## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### ADOPTED MARCH 18, 1993

#### Sponsored by Senator RAND

AN ACT creating the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission, establishing the Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission Expenses Fund and the Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund, and repealing P.L.1987, c.41, P.L.1988, c.5, and P.L.1990, c.58, and making an appropriation.

# BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. The Legislature finds and declares that:
- a. The New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Study Commission was created under P.L.1987, c.41, continued under P.L.1988, c.5, and reconstituted under P.L.1990, c.58, for the purpose of investigating the feasibility of establishing a railroad and transportation museum in New Jersey; including in its study such issues as the possible location of the museum, the costs associated with the creation and operation of the museum, and the potential sources and types of financial support required for the museum;
- b. In its Interim Report, published in February 1988, the study commission documented the public interest in, the historical need for, and the financial viability of, a railroad and transportation museum in this State;
- c. Since then, the study commission has devoted many hours to meetings, on-site inspections, public hearings, research and planning, to ensure that the State's railroad and transportation heritage will be preserved in a well-planned, financially sound manner, and that there will be enthusiastic public support for the museum;
- d. The continuity of this planning process must extend beyond the September 30, 1991 expiration date of the legislation authorizing the study commission, if the museum is to succeed, and the extensive preparatory work of the study commission, a major contribution to the museum project, should be expanded upon, so as not to lose the momentum of public interest in the project, and to take advantage of the opportunities now available to obtain equipment, artifacts and other memorabilia, railroad rights-of-way and other real properties, and the sources of funding for the project;
- e. Therefore, it is only appropriate that the Legislature create a new long-term commission, to continue the work of the study commission, and to take further preparatory actions toward creation of the museum. At this time the Department of State is deemed the appropriate authority to establish the museum, pending any final decision made in the future, and for this reason

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the Department of State is authorized to receive funds for the proposed museum and to take other appropriate preparatory and transitional action.

- 2. There is created, in but not of the Department of State, a commission to be known as the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission, with a membership of 16. The commission shall consist of:
- a. Two members of the Senate, to be appointed by the President thereof, who shall not be of the same political party, and two members of the General Assembly, to be appointed by the Speaker thereof, who shall not be of the same political party. A legislative member shall serve only as long as he or she is a member of the House which made the original appointment.
- b. The Commissioner of Transportation, or his designee, the Commissioner of Commerce, Energy and Economic Development, or his designee, the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, or his designee, the Secretary of State, or his designee, the State Treasurer, or his designee, and the Executive Director of the New Jersey Transit Corporation or his designee.
- c. Six public members, to be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, one of whom shall be chosen from the United Railroad Historical Society, one of whom shall be chosen from the Friends of the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum, and the rest of whom shall be chosen from among persons who are affiliated with railroad or transportation historical preservation, exhibition or tourism organizations in New Jersey, or from among persons who have knowledge of, individual experience with, or demonstrated interest in, New Jersey railroad or transportation history, preservation, exhibition or tourism. If a public member is chosen from the United Railroad Historical Society, the Friends of the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum, or a railroad or transportation historical preservation, exhibition or tourism organization, the public member shall have the power to appoint a designee from the membership of the organization. If one of these organizations goes out of existence, the position on the commission shall be considered vacant, and the position may be filled, for the unexpired term only, from among persons who are affiliated with other railroad or transportation historical preservation, exhibition or tourism organizations in New Jersey, or from among persons who have knowledge of, individual experience with, or demonstrated interest in, New Jersey railroad or transportation history, preservation, exhibition or tourism. The public members shall have terms of three years, and shall be eligible for reappointment to the commission; except that, of those first appointed, two of the public members shall have terms of three years, two shall have terms of two years and two shall have terms of one year, and all of the members first appointed shall be eligible for reappointment.

All appointments shall be made within 60 days of the effective date of this act. For purposes of continuity, and to the extent practicable and feasible, the first appointments to the commission shall include the legislative, ex officio, and public members of the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum

Study Commission last serving on that study commission; except that a member of the study commission shall have the right to decline appointment to the new commission. Vacancies in the membership of the commission shall be filled, for the unexpired term only, in the manner described in subsections a. through c. of this section, and within 60 days of the vacancy. Members of the commission shall serve without compensation for performing their duties as members, but the commission may, within the limits of funds appropriated or otherwise made available therefor, reimburse members for the actual expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of their duties.

