STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED MAY 4, 1992

By Assemblyman SOLOMON, Assemblywoman DERMAN and Assemblyman Roma

AN ACT concerning rights of action available to certain law enforcement officers, firefighters and emergency service personnel, and supplementing chapter 62A of Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. In addition to any other right of action or recovery otherwise available under law, whenever any law enforcement officer, firefighter, or ¹[volunteer]¹ member of a duly incorporated first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad association suffers any injury, disease or death while in the lawful discharge of his official duties and that injury, disease or death is directly or indirectly the result of the neglect, willful omission, or willful or culpable conduct of any person or entity, other than that law enforcement officer, firefighter or first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad member's employer or co-employee, the law enforcement officer, firefighter, or first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad member suffering that injury or disease, or, in the case of death, a representative of that law enforcement officer, firefighter or first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad member's estate, may seek recovery and damages from the person or entity whose neglect, willful omission, or willful or culpable conduct resulted in that injury, disease or death.
- 2. The rights, remedies and limitations accorded by the provisions of this act are hereby declared to be in addition to and cumulative of the rights, remedies and limitations accorded under law and nothing herein shall be construed to deny, abrogate or impair any such statutory right, remedy or prohibition.
- 3. This act shall take effect immediately, but the actions permitted herein shall be available only for injuries, diseases and deaths suffered on or after the effective date.

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Grants police officers, firefighters, emergency service personnel and their estates the right to seek recovery and damages for injury, disease and death in certain cases.

AN ACT concerning rights of action available to certain law enforcement officers, firefighters and emergency service personnel, and supplementing chapter 62A of Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. In addition to any other right of action or recovery otherwise available under law, whenever any law enforcement officer, firefighter, or volunteer member of a duly incorporated first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad association suffers any injury, disease or death while in the lawful discharge of his official duties and that injury, disease or death is directly or indirectly the result of the neglect, willful omission, or willful or culpable conduct of any person or entity, other than that law enforcement officer, firefighter or first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad member's employer or co-employee, the law enforcement officer, firefighter, or first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad member suffering that injury or disease, or, in the case of death, a representative of that law enforcement officer, firefighter or first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad member's estate, may seek recovery and damages from the person or entity whose neglect, willful omission, or willful or culpable conduct resulted in that injury, disease or death.
- 2. The rights, remedies and limitations accorded by the provisions of this act are hereby declared to be in addition to and cumulative of the rights, remedies and limitations accorded under law and nothing herein shall be construed to deny, abrogate or impair any such statutory right, remedy or prohibition.
- 3. This act shall take effect immediately, but the actions permitted herein shall be available only for injuries, diseases and deaths suffered on or after the effective date.

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STATEMENT

The Assembly Judiciary, Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1342.

This bill would permit law enforcement officers, firefighters, and volunteer first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad members who, while performing their official duties, suffer an injury which is directly or indirectly the result of another's neglect, willful omission, or willful or culpable conduct, to seek recovery for that injury and any resulting lost wages, medical expenses, and pain and suffering. The bill also permits those law enforcement officers, firefighters, and first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad members and representatives of their estates to seek damages for any death or disease that directly or indirectly results from such negligent actions.

Currently, the recovery rights of law enforcement officers, firefighters, and first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad members suffering such injuries, diseases or deaths are limited to those rights and benefits authorized and available under the workers' compensation statutes.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MARCH 11, 1993

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 1342 with committee amendments.

Under the provisions of the bill as amended by the committee, a law enforcement officer, firefighter, or first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad member who, while performing official duties, suffers an injury which is directly or indirectly the result of another's neglect, willful omission, or willful or culpable conduct, would be permitted to seek recovery for that injury and any resulting lost wages, medical expenses, and pain and suffering. The bill also permits the injured person or a representative of his estate to seek damages for death or disease that directly or indirectly results from such negligent actions.

Currently, the recovery rights of law enforcement officers, firefighters, and first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squad members suffering such injuries, diseases or deaths are limited to those rights and benefits authorized and available under the workers' compensation statutes.

The rights afforded under this bill are, however, limited in one respect. The provisions of the bill do not permit the injured person or a representative of his estate to seek recovery or damages from his employer or any co-worker.

The committee amended the bill so that it would be applicable to both paid and volunteer members of first aid, emergency, ambulance or rescue squads.

As amended and released by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 914 which was also amended and released by the committee on this date.
