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STATEMENT

This bill requires land surveyors to complete 24 credits of 32 33 continuing education relating to the practice of land surveying 34 during each biennial certification period to be eligible for renewal of their certification. In the case of education courses 35 or programs, each credit shall be equivalent to one hour of 36 instruction. The State Board of Professional Engineers and Land 37 38 Surveyors shall establish standards for continuing education in land surveying and these standards shall be in conformity with the 39 guidelines of the National Council of Examiners for Engineering 40 41 and Surveying.

Waivers of the required continuing professional education shall 42 be granted by the board on an individual basis due to hardship or 43 other good cause. The Assembly Commerce and Regulated Professions Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1178 [1R].

This bill requires land surveyors to complete not more than 24 credits of continuing professional competency relating to the practice of land surveying during each biennial certification period to be eligible for renewal of their certification. In the case of education courses or programs, each credit shall be equivalent to one hour of instruction. The State Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors shall establish standards for continuing professional competency in land surveying and these standards shall be in conformity with a national model, such as that of the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying.

Waivers of the required continuing professional competency may be granted by the board on an individual basis due to hardship or other good cause. Those land surveyors whose first renewal date occurs within 12 months after the enactment of the bill would not have to complete the required land surveying continuing professional competency credits to renew their certification. Those whose first renewal falls more than 12 but less than 24 months after the enactment of the bill would be required to complete the required land surveying continuing professional competency credits on a pro rata basis.

The Senate Commerce Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1178.

In the case of education courses or programs, each credit shall be equivalent to one hour of instruction.
