INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 10, 1992

By Senators CAFIERO, Palaia, Assemblymen LoBiondo and Gibson

1 AN ACT concerning volunteer first aid, ambulance and rescue squads and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the 4 5 State of New Jersey:

6 1. In the event of an emergency, the chief executive officer of 7 any volunteer first aid, ambulance or rescue squad or the mayor 8 or chief executive officer of any municipality may request 9 assistance from the chief executive officer of any volunteer first aid, ambulance or rescue squad located in and serving another 10 municipality for the protection and preservation of life within the 11 12 territorial jurisdiction served by the squad requesting the 13 assistance.

The chief executive officer of the volunteer first aid, 14 ambulance or rescue squad located in and normally serving a 15 contiguous municipality to whom such a request for assistance is 16 17 made shall, except as hereinafter otherwise set forth, provide 18 such personnel and equipment as requested to the extent possible without endangering any person or property within the 19 municipality in which the assisting squad is located and which it 20 21 normally serves.

22 The members of any squad providing assistance shall have, 23 while so acting, the same rights and immunities as they otherwise 24 enjoy in the performance of their normal duties in the 25 municipality, or other territorial jurisdiction, in which the squad 26 is located and which it normally serves.

If any member of the assisting first aid, ambulance or rescue 27 squad shall, in rendering such assistance, suffer any injury or 28 29 death, the member or his designee or legal representative shall be entitled to all salary, pension rights, workers compensation and 30 other benefits to which the member would be entitled if the 31 32 casualty or death had occurred in the performance of the 33 member's duties in the municipality, or other territorial jurisdiction, in which the squad is located and which it normally 34 35 serves.

36 2. The governing bodies of two or more municipalities may, by 37 enacting reciprocal ordinances, enter into agreements with each other for mutual first aid, ambulance or rescue squad assistance 38 39 in case of emergency ¹, subject to the written approval of the 40 volunteer first aid, ambulance or rescue squad or squads involved¹. The agreements may provide for: 41

a. Terms and conditions for payment by the municipality
 receiving assistance to the municipality rendering assistance for
 each member and each equipped first aid, ambulance or rescue
 squad apparatus for each hour supplied;

b. The reimbursement of the municipality or municipalities
rendering assistance for any damage to first aid, ambulance or
rescue squad equipment or other property and for payment to any
member of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad for injuries
sustained while serving pursuant to such agreements, or to a
surviving spouse or other dependent if death results; and

c. A joint meeting of the municipalities entering into such
agreements regarding other matters as are mutually deemed
necessary.

3. A county emergency management coordinator may, by express order, suspend operation of the provisions of any agreement entered into pursuant to section 2 of P.L...., c.... (C.....)(now pending before the Legislature as this bill) by municipalities in the county, upon declaration of an emergency pursuant to P.L.1942, c.251 (C.App.A:9-33 et seq.) or any regulation promulgated thereunder.

4. This act shall take effect immediately.

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Authorizes volunteer first aid, ambulance and rescue squads to provide mutual aid in emergencies. rescue squad equipment or other property and for payment to any
 member of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad for injuries
 sustained while serving pursuant to such agreements, or to a
 surviving spouse or other dependent if death results; and

8 3. A county emergency management coordinator may, by 9 express order, suspend operation of the provisions of any 10 agreement entered into pursuant to section 2 of P.L...., c.... 11 (C.....)(now pending before the Legislature as this bill) by 12 municipalities in the county, upon declaration of an emergency 13 pursuant to P.L.1942, c.251 (C.App.A:9-33 et seq.) or any 14 regulation promulgated thereunder.

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4. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill provides statutory authority for one volunteer municipal first aid, ambulance and rescue squad to request assistance from another volunteer municipal first aid, ambulance and rescue squad during an emergency.

If located in a contiguous municipality, the other squad would be required to 28 29 provide the assistance requested to the extent possible without endangering persons or property in the municipality normally 30 31 served by the assisting squad.

If any member of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad suffers any injury or dies while assisting in another municipality, the member or family would be entitled to all salary, pension rights, workers compensation and other benefits to which the member would have been entitled if the injury or death had occurred within the municipality in which the squad is located and which it normally serves.

39 The bill further provides that the governing bodies of two or 40 more municipalities may, by enacting reciprocal ordinances, enter into agreements for mutual first aid, ambulance or rescue 41 42 squad assistance in any emergency. The Assembly Local Government Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 269.

Senate Bill No. 269 provides statutory authority for one volunteer municipal first aid, ambulance and rescue squad to request assistance from another volunteer municipal first aid, ambulance and rescue squad during an emergency.

SENATE BILL NO. 269

To the Senate:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14, of the New Jersey Constitution, I herewith return Senate Bill No. 269 with my objections for reconsideration.

This bill would authorize one volunteer municipal first aid, ambulance and rescue squad to request assistance from another volunteer municipal first aid, ambulance and rescue squad during an emergency. The goals of this bill are significant in that it recognizes the importance of pre-planning for emergencies. However, many volunteer first aid, ambulance and rescue squads are private, not-for-profit corporations, constituting a separate entity from that of municipal government. I am concerned that the provisions of this bill may be construed as authorization to municipalities to enter into interlocal agreements which affect these squads, but deny them the opportunity to participate in negotiations.

Therefore, I herewith return Senate Bill No. 269 and recommend that it be amended as follows:

Page 1, Section 2, Line 39:

After "emergency" insert ", subject to the written approval of the volunteer first aid, ambulance or rescue squad or squads involved"