- 3. The commission shall organize as soon as possible after the appointment of its members and shall select a chairman from among its members and a secretary who need not be a member of the commission.
  - 4. The commission may:

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- a. Make recommendations to the Governor, the Legislature and the Department of State concerning the general nature and scope of a transportation and railroad museum, including the presentation and examination of various alternative sites for the museum. The commission shall make no recommendations or decisions concerning a choice of a preliminary or final site for the museum unless it has developed a master plan therefor, provided, however, that the Legislature has by law authorized the development of such a plan;
- b. Make recommendations to the Governor, the Legislature and the Department of State concerning the selection of architectural and interior design plans for the railroad and transportation museum;
- c. Make recommendations to the Governor, the Legislature and the Department of State concerning the selection, acquisition, movement, storage and security of railroad and transportation related equipment, memorabilia, books, papers, and other documents;
- d. Raise funds, through direct solicitation or other fund raising events, alone, or in conjunction with nonprofit railroad or transportation groups in this State, and accept gifts, donations, devises and bequests, for the purposes of a State railroad and transportation museum and to defray the administrative expenses of the commission:
- e. Work with various nonprofit railroad and transportation groups around the State, for purposes of obtaining funding and enhancing public interest in the museum project;
- f. Continue any studies or projects begun by the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Study Commission, and prepare any new studies or projects related to the creation and development of a railroad and transportation museum in this State.
- 5. The commission shall be entitled to call to its assistance and avail itself of the services and assistance of such officials and employees of the State and its political subdivisions and their departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, authorities and agencies as it may require and as may be available to it for its purposes; and to employ the professional staff, including an

executive director, and the stenographic and clerical assistants, and incur the traveling and other miscellaneous expenses, including the maintenance of office space on State property, as it may deem necessary, in order to perform its duties, and may expend any funds as may be appropriated or otherwise made available to it for its purposes. The professional staff, and the stenographic and clerical assistants, may choose to serve the commission on a volunteer basis, without pay. To the extent practicable and feasible, the commission shall be entitled to use, free of charge, or at a minimal rental fee, State property for office space.

- 6. The commission may meet and hold hearings at any place or places as it shall designate during the sessions or recesses of the Legislature. The commission shall report a summary of its activities and its findings, conclusions and recommendations to the Governor, the Legislature, and the Department of State on an annual basis, not later than March 1 of each year of the commission's life, accompanying them with any legislative bills which it may desire to recommend for adoption by the Legislature.
- 7. The commission shall establish a fund for its administrative expenses, to be held by the State Treasurer, which shall be called the "Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission Expenses Fund," which shall be kept separate and apart from the Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund established by section 9 of this act. The moneys in the fund shall be invested and reinvested as provided by law for other funds in the custody of the State Treasurer. Monies may be disbursed from the fund upon the vote of the commission and a record of receipts and expenditures shall be maintained by the commission with an annual record thereof being transmitted to the State Treasurer where it shall be subject to public inspection during regular business hours.
- 8. The Department of State is authorized to acquire, through purchase, transfer, condemnation, devise, bequest, donation, gift or otherwise, in the name of the State, for purposes of a State railroad and transportation museum, and subject to availability of appropriations or other funds as may be necessary therefor, any real property, including, but not limited to land, buildings, improvements, and railroad rights-of-way. moneys from department may use the Railroad Transportation Museum Fund to effectuate its responsibilities under this section. Additionally, the Department of State is authorized to acquire, through purchase, transfer, devise, donation, gift or otherwise, railroad and transportation related equipment, memorabilia, books, papers, and other documents. The Department of State also is authorized to provide for the selecting, moving, securing and storage of any such acquisitions by the New Jersey Transit Corporation or by any department or agency which the Department of State shall deem appropriate.
- 9. There is established in the Department of State a fund to be known as the "Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund." The fund shall be credited with moneys received under subsection d. of section 4 of this act, and with any other moneys and appropriations obtained by the department for railroad and

