act shall not be counted in determining the number of licenses under P.L.1947, c.94 (C.33:1-12.13 et seq.) or under P.L.1968, c.277 (C.40:48-2.40 et seq.).

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Extends hours for sale of alcoholic beverages by certain nonprofittheater groups.

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For the purposes of this section, "licensed premises" shall include the premises where the musical or theatrical performance or concert is held and any adjacent premises owned and operated by the licensee.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

Currently, municipalities are permitted to issue a plenary retail consumption license to a nonprofit corporation that conducts theatrical performances or concerts on its premises with a seating capacity of 1,000 persons or more. Alcoholic beverages may be sold by these licensees during a performance, and for one hour before or after a performance.

This bill would extend the time period for sale of alcoholic beverages before and after a performance to two hours on the premises where the musical or theatrical performance or concert is held and any adjacent premises owned and operated by the licensee. This will enable a non-profit theatrical company to serve dinner or dessert before or after a performance, and thus encourage attendance by the public.

The Assembly Judiciary, Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1100.

Currently, municipalities are permitted to issue a plenary retail consumption license to a nonprofit corporation that conducts theatrical performances or concerts on its premises with a seating capacity of 1,000 persons or more pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1985, c.151 (C.33:1-19.7). Alcoholic beverages may be sold by these licensees during a performance, and for one hour before or after a performance.

This bill would extend the time period for sale of alcoholic beverages before and after a performance to two hours on the premises where the musical or theatrical performance or concert is held and any adjacent premises owned and operated by the licensee. This will enable a non-profit theatrical company to serve dinner or dessert before or after a performance, and thus encourage attendance by the public. The committee amendments added language providing that the license shall authorize sale of alcoholic beverages by the nonprofit corporation or its restaurant operator who has been approved pursuant to procedures established by the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control for consumption on the licensed premises during performances and the two hours immediately preceding and immediately following performances.

This bill was introduced in the 1994 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
