The Assembly Judiciary, Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably an Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bills Nos. 1271 and 1380.

Section 7 of the law that created the bureau of fire safety, P.L.1983, c.382 (C.52:27D-25a et seq.), requires that within two years of that act's effective date, the fire safety commission consider whether the bureau should be raised to the status of a division in the Department of Community Affairs.

On November 27, 1985, the fire safety commission adopted a resolution recommending that the bureau be elevated to a division. The resolution states that the bureau of fire safety's broad range of statutory responsibilities and authority necessitate a latitude of operation not commonly found in units of State government below the level of division.

This substitute carries out the fire safety commission's recommendation and elevates the bureau of fire safety to the status of a division in the Department of Community Affairs.

References in the law to "bureau of fire safety" are changed to "Division of Fire Safety". There is a change in one section of the law being amended. Section 3 of P.L.1983, c.382 (C.52:27D-25c) (section 4 of the substitute) is changed to provide that the director shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. Current law provides for the supervisor of the bureau to be appointed by the commissioner.

GOVERNOR SIGNS BILL CREATING DIVISION OF FIRE SAFETY

PRINCETON -- Governor Jim Florio today signed legislation creating a Division of Fire Safety within the state Department of Community Affairs, a long overdue change which he said gave firefighters new clout in state government.

"One of the things that gives firefighters their strength is their great history of tradition. Among the proudest of those traditions is their strong voice in their communities and in government. I want to make sure firefighters' voices continue to be heard above the dull roar of the bureaucracy. This long overdue bill will establish an independent Division of Fire Safety within state government," said Governor Florio, during a reception for firefighters at Drumthwacket, the official residence.

"This bill doesn't just give the firefighter's bureau a new name. It gives it a new clout," said the Governor.

The legislation elevates the current Bureau of Fire Safety to division status, following up on a long-delayed recommendation first issued by the state Fire Safety Commission in 1985. The bureau was created in 1983 under the Uniform Fire Safety Act which set a framework for the state's Uniform Fire Code, recognized as the nation's best fire code. In addition to enforcing the fire code, the bureau also created the most comprehensive training curriculum for firefighters and firefighter instructors in the nation.

"Firefighting is the most hazardous profession in America. We'll never make it risk free, but we can reduce the risk. Since 1989, we've seen firefighter injuries in New Jersey inch steadily down. A big part of the reason is because we've listened to firefighters' voices on important matters like training, protective equipment, better fire prevention efforts and tougher code enforcement," said Governor Florio. "The new Division of Fire Safety will enable us to hear better and do better."

A 1271/A 1380/ \$656 was sponsored by Assemblypersons John Kelly and Frank Catania, and Senators Joseph Bubba and Leonard Connors.