transportation museum purposes. All interest earned on the investment moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Appropriations of moneys made by the Legislature to the commission or otherwise received by the commission for its administrative purposes shall be credited to the fund established under section 7 of this act until the expiration date of the commission under section 13 of this act. The moneys in the fund established by this section shall be administered by the Secretary of State, to be held thereby in the fund until appropriated by law. Moneys from the fund shall be used only for the purposes of a State railroad and transportation museum, including, but not limited to, the costs related to the establishment of the museum; the acquisition of a site for the museum; the selection and preparation of the architectural and interior design plans for the museum; and the acquisition, storage and security for railroad and transportation related equipment, memorabilia, books papers and other documents for the museum. Not later than one year after the effective date of this act, and quarterly thereafter, the Secretary of State shall certify to the Legislature, the Department of the Treasury, and the commission until the date of its expiration under section 13 of this act, the total amount of moneys in the fund.

Moneys received by the fund to be used for an expressly specified purpose, such as, but not limited to, moneys expressly donated for the purchase of a certain type of railroad or transportation equipment for the railroad and transportation museum, shall be held in a restricted account within the fund. Interest earned on investment moneys in each restricted account shall be credited to the fund. The moneys in the fund shall be invested and reinvested in the same manner that trust funds in the custody of the State Treasurer are invested and reinvested.

- 10. Upon expiration of the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission, in accordance with section 13 of this act, all moneys remaining in the fund established under section 7 of this act shall lapse to the Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund.
- 11. P.L.1987, c.41, P.L.1988, c.5 and P.L.1990, c.58 are repealed.
- 12. There is appropriated the sum of \$5,000 to the commission for its administrative expenses, to be deposited in the fund established under section 7 of this act.
- 13. This act shall take effect immediately and, except for sections 8, 9 and 10 hereof, this act shall expire on September 30, 2002.

Creates the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission; establishes the Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund and the Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission Expenses Fund; appropriates \$5,000.

Additionally, the Department of State is authorized to acquire, through purchase, transfer, donation, gift or otherwise, railroad and transportation related equipment, memorabilia, books, papers, and other documents. The Department of State also is authorized to provide for the selecting, moving, securing and storage of any such acquisitions.
- 8. a. All funds received under subsection d. of section 4 of this act shall be deposited into the Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund, established in subsection b. of this section.
- b. There is established in the Department of State a fund to be known as the "Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund." The fund shall be credited with the moneys received under subsection d. of section 4 of this act, and with any other moneys and appropriations obtained by the department for railroad and transportation museum purposes. All interest earned on the investment moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Appropriations of moneys made by the Legislature to the commission for its administrative purposes shall not be credited to the fund until the expiration date of the commission under section 12 of this act. The moneys in the fund shall be administered by the Secretary of State, to be held thereby in the fund until appropriated by law. Moneys received by the fund to be used for an expressly specified purpose, such as, but not limited to, moneys expressly donated for the purchase of a certain type of railroad or transportation equipment for the railroad and transportation museum, shall be held in a restricted account within the fund. Interest earned on investment moneys in each restricted account shall be credited to the fund. The moneys in the fund shall be invested and reinvested in the same manner that trust funds in the custody of the State Treasurer are invested and reinvested.

- 9. Notwithstanding the provision of any law, rule or regulation to the contrary, any moneys previously appropriated to the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Study Commission, under P.L.1987, c.41, P.L.1988, c.5 or P.L.1990, c.58, which were unexpended as of September 30, 1991, shall be appropriated to the account of the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission to effectuate the purposes of this act.
- 10. Upon expiration of the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission, in accordance with section 12 of this act, all moneys remaining in the account of the commission shall lapse to the Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund.
- 11. P.L.1987, c.41, P.L.1988, c.5 and P.L.1990, c.58 are repealed.
- 12. This act shall take effect immediately; section 9 shall be retroactive to September 30, 1991; and, except for sections 7, 8 and 10 hereof, this act shall expire on September 30, 2002.

#### **STATEMENT**

This bill would create the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission. The commission would be comprised of 16 members: four members selected from the Legislature, two from each House; six members from the Executive branch of government; and six members from the public. The commission would be authorized to make recommendations regarding the site and design of a railroad and transportation museum, the acquisition of railroad related documents and memorabilia, and to raise funds for the museum.

