P.L.1993, CHAPTER 70, approved March 12, 1993 1992 Senate No. 215

AN ACT prohibiting the sale of certain refrigerants to minors and amending P.L.1965, c.41.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. Section 4 of P.L.1965, c.41 (C.2A:170-25.12) is amended to read as follows:

4. a. No person shall sell, or offer to sell, to any other person any container of any substance containing any chemical material having the property of releasing toxic vapors or fumes, [(a)] (1) if he has reasonable cause to suspect that the product sold, or offered for sale, will be used for the purpose set forth in section 2 of this act; or [(b)] (2) which does not include an additive approved or designated by the Commissioner of the State Department of Health; and the term "additive" shall mean any element or compound approved or designated by the Commissioner of the State Department of Health for use as a safe and effective ingredient of substances containing any chemical material having the property of releasing toxic vapors or fumes for the purpose of discouraging the intentional smelling or inhaling the fumes of such substances. This act shall not apply to adhesives manufactured only for industrial consumption.

23 b. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection a. of this 24 section, no person shall sell or offer to sell to a person under 1° years of age any product containing chlorofluorocarbon or hydrochlorofluorocarbon that is used as a refrigerant. 26 (cf: P.L.1971, c.364, s.1)

STATEMENT

A number of juveniles have died or suffered brain damage by 31 inhaling volatile refrigerants which are sold under such trade 32 names as "Freon." This bill is intended to reduce the incidence 33 34 of such accidents by prohibiting the sale of these products to persons under 18 years of age. A person who violates the 35 provisions of this bill would be charged as a disorderly person and 36 subject to a fine of up to \$1,000 and a jail sentence of up to six 37 months. 38

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: JANUARY 25, 1993

The Assembly Senior Citizens and Social Services Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 215.

This bill amends current law to prohibit the sale of any product containing chlorofluorocarbon or hydrochlorofluocarbon to persons under 18 years of age. These chemical compounds are used as refrigerants and may cause death or brain damage to juveniles who inhale the fumes for the purpose of "getting high." A person who violates this prohibition would be guilty of a disorderly persons offense and subject to a fine of up to \$1,000, a jail sentence of up to six months, or both.

Current law (N.J.S.A.2A:170-25.9 et seq.) already prohibits as a disorderly persons offfense the intentional inhalation of toxic vapors or fumes from such products or substances as glue, cement, adhesive, paint remover or any product containing such chemical compounds as, for example, acetone, benzine, petroleum ether or ethyl alcohol. This prohibition applies to a person of any age. In addition, the law prohibits the sale of such products or substances if the seller has reasonable cause to suspect that it will be used for inhaling the vapors or fumes or if it does not contain an additive approved by the Department of Health to discourage intentional inhalation.

SENATE, No. 215

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MARCH 19, 1992

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 215.

This bill amends current law to prohibit the sale of any product containing chlorofluorocarbon or hydrochlorofluocarbon to persons under 18 years of age. These chemical compounds are used as refrigerants and may cause death or brain damage to juveniles who inhale the fumes for the purpose of "getting high." A person who violates this prohibition would be guilty of a disorderly persons offense and subject to a fine of up to \$1,000, a jail sentence of up to six months, or both.

Current law (N.J.S.A.2A:170-25.9 et seq.) already prohibits as a disorderly persons offfense the intentional inhalation of toxic vapors or fumes from such products or substances as glue, cement paint remover or any product containing such chemical compounds as, for example, acetone, benzine, petroleum ether or ethyl alcohol. This prohibition applies to a person of any age. In addition, the law prohibits the sale of such products or substances if the seller has reasonable cause to suspect that it will be used for inhaling the vapors or fumes or if it does not contain an additive approved by the Department of Health to discourage intentional inhalation.

This bill was introduced in the 1992 legislative session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