The bill also would establish a Railroad and Transportation Fund for purposes of financing the museum. It is assumed that most of the moneys in the fund would come from fund-raising events, gifts, donations, bequests, devises and appropriations. Moneys in the fund would be appropriated by the Legislature only for railroad and transportation museum purposes. Restricted accounts would be created within the fund for moneys given or otherwise received by the fund for expressly specified uses.

Finally, the bill would repeal the laws establishing, continuing and reconstituting the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 348 (Scs).

Senate Bill No. 348 (Scs) establishes the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission. The commission would be comprised of 16 members. The commission would be authorized to make recommendations regarding the general nature, scope and design of a railroad and transportation museum including a presentation and examination of alternate sites and the acquisition of railroad related documents and memorabilia, and to raise funds for the museum. However, the commission is precluded from recommending a site for the museum unless it had developed a master plan. The plan would have to be authorized by law before it could be undertaken. The commission is required to report annually on activities to the Governor, the Legislature and the Department of State. The commission would expire on September 30, 2002.

The Department of State is authorized to acquire real property and railroad and transportation related equipment, memorabilia, books, papers and other documents. The department is authorized to provide for the selecting, moving, securing and storage of any such acquisitions by the New Jersey Transit Corporation or by any other department or agency which the department deems appropriate. The bill repeals the laws establishing the study commission.

This bill is identical to A-858 (1R) as amended and reported by this committee.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The bill establishes a Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund for the purposes of financing the museum. Most of the funding will come from fund-raising events, gifts, donations, bequests, devises and appropriations. Moneys in the fund would be appropriated by the Legislature only for railroad and transportation museum purposes. Restricted accounts would be created within the fund for moneys given to or otherwise received by the fund for expressly specified uses. In addition, a separate fund is created to defray the administrative expenses of the commission.

This bill appropriates \$5,000 to the new museum commission for its administrative expenses.

The Senate Transportation Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 348 with committee amendments.

This bill creates the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission. The commission will be comprised of 16 members: four members selected from the Legislature, two appointed from each House by the respective presiding officer; six ex-officio members from the Executive branch of government; and six members from the public to be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. The commission is authorized to make recommendations regarding the site and design of a railroad and transportation museum, the acquisition of railroad related documents and memorabilia, the amount of appropriations necessary to establish the museum and ways to raise other funds for the museum. The bill requires the Department of State to establish the museum upon the appropriation of funds for that purpose, and authorizes the department to act on any of the commission's recommendations in doing so.

The bill also establishes a Railroad and Transportation Museum Fund for the purposes of financing the museum. It is assumed that most of the moneys in the fund will come from fund-raising events, gifts, donations, bequests, devises and appropriations. Moneys in the fund will be appropriated by the Legislature only for railroad and transportation museum purposes. Restricted accounts will be created within the fund for moneys given to or otherwise received by the fund for expressly specified uses.

Finally, the bill repeals the laws establishing, continuing and reconstituting the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Study Commission, and appropriates any moneys previously appropriated to, but unexpended by, the study commission to the new museum commission.

The committee amendments require that the commission report contain a recommended amount of money to be appropriated to the Department of State for the establishment of the museum, and provide that the requirement of establishing the museum apply only upon the appropriation of funds for that purpose.

Senate Bill No. 348 [1R] of 1992 would create the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum Commission, in but not of, the Department of State which would be authorized to make recommendations regarding the site and design of a railroad and transportation museum and the acquisition of railroad related documents and memorabilia, and to raise funds for the museum. The bill also establishes a Railroad and Transportation Fund for the purpose of financing the museum through fund raising activities, gifts, donations and legislative appropriations.

The Department of State notes that it would incur approximately \$100,000 in salary expenses for an Executive Director and support staff for the commission. An additional \$35,000 would be required for office-related expenses, for a total first-year cost of \$135,000. Based on the current cost of operating the New Jersey State Museum, the department further notes that once established, the museum would incur annual operating expenses of approximately \$2,000,000. However, depending upon the amount of donations, bequests and private money received each year for the museum, these expenses could be reduced.

The Office of Legislative Services concurs but notes that the bill permits the commission to make use of volunteer professional staff. If the commission selects to use volunteer rather than paid staff, the department would save \$135,000 in salary expenses. The Office of Legislative Services adds that although the department provided an estimate of the proposed museum's operating expenses, it gave no estimate of potential construction costs.
